

Nobody cares for anything around here anymore, for Port Chicago is dying ... by order of the U.S. Navy. On July 17, 1944, two ships loading ammunition at piers on the edge of Port Chicago vaporized in a horrendous blast of 3.5 million pounds of high explosives, killing 322 men. The town itself sustained heavy damage, but no one in its limits was killed.

But the Navy feared that an other explosion at the piers vould wipe out Port Chicago-35 miles from San Francisco on a northeast reach of the bayand kill everyone in it. So, over the years, in six at tempts rancorously resisted by
