A 14-story high rise apartment project for the elderly will be authorized in July by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for contract letting in October. The actual construction of the \$2 million Sanford skyscraper is expected to begin before Christmas with the projected completion date set for next summer, according to John Krider, executive committee chairman for Bram Towers.

Sponsored by Cooperating Parishes, Inc., a non-profit corporation made up of Episcopalian communities of South Volusia and North Seminole Counties, the units will be composed of efficiencies and one-bedroom apartments to be inhabited by single persons 62 years or over or married couples with at least one being over 62 years of age.

The maximum income limitations for occupancy is \$4,200 a year for one and \$4,800 for couples. Rental rates for the units are expected to be \$75 a month for efficiencies and \$100 monthly for one-bedroom,

All utilities, including water, electricity, waste disposal, air conditioning with individual temperature controls for each unit are included in the monthly rates. Krider said Eoghan Kelley, project architect, would have the construction plans ready is August,

State of Florida has granted a charter to the Seminole Employment and Economic Development Corporation to administer the \$800,000 grant. Purpose of the corporation, according to the charter, is to provide educational and charitable aid to neighborhoods and businesses, Incorporators are Jones,







They included Harriman, Vance, Clifford, Kennedy (Ted), McGovern, Fulbright and O'Brien, Quite an array of diverse men with diverse capacities and performance on their records. We believe that this divisive policy of Mr. Agnew,

who must be assumed to speak with White House approval, is one of the gravest dangers which has confronted our nation in recent years. We say this well aware that the Agnew attack

on the free press of America makes such comment suspect in the eyes of some. But we are persuaded that the two situations

which can be and should be corrected are: First, the honest and factual reporting of the military and political situations in Indo-China; Second the end to such divisive attacks as Mr. Agnew continues to make passion of the attack and the sharpness of the critiwhile our nation is confronted with crises of such cism did not come from sober contemplation or sound depth that only unity can hope to solve!

Gun Control Law

While the furor over gun control laws seem to have died down somewhat, many misconceptions still remain in the public mind concerning such controls. A lot of people still think that taking guns away from law-abiding citizens will solve the crime problem. Others see abridgement of the right of gun ownership as merely a matter of stepping on the toes of a few sportsmen. The truth is far different.

To begin with, abundant evidence indicates that penalizing the law-abiding, like confiscating all guns would do little to curb crime. Secother people are strongly opposed to lumping criminals and the law-abiding into one category, when it comes to regulating guns.

A nationwide survey of independent businessmen shows that 86 per cent favor a bill, currently in Congress, that would make possession of a firearm during a violent crime punishable by a year automatic sentence for a second conviction. apart from other prison terms regulting from the crime. In other words, businessmen support gun controls for criminals only. Oaly 11 per cent of independent businessmen polled were opposed to the proposed law.

Considering that independent business establishments are often targets of burglary, robbery and other serious crimes, it is not surprising that a landslide majority of small businessmen favor cracking down on criminals who use guns in the commission of a crime.

The right of gun ownership by U. S. citizens is so much an integral part of the American tradition of freedom under a constitutional government that many view it as the taproot of liberty. Gun control extremists have shown little regard for this fundamental consideration.

In addition to longer life, there's the matter of service responsibility. Most gas air conditioning is installed by the gas utility company, not by an independent dealer. And since the gas utilities are state regulated and permanent you know they'll be around if you ever need them. You won't be dependent on some hard-to-get repairman, or worse yet, some dealer

Wisest course is to get the full story on both types before making a final decision. But one thing is sure, now that there's real competition, prospects for air conditioning may be enjoying their first "buyer's market."
