Officials Want Lead Banned

LOS ANGELES (AP) - California antismog officials are on the verge of attempting what no other state has done and the federal government has been kept from doing - requiring the virtual elimination of lead in

Tiny amounts of the heavy metal are building up in the bodies of people living near freeways, the state Air Resources Board has concluded. Years of such exposure may be dangerous, say health officials, and after a public hearing today the ARB is likely to approve a phase-down program that could ban most lead additives by 1980. But the state must reckon with the lead additive industry, which so far has used the courts to beat back federal efforts to reduce lead and render previous state antilead regulations ineffective. The industry, which admits deleading of gasoline would "wound us some," declares there is insufficient evidence to convict airborne lead of any harm to health.

Candidates Spend \$1,000,000

CONCORD, N.H. (AP) - Candidates in New Hampshire's leadoff presidential primary are spending close to

Most of the money is being spent outside the state, going largely to Boston television stations that beam into the lucrative southern New Hampshire market. A survey of the major candidates in Tuesday's primary shows just \$6,000 going to New Hampshire's only commercial station, WMUR-TV in Manchester.

In Boston, a 30-second commercial can cost as little as \$25 or as much as \$1,500, depending on the time of day it is aired. The figures can be misleading, however, because the Boston TV spots are used to promote the candidates not only in New Hampshire's primary but Massachusetts' March 2 primary election as well.

Tough Secrets Law Proposed

WASHINGTON (AP) - The criminal panalties in the tough new law President Ford wants to protect intelligence secrets would apply not only to government employes but to thousands of Americans whose jobs may give them access to classified information.

And while the administration bill, delivered to Congress on Wednesday, exempts recipients of leaked classified information from prosecution for conspiracy, it leaves them open to other legal sanctions, according to analysts who have studied the measure.

For example, there is nothing in the bill to prevent a prosecutor who is trying to track down the source of a leak from hauling a reporter before a grand jury and demanding to know where he got information

BOSTON (AP) - The brightest, happiest, most charming children spend their earliest years in remarkably similar ways, researchers say. They listen to adult conversations, roam freely around their homes and spend a lot of time staring. The study, they say, provides a blueprint for raising

Vigilance: The **Price Of Liberty**

Caught up as we are in a Bicentennial salute to the durability of a nation of free men and free women, there is a temptation to complacency.

The United States, after all, has survived attack from abroad, wrenching divisions from within and dishonor at the highest level of government. The system, we are fond of boasting, has prevailed. Our pride is an integral part of our heritage.

Those first determined settlers, refugees from a tyrannical government, might also have been content with the blessings of the simple freedom they pursued at great personal sacrifice. They found in their colonies at Plymouth, at Jamestown, at Providence the havens they had envisioned for the preservation and nourishment of individual

They worshiped as they chose. They guarded jealously their venture into self-regulation. They concerned themselves with the virtues of justice and dignity and respect for their fellows. But they were also wary.

As the Colonies grew and prospered, they were obliged to set down guidelines for their relationships with each other. Government, they acknowledged, was essential, but its powers must be exerted only "with the consent of the governed."

And under the threat of renewed domination from abroad, they drafted carefully the Declaration of Independence whose 200th anniversary gives us cause for celebration this year. They proclaimed the "self-evident truths" of

equality and "certain unalienable rights." not the least of which is the pursuit of happiness. Only after lengthy deliberation did they subscribe to the Constitution and Bill of Rights that have proved to be the foundation of what we like to call "the American way." They were careful to

allow the flexibility to deal with unforeseen perils

- to cope with circumstances that might confuse

The legacy which has served us so well is the grip on the reins assured to the people — a grip we exert not only through massive public opinion.

Vigilance continues to be the price of our liberty. Instant communication allows each American citizen to respond to unsettling events in Angola or Lebanon or Chile that could presage disaster from abroad. It permits us to react to events in Washington that could topple us from within.

This precious freedom we've been handed is a very fragile commodity that we must guard with zeal if our posterity is to be given opportunity to

"Too often," Kissinger said Wednesday night in a banquet toast during the second stop of his Latin-American tour, "nations which chose nonalignment to shield themselves from the pressures of powerful global blocs have tended to form a rigid, ideological, confrontationist bloc of their own....

"The variety of the world's nations is too great and our common problems too urgent for such outmoded practices. They only deepen our divisions and impair our mutual progress....
