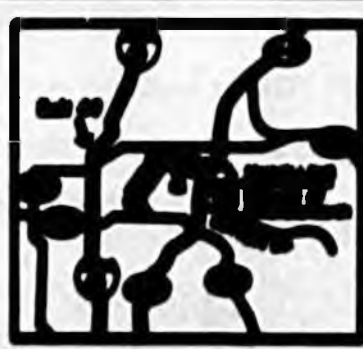

Dance dreams lead to Sanford studio

SANFORD — "Let me set the scene for you."

That's how Valerie Rye Weld began the story of how she and her sister, Miriam Rye Doktor, started their dancing school in Sanford 40 years ago.

Weld had just completed a few years of college at Jacksonville University and was waiting for her sister, Doktor, to graduate high school so that they could meet in New York City to pursue their dreams of a career in dancing and singing.

They lived in a "great" apartment in New York City and were teaming up as the "Rye Sisters" to give themselves a competitive edge.

One sister-act they interviewed for was the television quiz show, "To Tell the

Truth." The interviewers wanted them to fantasize that they were stowaways on a cruise-liner.

"We never got called back. But, that's the essence of New York. You go to a million auditions, and sometimes you get called back and sometimes you don't get called back," Weld said.

After making several demo records, the sisters found themselves on the top of the Time Life Building.

"We recorded a song in New York and our record producers were so sure it was going to be our blockbuster," Weld said.

They were sitting down with Ray Charles' manager signing a contract for a record deal in 1964.

"I mean it was big talk. It was serious. Very up and up," Weld said. "After we

Board dilemma puzzles leaders

SANFORD — City Commissioners discussed playing "Scrabble" with their boards at Monday's work session in an attempt to eliminate problematic issues facing certain city advisory groups.

Commissioners also said they might ask board members to resign at one time in order to reorganize.

Before he resigned, former City Manager Al Grieshaber Jr. recommended the Waterfront Steering Committee be deleted, and Mayor Linda Kuhn brought up the possibility of either disbanding or restructuring that board.

"I'd rather do it sooner than later," Kuhn said.

Commissioners said some boards, such as the Waterfront Committee and the Sanford downtown Community Redevelopment Agency, overlap certain areas, which has caused boards to clash.

The commission discussed restructuring the Waterfront Committee into a design committee. It would review new construction to make sure plans fit design standards wanted for the lakeside.

District 4 Commissioner Kevin Hipes told commissioners and Kuhn that they shouldn't just disband the Waterfront Committee, but instead take a look at all the city boards and take the most committed members from each.

"I'm all for consolidation because it takes years to get anything done," Hipes said.

Interim City Manager V. Eugene Miller told the commission

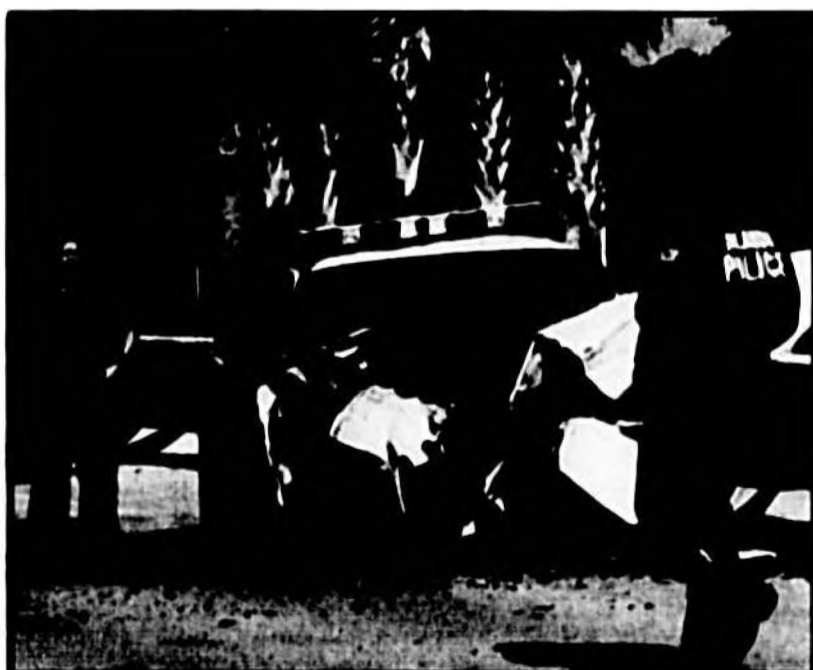

SHS junior shares science competition's top honor

ORLANDO — A Seminole High School student was among three Central Florida teens to become the first ones in the seven-year history of the Orlando Science Center's Ying Competition to share the honor of winning the event's top prize.

Their entries — which ranged from the analysis of the Martian coastline to stem cell research — inspired the event's sponsor and namesake, Dr. Nelson Ying, to award an unprecedented three grand prizes during a ceremony April 24 at the Orlando Science Center.

The three-way tie included Nimish P. Ramanlal, a junior at Seminole High School in Sanford; Gabrielle A. Gianelli, a junior at Orange County's Lake Highland Preparatory School; and Shiv Gaglani, a junior at Brevard County's West Shore Jr./Sr. High School.

Rather than split the prize into three parts, Ying provided additional funds so each winner took home an equal \$5,000 cash prize and trophy.

"When we have more than one equally superior student whose work is beneficial to our world then it would be a disservice to say one is a winner and another one, by extension, is not a winner," Ying said in a news release from the Science Center.

"By recognizing several winners, we encourage them to continue to perform in their superior ways, resulting in new knowledge and products that can ultimately benefit our world."

Cash prizes of \$1,000 each were also awarded to each winner's science teacher as well as to their school.

Ying sponsors this competition every year at the Orlando Science Center as a way to celebrate and inspire exceptional high school science scholars.

The winning projects included Nimish's plan to improve high-powered quantum computers so they could better assist in the research and development of nanobots that could help cure a variety of diseases; Gabrielle's mathematical analysis of Mars that could assist NASA with their search for signs of water on the Red Planet; and Shiv's experiments to increase the potency of adult stem cells, which could curb the controversy surrounding embryonic stem cell research.

The competition is open to high school students or homeschool equivalent in Orange, Seminole, Brevard, Lake, Osceola, Volusia and Marion counties.

Five finalists were selected out of more than 30 entries by a distinguished panel of judges, including Ying, engineers, scientists and educators from Lockheed Martin, Kennedy Space Center and the University of Central Florida.

Entrants submit a research project with the ultimate goal of benefiting humanity.

Judges decide on an overall winner following an oral presentation by each finalist.

According to Ying, the exceptional quality of the projects this year convinced him and his fellow judges to award multiple grand prizes.

The Orlando Science Center is supported in part by operating grants from the City of Orlando, United Arts of Central Florida, and the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs.

President cites Millennium teacher

SANFORD — Rachel Hallett, a sixth-grade teacher at Millennium Middle School in Sanford was recently awarded the 2004 Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching.

In a citation given to Hallett, President George W. Bush commended her "for embodying excellence in teaching, for devotion to the learning needs of the students, and for upholding high standards that exemplify American education at its finest."

Hallett was one of 95 middle and high school teachers chosen nationwide, and the only science teacher selected from Florida.

"Rachel is a fantastic teacher," said assistant Principal Brandy Kamm. "She's very energetic and innovative and her hands-on approach really allows the kids to explore and experience the scientific method first hand."

Hallett said she wanted to change the way her science teachers taught, which could be dry and by the book.

"So many kids are bored or disillusioned with science that it's important to remind them where science can take them," Hallett said. "I became a teacher to spread the excitement of science to kids."

While many sixth-grade teachers pass quickly through the textbook section on archeology, Hallett said she prefers to spend more time on the subject — one she uses to peak the interest of her students at the beginning of each school year.

Hallett created a dinosaur dig area where students excavate, investigate, and assemble the skeleton of a 6-foot wooden dinosaur. Hallett designed and built the 20-foot by 30-foot dig area to get her students out of the classroom so they could experience how real scientists gather data in the field.

The outdoor dig area is an extension of the sand-filled buckets Hallett originally used to conceal archeological objects for her students to dig up.

In a combined effort with the Social Studies program, Hallett's students also take part in an archeological dig in search of "ancient artifacts." Once recovered, the students have to determine from what country and what time period the objects came.

Hallett's students conclude their school year with a hands-on criminal investigation.

The imaginary crime varies from year to year — burglary, breaking and entering, and the theft of a school laptop are among the pretend crimes the students must solve.

To solve the crime, students scour the suspect's offices in search of forensic clues. Students also interview the potential suspects. At the investigations conclusion, the students present their case to a judge and jury. A group of four teachers and/or administrators play the roles of criminal suspects.

"I love interacting with the kids and watching them grow from timid sixth graders to self-confident eighth graders," said Hallett, now in her seventh year at Millennium. "I love being remembered years later by students who had fun in my class and can recall specific activities they took part in."

Addressing her philosophy of teaching, Hallett said teachers must be guides in their subject areas but also in life in general.

"Students need to see their teachers as a source of information but also as a person they can trust," she said. "We don't need to be their best friends, but many of our kids do not have any adults they can truly count on and we must be a constant role model on the value of education and dedication."

When asked about her concerns with the current state of education in Florida, Hallett

said she is most concerned about the lack of support in the elementary grades for science teachers.

"Many teachers are under trained coming out of college, or worse ... told not to teach science and to focus instead on math and reading," she explained. "We need to see science as a link between the other subjects rather than a side bar to them."

Hallett was born in Buffalo, N.Y., and lived there for 15 years before moving to Orlando in 1989. She decided to become a teacher when she was in high school. Teaching seemed more worthwhile than her original career choice — chemical engineer.

Hallett attended the University of Central Florida and received an undergraduate degree in science education with a specialization in chemistry in 1997.

She received her master's in science education from UCF in 2002. This fall, Hallett

will begin on her doctorate in curriculum and instruction there.

In addition to presidential recognition, the honor earned Hallett a \$10,000 gift from the National Science Foundation.

Agents make drug arrests

SANFORD — Agents have arrested 10 of 13 suspects in an ongoing drug investigation that involves the alleged distribution of prescription narcotics and cocaine, according to a Monday news release from the Seminole County Sheriff's Office.

The investigation, involving numerous agencies, began in January.

It involved the Sheriff's Office and the City-County Investigative Bureau, with the assistance of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, the Central Florida High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area Task Force Support Center and the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration Diversion Unit.

Through investigation, and with the assistance of the agencies listed, probable cause was established to obtain arrest warrants against

13 individuals and obtained warrants to search for their properties. To date, 10 of the 13 have been arrested on warrants. The arrests happened over a period of time, beginning April 19. All 10 suspects have posted bond. Most of the bonds were in the \$10,000 range and four were set at \$25,000.

Release of additional information is limited due to the ongoing nature of this investigation, the Sheriff's Office reported.

that its problem was not unique. Issues come up, he said, so cities create boards. Then, before long, a city is faced with too many boards.

"You five are the decision makers. You need to take action," Miller said.

He suggested the commissioners take a look at the quality of life and what's best for the city of Sanford.

"Find a way for representation of all parts of the community," Miller said.

Taking two members of every major board and possibly phasing out unnecessary boards was one action Miller told the commissioners they should consider.

District 1 Commissioner Art Woodruff said they needed to let the Waterfront Steering Committee finish the master plan for Fort Mellon Park.

Ron Fraser, a member of that committee, told commis-

sioners that they have been ready to move forward on a community survey that would wrap-up the Fort Mellon Park master plan. The survey would be reviewed by commissioners before being sent out in residents' water bills.

He said he has also spoken to a landscape architect that would be willing to discuss what steps the commissioners would need to take in hiring an architect firm for Fort Mellon Park.

In regards to reorganizing boards, Woodruff said he wished that all of the appointments of board members were done at the same time.

"So all terms end at the same time," Woodruff said. "We could get the right people on the right board."

Commissioners said they might ask all boards and their members to resign at a future work session in order to reorganize membership, commit-

tees, and terms.

If the commissioners decide to reorganize, they said they would immediately reassign committed members to boards. They would also set term limits, and have all the committees' term dates start and end at the same time.

"It's not going to happen overnight, but it's the right thing to do," Hipes said.

In other news, commission-

ers: Selected Kurt Ewen, of South Palmetto Avenue, to fill the vacancy on the Historic Preservation Board.

Commissioners interviewed Ewen and three other candidates during their work session, and at the commission meeting voted unanimously to appoint him. In his interview, Ewen said the Historic Preservation Board is often referred to as "The Hysterical Board." He also said he is pri-

marily interested in quality of life and property values in the historic district.

"When people do stupid things to their houses, it affects everyone," Ewen told commissioners.

Granted a continuance to Karen Prince's attorney, Vicki Levy, in the matter of condemning Prince's property at 109 E. Coleman Circle.

Levy explained to commissioners Monday night that Prince had passed away and left two special-needs children, who were currently up for adoption.

Levy is currently working with the insurance company and the bank to get a check reissued to fix the property, which had been burnt in a fire prior to Prince's death. Levy said she was working pro-bono on this case to secure the property as an asset for the two children to use for education or other needs they may

have in the future.

"We're trying to find the money is the bottom-line," Levy said.

Although the commissioners granted Levy 30 days to board up the property and secure it from vagrants, they left it open so that if the property is not secured, they can move forward with the condemnation.

"We have a whole neighborhood to protect," District 3 Commissioner Randy Jones said.

Permitted a rezoning of 6.75 acres of Planned Development for Florida-Stor-A-Way, which would allow them to change a portion of the site from self-storage to office/warehouse flex space. The only reservation the commissioners had was the proposed cross-connection of a shared access road between the property and the 7-Eleven on the corner of Upsala Road and State Road

46. Hipes said he felt it would make 7-Eleven access safer, but Jones felt it might present a problem.

Planning and Community Development Director Russ Gibson said the commission could come back and modify the access if it presents a problem.

Supported an amendment of Schedule P, Utilities Standard and Specifications and Design Standards for Water Conservation.

The new regulations in the schedule propose to ensure that the Sanford Utilities Department can meet future water supply needs by requiring the use of alternative water supplies such as storm water or wells for irrigation, instead of potable water on new construction.

The next city commission meeting is scheduled for Monday, May 9, at City Hall.

tournament. With the raffle of one of The View condos, the charity was able to keep the money for all the tickets sold.

When it reached \$30,000, or 300 tickets, Mark Romagosa decided to kick it up a notch.

"He said, 'I'm going for it,'" Angie recalled. He worked day and night selling tickets and delivering them to the purchasers. He sold tickets right up to the evening before the raffle on Sunday, April 17.

The final total was 530 tickets sold or \$53,000. That number alone set a record for the Christian Sharing Center.

The Sharing Center sold the tickets under Charity for Charities, which is an umbrella group that assists a number of charities. When the winning ticket was pulled, announcers said the ticket was from Charity of Charities, but as Angie said, it could have been any of a bunch of different charities. Then the read the name of Jimmy Roth. It's not an uncommon name, she said, so it still didn't sink in what had happened.

When they recognized Roth's name, the Romagosas ran up the band shell where the drawing took place to verify the number. At first they were told to check the Web site in the morning, but the Romagosas insisted because Roth had mentioned donating the condo back to the Christian Sharing Center.

Finally, raffle organizers verified the number was Jimmy Roth's and had been bought from the Christian Sharing

Center. The next thing that happened was Mark Romagosa passed out, Angie said.

While paramedics brought him around, Scarfo contacted Roth on his private jet. Would he still donate the condo back to the Sharing Center? Scarfo gestured a thumbs up affirmation that indeed he would, and Mark Romagosa passed out again, his wife said.

"It was a comedy of errors," she said Monday just over a week later. This has happened to Mark before and it is scary, but he is OK now, she said.

Angie noted that the condos have not even been constructed yet, but already the \$400,000 condo may be worth \$450,000, she said one expert told her.

She joked about keeping the condo and sending clients who need a temporary shelter to The View.

"We're sure we're going to sell it," she said. They may

hold on to it until the selling price increases reaches a peak.

This couldn't have come at a better time for the growing charity.

Last year, the Sharing Center bought the Fairmont Plaza on 17-92 in Longwood. It houses the charity's offices and help center as well as its thrift shop.

"We like borrowed from Peter to pay Paul," she said. They even borrowed \$300,000 for the down payment, she said. The raffle was not to raise money for clients, but as part of a capital campaign. The money could pay off loans or even purchase additional space.

"We are desperate for space," she said. They have added a development center, and since the hurricanes last summer, more clients have come looking for help.

The charity receives money from local churches, Seminole County, business benefactors and grants. About 40 percent of the budget comes from the thrift store. They also collect rent from other businesses in the plaza.

Last summer, the Sharing Center was one of three designated sites for disaster relief following the hurricanes, Angie said.

The number of people seeking assistance has tapered since then, she said, but they still help about 135 families per week. According to literature from the organization, 10 percent of Seminole County residents live at or below the poverty level. That number is expected to grow to 43,173 by 2008.

Not everyone who seeks assistance is at the poverty level. Clients simply have to prove an emergency need, Angie said.

Her vision is to turn the plaza into a one-stop "shopping" area for people who need help. She wants other non-profits to move in and together they can fulfill any need a person or family might have.

"We have to make our mortgage payments," for now, she said. The raffle money will help give the charity more options.

"It puts us a step closer," Angie said, referring to the plans for the plaza.

Anyone who needs assistance on an emergency basis for bills or rent or any sort of emergency can call the Christian Sharing Center at 407-260-9155. They also need volunteers and donations of food and money are accepted.

It's time to 'Do the Zoo'

"Do the Zoo" was a popular marketing slogan a couple of years ago for the Central Florida Zoological Park. After hearing zoo executive director Joe Montisano speak to the noon Rotary Club Monday, I'm more inclined that ever to "Do the Zoo."

Montisano, in his second-and-a-half year as executive director, laid out some impressive improvements at our home-based zoo, which, by the way, is the oldest tourist attraction in Central Florida.

Here's what's new at the zoo:

One of the United States' largest collection of venomous snakes. A mixed African bird exhibit, featuring six rare species of small African birds.

Australian exhibit, featuring kangaroos and emus. Montisano said the creatures are pretty friendly.

Rotary Garden. Sponsored by the Sanford Breakfast Rotary Club, the Rotary Garden is a gathering place for school children who visit the zoo. About 20,000-35,000 youngsters a year take field trips to the zoo. They gather in the luscious garden, competed with benches, before they assemble into small groups for tours of the zoo. The garden in the Breakfast clubs' service project for Rotary's Centennial Celebration.

Insects. The Massey Insect zoo is expected to open in October, displaying a variety of creatures that when often sweep to the side, or shoo away.

Train and carousel rides. Plus, many, many more exotic animals that would take the entire newspaper to talk about. What is interesting, though is the spider monkeys. One of the monkeys is the last remaining original animals that made the move 30 years ago from the old zoo location at Park Avenue and Seminole Boulevard to its current site on Seminole Boulevard near I-4.

Another longtime resident of the zoo is Maude, a 57-year-old elephant. School children raised \$50,000 to help in the restoration of the elephants' exhibit, Montisano said. The average life span of an elephant is 50-70 years, so zoo keepers are trying to keep Maude and her companion happy in their golden years.

When Montisano finished speaking, you could still hear Rotarians talking about his talk. They were making plans to "Do the Zoo."

THE METHODIST MEN of First United Methodist Church cooked up another successful Community Fish Fry Saturday. More than 200 people enjoyed delicious battered fish, slaw, beans and tons of tasty desserts. "This is the best one yet," said Patty Gatchel, a church member who has attended the gathering for the past 10 or more years. "The fish is always good but this year it was tastier. Plus, the fellowship is always great. We have a lot of new people here and that makes it a good thing."

The Methodist Men, who meet at the Colonial Room Restaurant on the first Thursday of each month for Bible Study and Prayer and weekly at the church, raises the money to support the Methodist Retreat Center in Leesburg.

Ashby Jones, a Sunday School teacher who coordinates the monthly meeting, said the group expects to raise about \$1,200 from the fish fry.

Pastor Jim Bradshaw said many men's lives have been changed as a result of them attending the retreat. "Our primary goal is spirituality," Rev. Bradshaw said. "Men have gone to the retreat and gotten saved, or accepted their call into the ministry."

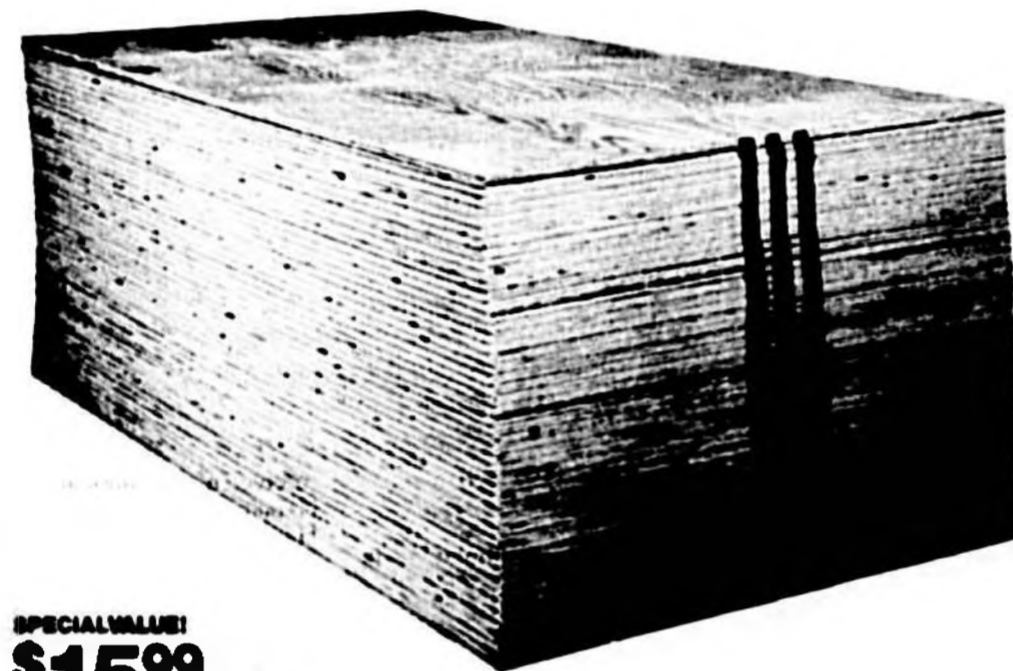

signed the contract, the gentlemen said, 'Would you like to call your parents?' So we said, 'Oh, yes.'"

The sisters said they didn't have to pay a dime, all they had to do was a good audition.

"The independent record producers would put all their money into it. Like a gamble. Hoping that this record would make them a million dollars, too," Weld said.

The producers wanted a sound similar to a group called "Patience and Prudence." After they recorded the album Doktor and Weld were able to go back home to Jacksonville for a few weeks.

While in Jacksonville they went to their old dance supply store, which was the only store of its kind in the area.

The man who ran the business told them: "Girls, I just don't understand it. I've known you all your lives. I've

known your mother and daddy all your lives. And, I don't understand why, or how, you would ever get so far away from each other. You're so tight. Why don't you ... not go back to New York? Why don't you open up a dancing school?" Weld recited.

Doktor and Weld both laughed as they remembered the moment.

"We laughed because Jacksonville was like a seven-eleven for dancing schools. There were dancing schools on every corner," Doktor said.

Weld said the man from the store said: "No, no, no, I don't mean in Jacksonville. There's a dancing school for sale down in Sanford. And we said, 'Where?'"

The Rye sisters, along with their mother and father, drove down to Sanford to check out the dancing school.

"We came down. We fell in love," Weld said, remember-

ing getting off Interstate 4 and driving into Sanford along Lake Monroe.

Weld said they got excited about being their own bosses and not having to wait for a phone call letting them know they were good enough for this show or this act.

"It didn't have anything to do with the studio, because the studio wasn't much," Weld said. "It was very small. Unimpressive to say the very least. It was set up all wrong. It was horrible."

Weld said they decided that if their record took off they would go with it, but if it didn't they would buy the dancing school.

"We wanted to be masters of our own destiny," Doktor said.

They called their agent and managers to let them know what they wanted to do.

"Well, guess what? The Beatles had arrived in New

York City," Weld said. "Our manager knew it. He said, girls, we're going to keep on pushing this record. And we said if anything good happens with it, we'll stand behind our contract that we signed."

But, the Beatles sound was so prevalent, the sisters said, that no one wanted to hear a soft sounding group "of two little girls."

So, the sisters bought into the studio and began their own dancing school.

Weld was 22 and Doktor 20. They said they were known around Sanford as "The Little Dancing Girls."

The Rye sisters scrounged for many of the materials they needed for their recitals and for shows. They said they learned how to make floats and scenery.

One time, the sisters recalled, they needed a merry-go-round for a show. They wanted their dancers to open

the routine by getting off of a merry-go-round.

"We went to the lumber company to beg for lumber and the guy there asked what we needed it for, and we said to build a merry-go-round," Weld said. "It wasn't like the curtain could just open and they could be standing there. So, he built it for us."

"He absolutely took pity on us," Doktor recalled.

The sisters begged for materials all around Sanford until they had enough money to begin paying for some of the items they needed. Doktor said they would go to the furniture and appliance store and beg them not to throw out any of their cartons and when they would go pick up the cartons, they would pull up in their small, two-door car.

"They would say, 'OK, how are you going to get it in your car,' and we said, 'We would just have to take one at a time.'"

They would say, 'OK girls where does it need to go,'" Doktor recalled.

Now, more than 40 years later, the "Little Dancing Girls" have a studio in both Sanford and Lake Mary. They provide dance training for all ages in ballet, tap, jazz, hip-hop, musical theatre, pointe work, partnering class and turning class. Former dancers of their studio include dancers for Las Vegas at Bally's Grand, Trump Palace, Carnival and Caribbean Cruise Lines, Broadway Shows, Disney and Atlanta, Cincinnati and Cleveland Ballet, to name a few.

The studio has entered the technology age with a Web site, www.schoolofdancearts.com. On the Web site current and former students can find information on activities leading up to the 40th Anniversary Recital on June 4 and June 5 at Winter Springs High School.

Kansas suspect might have preyed on Seminole victims

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office, Crimes against Children (CAC) Unit is investigating whether a suspect's arrest in Kansas might lead to local victims.

Earlier this month, Lenexa, Kansas Police informed the Sheriff's Office of an arrest of a former Seminole County resident, identified as Jerry Horn, dob 6-11-38.

Following the arrest, a 17-year-old boy, who used to live in Seminole County, came forward and alleged that he, too, had been molested by Horn, a news release said.

As it turns out, Horn lived near the boy's family when they lived in Seminole County and then followed the family to Kansas, when the boy's family moved there in 2000.


This case originated with information from Lenexa (KS) Police Department.

The suspect, Jerry Horn, has been arrested in their jurisdiction. Horn previously lived in various locations in Seminole County.

During their investigation, it was learned that the suspect had followed a family with a young child from Altamonte Springs to Lenexa. An interview in Kansas of that child revealed accusations of molestation over a number of years with more than 100 incidents of abuse that had occurred in Seminole County.

Due to the predatory nature of the actions of Horn, there is a likelihood of other as yet undiscovered victims in Seminole County. Horn had past addresses in Altamonte Springs and in Casselberry.


The Seminole County Sheriff's Office, Crimes against Children Unit would like to know if any other local children were victimized by Horn. Anyone with information regarding this suspect is asked to call 407-665-6502.

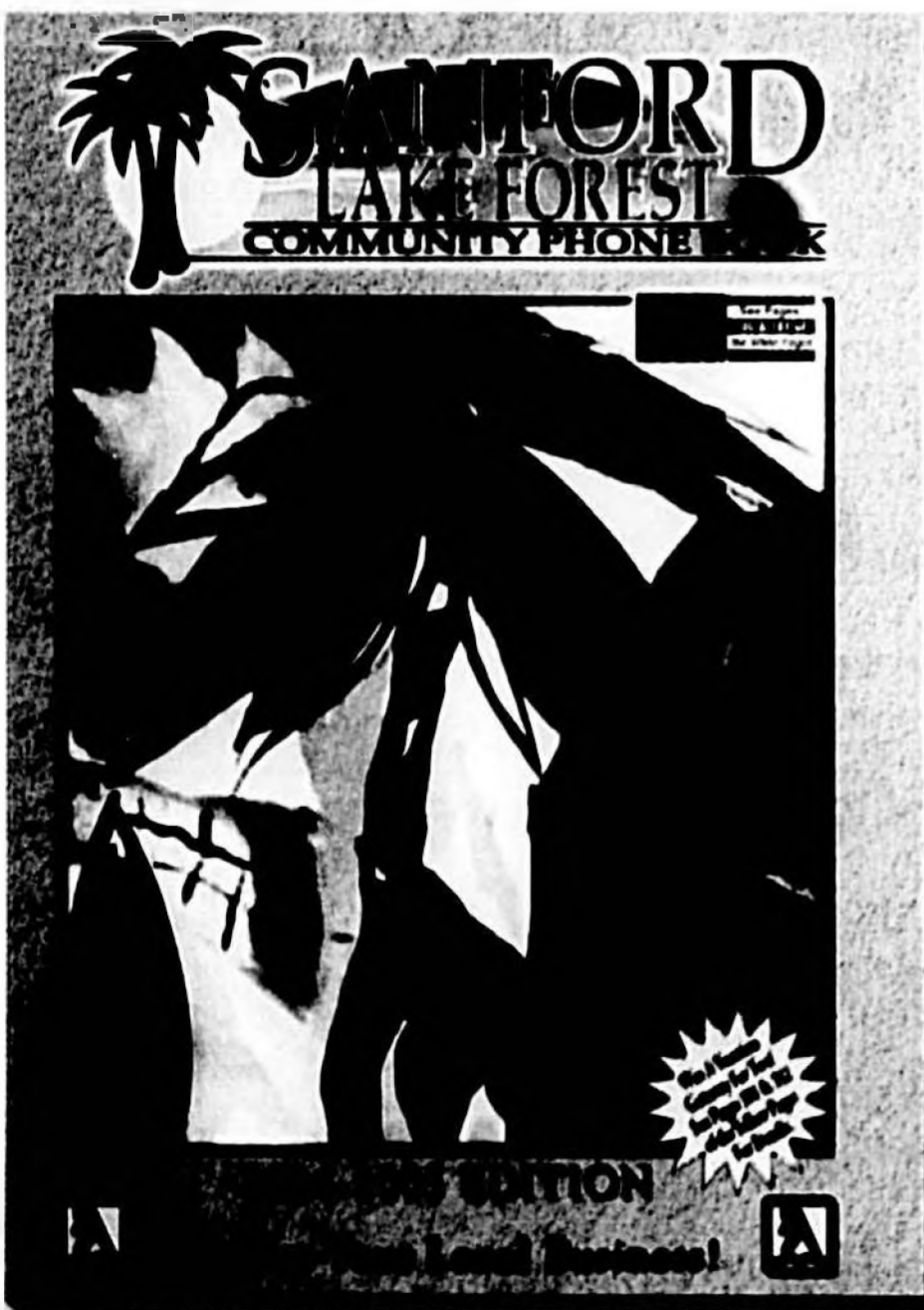

Raiders by 1/2-game in the Mid-Florida conference standings and needed to win to force a winner take all playoff game.

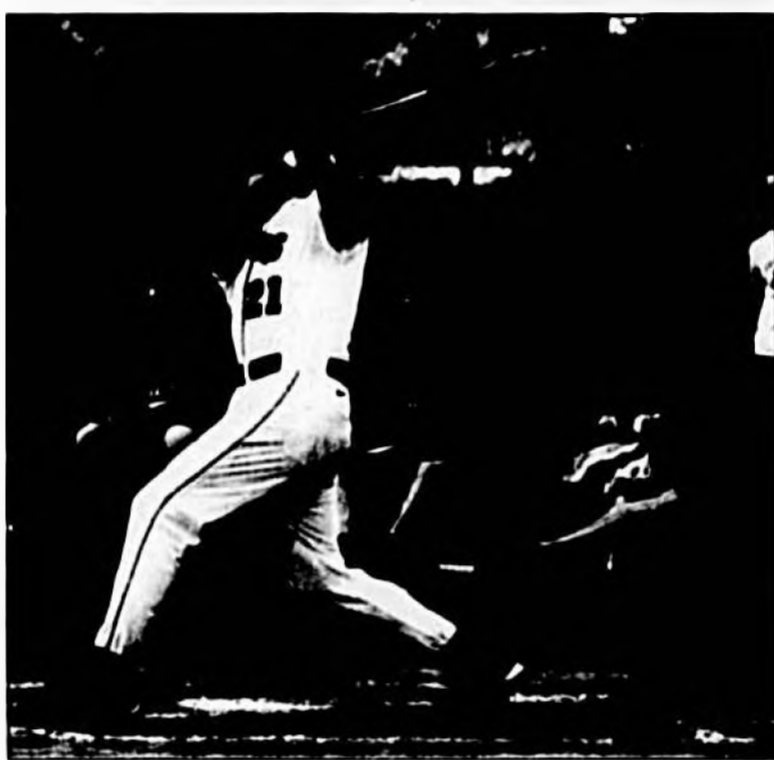
The Florida Community College Athletics Association 2005 Baseball Tournament will be held May 6-10 at Osceola County Stadium in Kissimmee.

of extensive training. In the

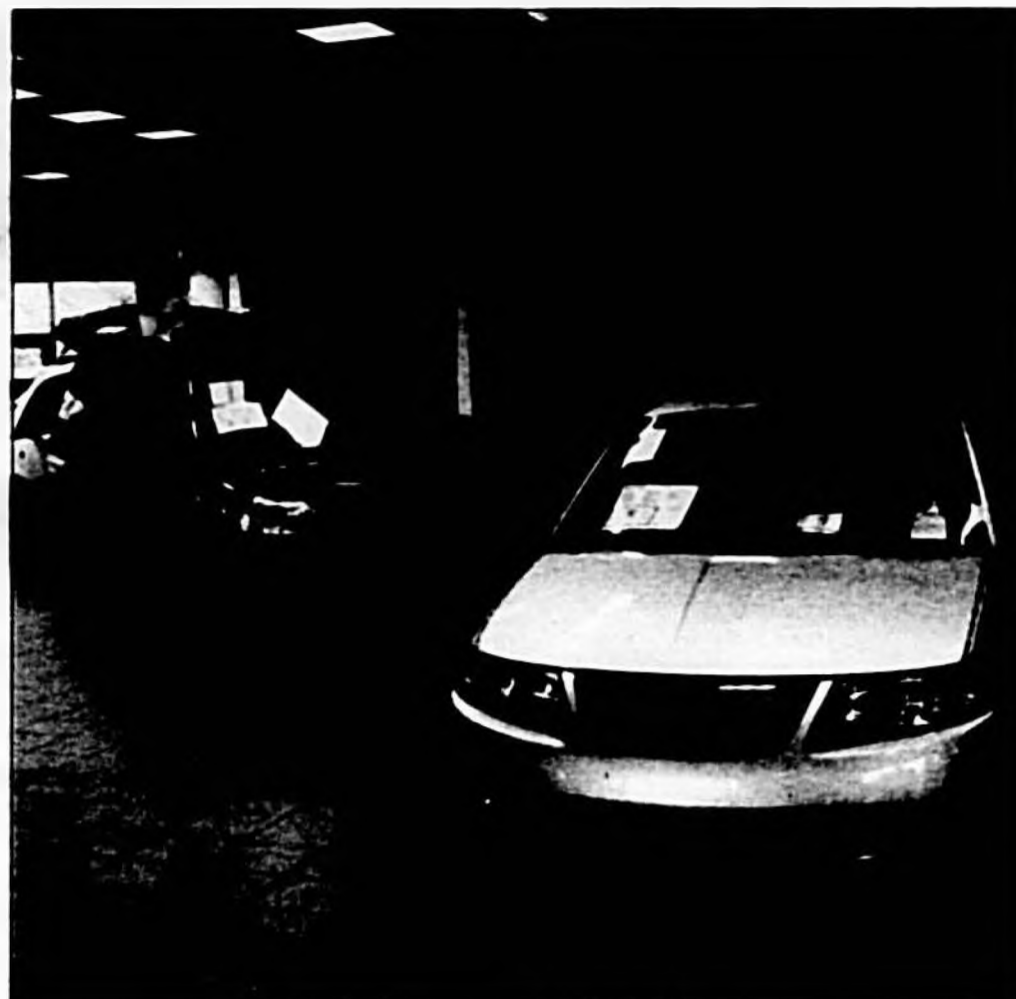

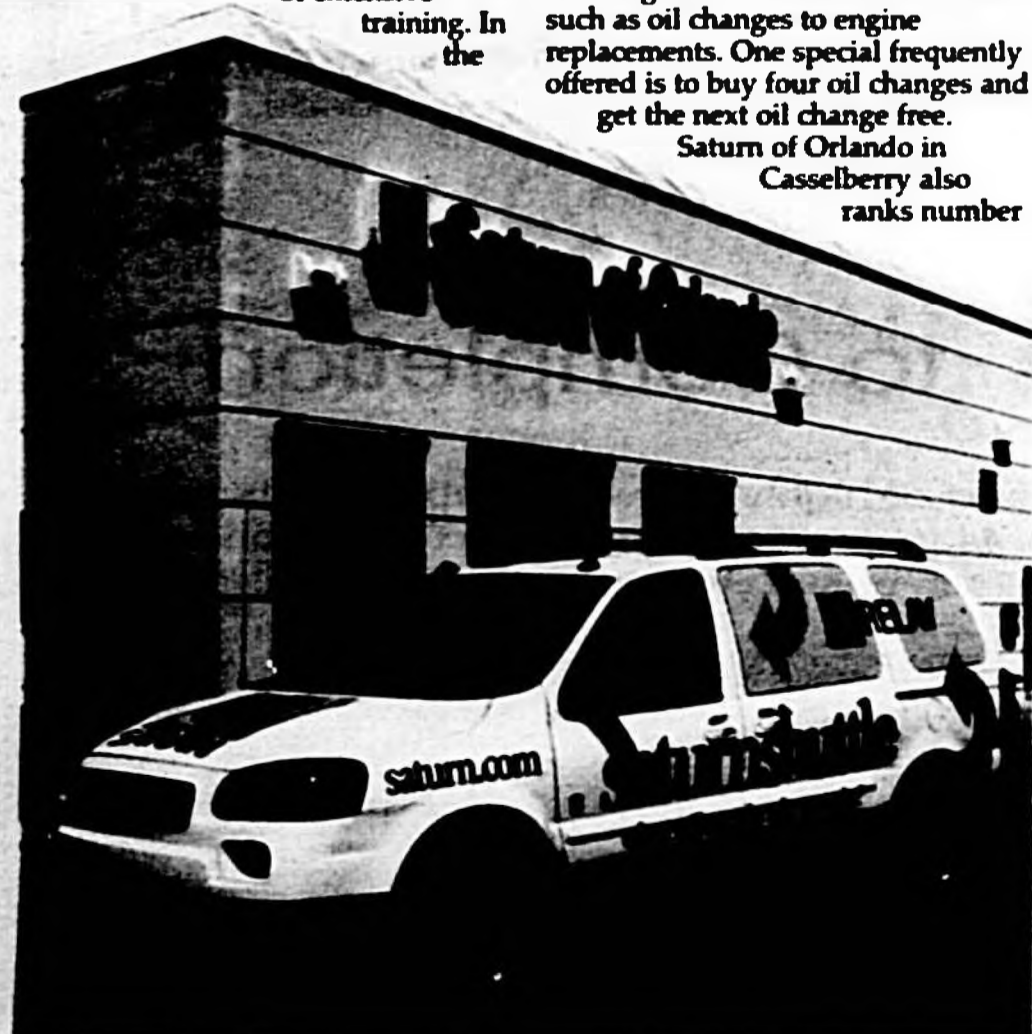
