# Congress Expected To Act On Sewage Plant Grants

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Congress was expected today to enact legislation handing the administration broad powers to crack down on pollution of lakes and streams that supply the nation's water.

The measure also would authorize sharp hikes in federal grants to help build sewage disposal plants.

A compromise between differing House and Senate versions, the bill was to come up for a vote first in the House.

Congressional action could mean an "outright gift" of \$100,000 to Sanford to help construct a newage treatment plant here, City Manager W. E. Knowles said today.

The measure would empower the federal government to start court action against any city or industry polluting any of the country's 26,000 lakes and streams, if state authorities approve the federal action.

Federal authority now is limited to the 4,000 water bodies which cross state boundaries and only where pol-

lution also crosses state lines. This authority would be retained without required state approval of any federal


