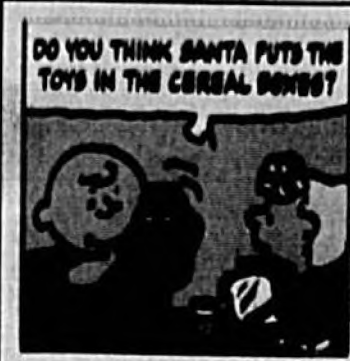

Schools remain under court order

SANFORD — According to a letter from the United States Justice Department released this week, the Seminole County school district needs to improve conditions at Crooms Academy and hire a greater number of black teachers.

Since 1970, the United States District Court has had supervisory jurisdiction over the Seminole County School Board

Department of Justice letter outlines improvement areas for schools

in matters such as school site purchases, school construction, and student attendance zones.

Seminole County school-district officials are hoping to convince the U.S. Department of Justice that court oversight is no longer necessary.

"I'm optimistic," said School Board Chair Sandra Robinson. "This (letter) is much better than I had hoped for."

The Justice Department conducted an inspection of Seminole County and other school districts this year to determine whether equitable racial and ethnic con-

ditions exist. District officials this week received a letter based on the inspection.

"There's language in (the letter) that we are interpreting as 'Let's get together and talk about this,'" said school-district Superintendent Paul Hagerty.

In addition to conditions at Crooms Academy and the hiring of black teachers, the Justice Department also said it is concerned about low black representation in higher level academic courses at the high school and middle school levels.

Prairie dog makes Lake Monroe home

Sanford city employees made an exotic discovery last week — a four-legged rodent who should be more at home in the western plains than in Central Florida.

People began seeing the rodent last week alongside Lake Monroe. On Tuesday, officials from Central Florida Zoological Park confirmed the animal is a prairie dog.

"When I first saw it, I really didn't know what it was," Sanford Director of Engineering and Planning Jay Marder said. "I had to get

an expert opinion.

"When I found out it was a prairie dog, I was thrilled about having another foreign fauna happening at the lakefront," he said. "We have a lot of different birds there, and now we have a prairie dog."

A prairie dog is an American burrowing rodent basically found in the Great Plains from Montana to Northern Mexico. The animal's color is plain grayish or reddish buff with a black tip on its tail.

Prairie dogs usually live in large colonies or villages, throwing up a mound of earth at the

State considers HOV lane for I-4

Another new plan to help alleviate traffic on Interstate 4 has been announced.

The latest plan would involve a 10-mile area from Altamonte Springs, to Central Parkway in Orlando. According to Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) spokesman Steve Homan, the new plan involves the addition of a HOV (high occupancy vehicle) lane. This would be one lane, put on land which presently serves as the median.

"In times of in the morning rush hour when people are coming from Seminole County to Orlando," he explained, "the HOV lane would direct traffic south. Then, in the afternoon rush hour, when people are leaving Orlando, the lane would allow traffic only to the north."

Homan said in order to accomplish this re-direction of traffic, barrier walls would be placed on both sides of the lane, to be closed after each rush hour, then reopened in the opposite direction for the next.

"I expect either our people (FDOT) or the Florida Highway Patrol will end up doing that every day," he said.

HOV lanes are for vehicles containing two or more people.

"Motorists better have two or more in their cars," he said. "With those barriers, there won't be any way to change lanes if they see a cop, and they could get a ticket if they are caught."

He explained that there will be adequate entrance and exit areas for the gated HOV lanes, "but it should certainly help alleviate a great deal of the traffic problems," he added.

According to latest traffic estimates, Homan said there were approximately 130,000 to 175,000 vehicles per day traveling over that 10-mile stretch of I-4.

There will apparently not be any need to purchase additional land, as the HOV lane would be in the median. The only problem will be near what is called the Fairbanks Curve, where the roadway would have to be widened (to the east, Homan said), in order to give the center

No joke: police plan 'knock knock' program

SANFORD — Don't be surprised when the police come knocking.

Before the end of this month, the Sanford Police Department will send patrol officers in pairs to visit city residents and discuss their concerns.

By the time "Operation

Knock Knock" is complete, police hope to visit every home in Sanford. They will deliver a bag full of crime prevention tips to each household that is visited.

"We hope to become better acquainted with the city's residents and foster good relationships," said Sanford Police Chief Brian Tooley.

Patrol officers will visit 12

homes per week.

"They will introduce themselves and hand out the bag with crime prevention tips," Tooley said. "Hopefully, over a few months we can visit just about every house in the city."

The visits come at a time when the department is undergoing a reorganization to increase Community Oriented

Board approves new at-risk cyber high school

SANFORD — A new charter school for at-risk high school students received approval Tuesday by the Seminole County School Board.

Cyber High Charter School will open in August 2000 for 150

students. The school will be located in the facility currently occupied by Rays of Hope Charter School on West Airport Boulevard in Sanford.

Rays of Hope Charter School, which serves at-risk middle school students, will move into the Country Club Square shopping center for the 2000-'01

school year. The move will allow Rays of Hope to serve 300 middle school students.

Cyber High Charter School must maintain an enrollment of at least 100 students. During the first three years, enrollment at the school will be limited to no more than 150 students.

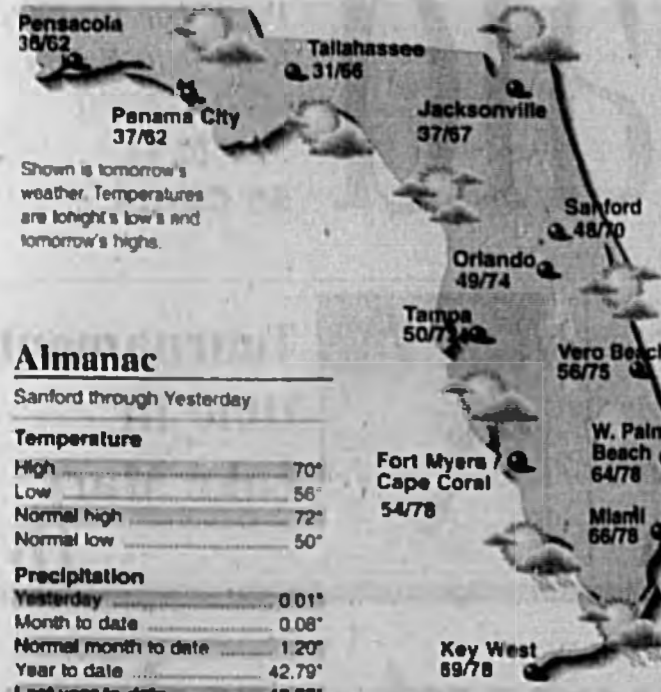

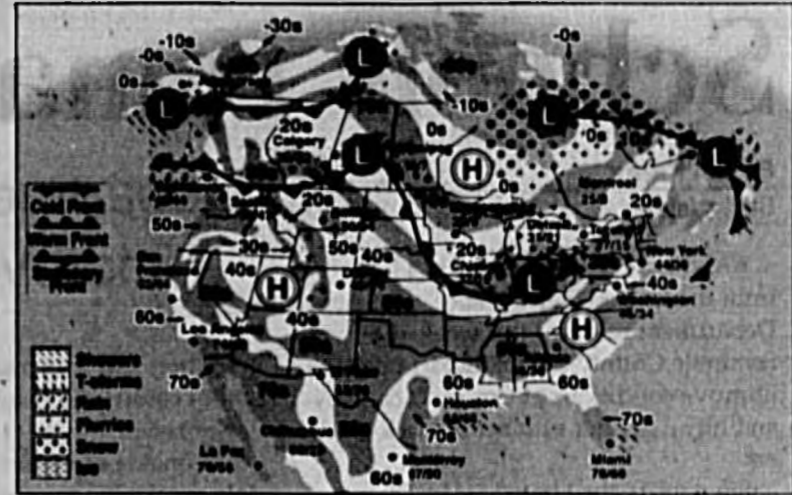

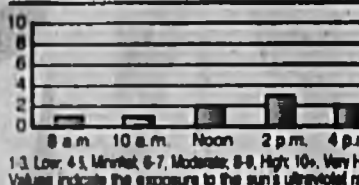

Guess who's opposed to Jenos Junction?

Here we go again, the best mayor ever and I disagree. The subject this time is the naming of the new 46A Interchange.

It has been suggested the Interchange be named in honor of the dynamic Jenos Paulucci.

I'd like it to be called Jenos Junction. Long before Larry Dale was elected to be mayor of Sanford, Mr. J. Paulucci had the vision and vigor to get the interchange plan in progress.

Dale says to name the I-4 interchange after only one person would be a "significant disservice to those who worked so diligently to revise this dead issue." The mayor said Paulucci's efforts to initiate the plan are greatly appreciated.

But, he said, Paulucci's efforts certainly did not salvage the project nor bring it to fruition.

In a recent letter to County Chairman Carlton Henley, Mr. Dale mentioned a number of politicians whose tenacity made the interchange possible.

Henley's still slapping his knee. What in the world is his former student thinking?

"The truth of it is I don't think we ought to be naming anything for those who are still alive," the chairman said Wednesday.

"What if someone messes up?" Mr. Henley wouldn't allow Lyman High School to name anything in his honor — not when the old principal was still breathing.

I agree but disagree with Mr. Henley's only-for-the-living view. It's OK to name something for the living as long as the living is not a politician. Ronald Reagan Turnpike and Ronald Reagan Airport are obvious exceptions.

You can't go wrong with the name Ronald Reagan.

There's a Lincoln Memorial Bridge in Washington and a Lincoln Tunnel in New York. Lincoln's a good name, too. So is George Washington. He has a bridge in New York. I bet neither Washington nor Lincoln imagined their names would be used in drive time.

Athletic heroes have been honored with roads named for them. There's a Pete Rose Way in Cincinnati (one day it could

connect with Cooperstown). Boston named its newest tunnel after Red Sox great Ted Williams. Nothing wrong with that.

This interchange controversy brings up another point. How many of us know that the 46A Junction - the future Jenos Junction - is Exit 51A? No one remembers the number of each interchange. They would if the interchanges had names.

I have a feeling that we're going to be hearing much more about the 46A Interchange. There may be some real name calling before it is over.

All of this is probably going to come as a huge surprise to Jenos Paulucci, whose name is on half the food we have in our freezers. He had himself a good time at the ground breaking for the 46A Interchange. Fact is, no one had a better time. Mr. P. held up a stuffed crow for all the critics who said the interchange would never be built.

Here's a deal: If Mayor Dale gives his blessing to Jenos Junction, we'll try to get the Sanford Airport renamed Air Dale Port.

To attend the school, students must meet basic requirements such as being retained at a grade level, or maintaining a grade point average below 2.0.

Many students are expected to come from private and home schools, in addition to public schools, said Cyber High Principal Leona Rachman.

"We have created a school to meet the needs of many high school students who just don't make it," Rachman said. "I want these kids to be motivated so they want to come to school everyday. Once they are motivated, they can learn anything."

Cyber High will follow the Seminole County school district's curriculum. The school will feature lap-top computers available to every student and use of the Internet to enhance instruction.

"They will be judged in basi-

cally the same way that our public schools are judged," said Marion Dailey, director of instructional support services for the school district.

For the first year, the school will only be open to 9th- and 10th-grade students. During the second year, the school will also open to 11th- and 12th-grade students. Students will be on-site five days per week.

There are expected to be 21 students per teacher at the school. The full-time staff will include seven teachers, one guidance counselor, and Rachman serving as the principal.

Teachers at the school will record lessons that students can view on tape or on a computer.

"Students who have struggled for motivation in school typically do better in a smaller environment," Rachman said. "They benefit from one-on-one

instruction, access to computers, and web-based instruction."

The cost to the school district for Cyber High Charter School is \$665,000, generated through state funding.

School district officials said they have concerns about the small budget and staff at the charter school. But, Bob Goff provided the lone vote against approving the school.

"The budget is very thin," said School Board member Larry Furlong. "Any glitch and (Cyber High) is going to find (itself) scrambling to make this work."

Board members also said they are concerned that the school currently only has one administrator, Rachman.

"All of this depends so much on her (Rachman) being there," said School Board member Jeanne Morris. "God forbid she breaks a leg."

Policing activities. Following the recommendations of a private consultant, the Sanford Police Department has been implementing a Community Oriented Policing program, most notably in the Goldsboro area.

The plans call for a realignment of 11 previous areas into

seven, and allows the department to remain flexible in reassigning more officers to problematic patrol areas if necessary.

A newly mounted external phone at the left of the entrance to the Sanford police department now allows city residents to immediately contact dispatchers after hours and on the weekends.

The department is looking into the feasibility of having a lieutenant on duty at all times, including evening hours. The City Commission has directed the department to increase officers who are on duty at night.

"Always having a lieutenant on duty would certainly be my preference," Tooley said.

area sufficient land on which to place the HOV lane.

Proposals will be sought for design and construction as early as next month, with a decision to be made by June.

"We have already done a lot of the preliminary work on the design," Homan said, "so if everything goes right, we expect the actual construction for that stretch to begin in 2001.

The additional HOV lane will

be similar to lanes presently in use in such cities as Washington, D.C., Atlanta, Denver, Los Angeles, and a number of others.

This particular project is expected to cost in the neighborhood of \$40 million.

Regarding other plans for I-4, Homan said work is still continuing.

"For the bridge over the St. Johns River, between Seminole and Volusia Counties, we are

now planning for three lanes in each direction." He said new bridge structures would be added to each side of the present bridge.

"While we are planning on that for the year 2003 to 2004, the legislature has been discussing giving the DOT a \$600 million dollar surplus it has, which could advance the bridge project to the year 2001," Homan added.

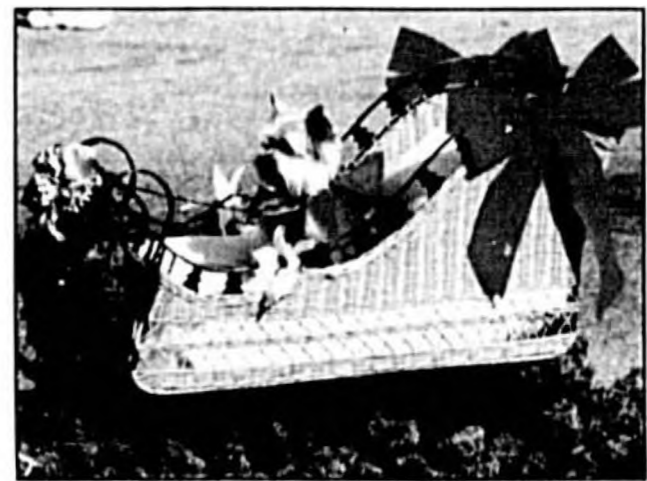

Other areas of concern include a low number of black students identified as gifted and an apparent tendency at certain schools where black students appear to be disciplined more often than non-black students.

The letter from inspector Kathleen Devine of the Justice Department took issue with the maintenance of Crooms Academy, an historically black school in Sanford prior to 1970 now serving as a school for "at-risk" middle and high school students.

"I think the inspectors picked up on the fact that we need to decide what to do about Crooms," Hagerty said.

Devine said that during her inspection she observed "a classroom where the air conditioner didn't seem to work and where the students complained that it was always hot, a poorly equipped library... and substantially fewer course offerings than at the other high schools in the district."

In addition, the letter from Devine said that the percentage of black faculty in the school district has dropped since the desegregation plan was implemented in 1970.

According to the Justice Department, during the 1998-99 school year only 8 percent of the teachers in the district were black. During the 1969-70 school year, the racial composition of the district's teachers was 25 percent black.

The Justice Department said the percentage of black teachers hired is low in comparison to neighboring school districts. Orange County's teachers are 15 percent black and Volusia's are 16 percent black. The percent of teachers hired in Florida is 15 percent black, the Justice Department said.

As of June, only 8 percent of the new teachers hired for this school year were black, the Justice Department said.

In addition, for the 1998-99 school year, there were no black certified employees in Purchasing and Warehousing,

Personnel and Human Resources, Ombudsman, Executive Director-Secondary Education, In-Service Education and Curriculum, according to the Justice Department.

Devine's letter said the Justice Department is concerned about an apparent "pattern of low black representation in higher level courses at all of the high schools and most of the middle schools in the District."

For example, in four high schools, Lake Brantley, Lake Howell, Lake Mary and Oviedo, at least half of the advanced placement classes offered for college credit had no black students enrolled, the Justice Department said.

Other areas of concern include the number of blacks in mentally disabled and in gifted classes. The racial composition of students in the school district is 14 percent black, and only three percent of the students identified as gifted are black, the Justice Department said.

Data regarding the proportion of black students in mentally disabled classes was unavailable for the inspection, but Devine said she observed what appeared to be a disproportionate representation of black students in the classes.

In addition, in 23 schools in the school district, black students are at least twice as likely as non-black students to be disciplined, the Justice Department said.

The Justice Department's letter also cited a concern about the low number of black students participating in cheerleading at high schools in the district.

Lake Howell, Lake Mary and Winter Springs high schools had no black cheerleaders in the fall 1999 season, Lake Brantley and Oviedo high schools had one black student on the squad, Lyman High School had two black students on the squad, and Seminole High School had five black students on the squad, according to the Justice Department.

"This is a very moderate level compared to what could have been the possible reaction," Hagerty said.

The key areas inspected by the Justice Department include equitable conditions in faculty and staff assignments, resource allocation, facilities, transportation, student assignment, and extracurricular activities.

"She's just raising some issues in her report," Hagerty said. "But she isn't saying what, if anything, should happen."

If the school district is found in compliance and granted unitary status, meaning that a dual system of education for blacks and non-blacks no longer exists, it would be released from the supervisory authority of the U.S. District Court.

Seminole County and other Florida school districts were sued in 1970 by the Justice Department for operating a "dual system" which separated schools for black and non-black students.

In 1970, the school district was ordered to dismantle the dual system, and to merge black and non-black students into a unitary system.

The U.S. District Court can find the district in compliance with desegregation requirements, granting "unitary status," on each key factor separately, or the court may grant

complete unitary status.

If unitary status cannot be negotiated, the School Board would seek a resolution of the issue in court.

From 1996 to 1998, the School Board negotiated four consent decrees with the Department of Justice that are designed to move the school district toward relief from court oversight. Other consent decrees have also been negotiated since 1970.

The consent decrees allowed the district to open three new elementary schools and create new elementary school attendance zones. The district also agreed to establish magnet or enrichment programs at

Goldsboro, Midway, and Hamilton elementary schools.

The district agreed to open Winter Springs High School at the beginning of the 1997-98 school year, modify high school attendance zones, and add a second magnet program at Seminole High School.

In addition, the district agreed to permit students the option of transfers. Students were given the option of transferring to the school of their choice if certain conditions were met. The district also agreed to create magnet programs at Lakeview and Sanford middle schools.

The three standards that the

Justice Department said the school district must meet in order to terminate desegregation orders include compliance with court decrees, the elimination of vestiges of past discrimination to the extent practicable, and commitment to court decrees.

mouth of each burrow. According to Marder, Sanford's prairie dog has already made its home at Lake Monroe, even though he appears to be alone.

"It's got a nice little burrow on the side of the lake," Marder said. "It seems to be very happy there."

"Even seems to be stashing things, and its got various items in its burrow."

Marder, who has lived in Florida for almost 25 years, said this is the first time he has seen a prairie dog in Sanford. However, he said several people have told him pet stores do sell the rodent.

As for the animal's sociability, Marder said it is rather shy. "It won't come up to a person, but it will stare at you," he said. "People feed it carrots and other things, and I just hope no one harms it."

Tuesday morning, employees at the Central Florida Zoological Park checked to make sure the prairie dog wasn't an escapee from their facility.

"The zoo has a pair of prairie dogs in its education department, but we checked them and they are both accounted for," Central Florida Zoological Park Marketing Director Andrea Farmer said.

Since its origin doesn't lead back to the zoo, Farmer said there is a good chance the prairie dog is someone's pet. Additionally, the lake's new res-

ident demonstrates why people need to do research before buying an exotic animal.

"There are several factors a person should consider before purchasing a prairie dog for a pet," she said. "They are not very manageable, and they are rodents whose bites can be quite bad."

"And, it needs space so it can burrow," she said. "It's not the type of animal you let loose in your backyard."

According to Farmer, the zoo receives numerous calls everyday concerning exotic pets, including pot belly pigs, pythons and iguanas, that have become too large or uncontrollable.

"People don't understand that we have limited space and can't accommodate them," she said. "They are not aware that when they are looking at a 2-foot python in a pet store, it is eventually going to grow."

"People have to look at the long-term picture before buying a pet — any pet," she added. "It's a big commitment toward any animal."

Farmer suggested research should include finding a veterinarian in the area who serves animals other than domestic breeds.

And, she said she always suggests an alternative to the exotic.

"There are so many cats and dogs that are available for adoption," she said. "They are domestic animals that make great pets."

UCF fills need with JUCO offensive tackle

ORLANDO - When the curtain fell on the 1999 season, University of Central Florida head football coach Mike Kruczek acknowledged a need to fill some holes on the offensive line.

He took a giant step in that direction Wednesday as junior college tackle Patrick Jenrette, 6-foot-7, 380 pounds, of Miami, signed a National Letter of Intent to play for UCF.

He will enroll at UCF in January and will be eligible to participate in spring drills.

Jenrette recently completed his second year at Allan Hancock College in Santa Maria, California. Prior to that he played for Miami Senior High School, the same school that produced UCF quarterback Vic Penn.

"Patrick will come in and will be immediately competitive at the strong tackle position," Kruczek said. "He's a big kid who, in our opinion, moves exceptionally well for someone who's as big as the side of a mountain. We're looking for him to be very productive in the year 2000 for us."

Jenrette is the only player UCF is expected to sign during the early signing period for junior college players who graduate in December. Signing day for high school and other junior college players is Feb. 2.

FIVE FORMER STARS ADDED TO UCF ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

ORLANDO - Five former athletes, including firsts for football, men's soccer, and women's basketball, will make up the 2000 class of the UCF Athletics Hall of Fame as Sean Beckton, Bill Giovanetti, Susan Patz, Winston DuBose, and Karen Richter will be honored in a ceremony on campus March 10.

This is the third class of the UCF Athletics Hall of Fame, which honors those individuals who, through their demonstrated athletic achievement or service, have distinguished themselves and the University of Central Florida. An eight-member panel comprised the selection committee for the 2000 class, trimming the list from more than 100 nominees.

Beckton and Giovanetti are the first football players to be named to the UCF Athletics Hall of Fame.

Beckton played wide receiver from 1987-90, and currently serves as the receivers coach at UCF. He was instrumental in the team reaching the semifinals of the NCAA Division II playoffs in 1987 and the semifinals of the I-AA playoffs in 1990. Throughout his career he set numerous school records, some of which have been eclipsed by players he has coached. He set the record for career receptions with 196 and career yardage with 2,493, and currently ranks third in both categories. He is fourth in career all-purpose yards with 3,652.

Giovanetti played linebacker at UCF from 1979-82. He was a starting linebacker on UCF's first football team, even though he was the youngest to try out at age 17. He started all 37 games of his four-year career. He led the team in tackles three of his four years and set a record for career tackles that lasted

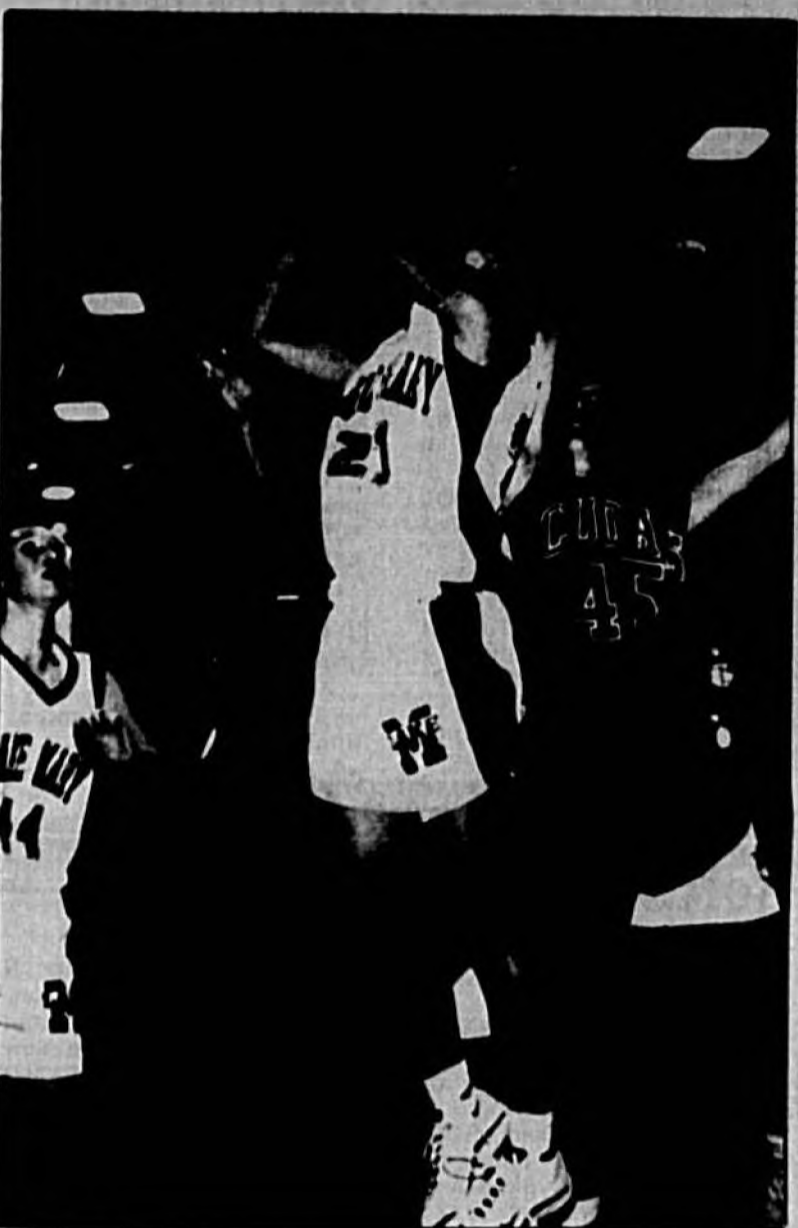

Can anyone have criminal history records sealed?

A few months ago we discussed the fact that the subject of a criminal history record sealed or expunged may, in almost all circumstances, lawfully deny or fail to acknowledge the arrests covered by the sealed or expunged records.

We also discussed the circumstances under which the subject could not deny or fail to acknowledge the arrests covered by the sealed or expunged records. This week we will discuss who is eligible to have their criminal history record sealed and what they must do in order have the court consider sealing their record.

Any person with a criminal record

not related to: (1) a sexual battery; (2) a lewd, lascivious, or indecent assault or act upon or in the presence of a child; (3) sexual performance by a child; (4) the Florida Communications Fraud Act; (5) an offense by a public officer or employee; (6) drug trafficking; or (7) a dangerous crime as defined in Florida Statutes 907.041 which includes hijacking, kidnapping, homicide, robbery, burglary, and other crimes; may petition a court to have their criminal record sealed.

If a person qualifies to have their criminal history record sealed, prior to petitioning the court, the person must apply to the Florida

Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) for a certificate of eligibility for sealing.

FDLE will issue a certificate of eligibility for sealing to a person who is the subject of a criminal history record provided that such person: (1) Has submitted to the department a certified copy of the disposition of the charge to which the petition to seal pertains; (2) Remits a \$75 processing fee to the department for placement in the Department of Law Enforcement Operating Trust Fund, unless such fee is waived by the executive director; (3) Has never previously been adjudicated guilty of a criminal offense or comparable ordinance violation or adjudicated delinquent for committing a felony; (4) Has never previously been adjudicated guilty of

a criminal offense or comparable ordinance violation or adjudicated delinquent for committing any of the following misdemeanors: assault; battery, carrying a concealed weapon, unlawful use of destructive devices or bombs, negligent treatment of children, open carrying of a weapon, exposure of sexual organs, unlawful possession of a firearm, petty theft, cruelty to animals; or arson; (5) Has not been adjudicated guilty of or adjudicated delinquent for committing any of the acts stemming from the arrest or alleged criminal activity to which the petition to seal pertains; (6) Has never secured a prior sealing or expungement of a criminal history record; and (7) Is no longer under court supervision applicable to the disposition of the arrest or alleged

criminal activity to which the petition to seal pertains.

Finally, if a certificate of eligibility is issued by FDLE, the person may petition the court to seal the record by filing a sworn petition attesting to the information required for the certificate of eligibility.

As discussed in the past, the existence of a criminal history record can have lasting repercussions. However, those repercussions can usually be minimized by having a criminal history record sealed. In the coming weeks we will discuss who may qualify for an expungement as well as other aspects of criminal law.
