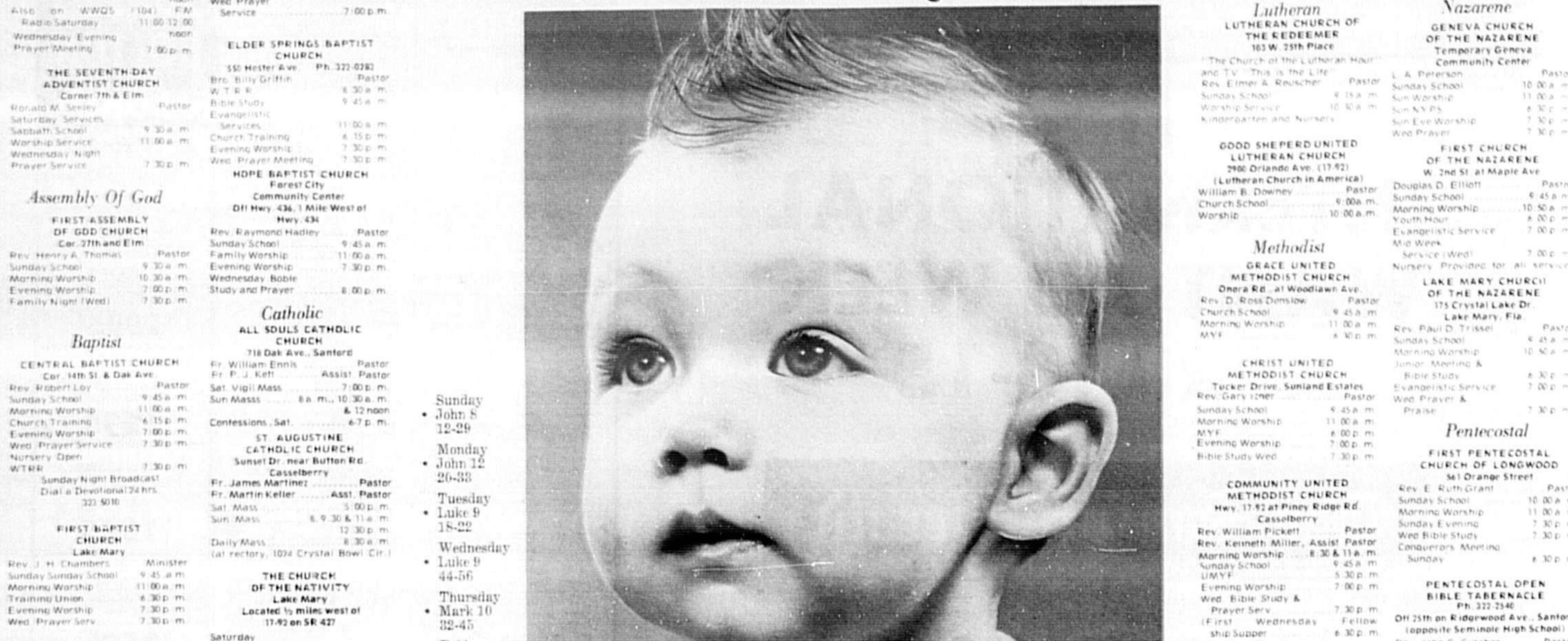

ROR Plan Shows Poor Results

Thirty per cent of the felony defendants released by Seminole County Court judges on their own recognizance since Jan. 1 haven't shown up for trial. If the ratio increases in coming months one of the judges says he may change his mind about release on recognizance (ROR). State Atty. Abbott Herring's office says 13 persons charged with felonies were put on ROR between Jan. 3 and March 31. Four of the defendants "skipped" and authorities haven't been able to locate them for arrest on failure to appear charges. All four defendants who have disappeared signed affidavits of insolvency and their cases are being handled by assistant Public Defender Gerald Hultberg.

MIAMI (AP) — Mayor David Kennedy, two judges and three other persons were indicted and booked on bribery conspiracy charges Friday, officials reported. The indictments named Kennedy, Dade County Circuit Judges Jack Turner and Murray Goodman, Miami political insider Frank Martin, the Rev. Terrence Wright and Mina Davidson, the sheriff's office said.

Mitchell Tied To McCord?

Mitchell to escort the Mitchell daughter to school. The convicted Watergate conspirator said also that he was at the Mitchell apartment once or twice a week at other times for security operations looking for electronic bugs and wiretaps. He said Mitchell sometimes met him and a driver when they brought the daughter, Martha, home and would "say a word or two of pleasantries."

Thieu, Pope Paul Confer While Riot Rages In Rome

By ODETTE MENGIN, Associated Press Writer
VATICAN CITY (AP) — Pope Paul VI and President Nguyen Van Thieu of South Vietnam conferred for more than an hour today as riot police in St. Peter's Square fought with demonstrators protesting the papal audience.
 Thieu reached and left the Vatican by helicopter to keep away from the streets where Communists and leftist Roman Catholic groups had threatened to stage a protest when he showed up.
 The Vatican described Thieu's visit as private. The Pope and the president talked privately, through interpreters. Then, the president's wife and his party were introduced to the pontiff.
 Vatican sources said the Pope urged the release of political prisoners of all creeds now held in jail in South Vietnam and inquired about peace conditions in the area.
 Catholic groups, including many priests, had sent a letter to the Pope asking him to avoid meeting Thieu to keep the Church "clean from the contamination of a cruel dictator."
 The Vatican replied that Pope Paul welcomed a chance to plead for the

good of those who suffer under any political leader.
 The Pope received the chief of the North Vietnamese delegation, Xuan Thuy, in February.
 Shortly before Thieu's helicopter touched down in the Vatican gardens, dozens of high school youths marched down Via Della Conciliazione toward St. Peter's shaking clenched fists and carrying posters that read "Down with Thieu" and "Thieu assassin."
 A brief fight broke out when they tried to cross through hundreds of police who, with clubs and tear gas, were cordoning off the square.

Arsonists Strike At Egg Plant

 Arson was blamed today for the Sunday night fire that razed the Pinebreeze Farms Inc. egg processing plant, according to Deputy Fire Marshal Ernest Wright and Seminole County sheriff's deputies.
 Wright was on the scene before firemen had finished their four-hour job of extinguishing the blaze and then again this morning, sitting through tons of damaged egg cartons with Deputy Herb Hartley sheriff's identifications officer.
 The plant, located on Sanford Ave. South of Sanford suffered little structural damage, but a large amount of materials was destroyed by the fire, smoke and water.
 Clean-up crews went to work this morning, and Jesse Rowe of Jacksonville, a vice president of Pinebreeze said they plan to be back in operation sometime this afternoon.
 New materials for packing the eggs were ordered, and Rowe said it was just a matter of getting the machines cleaned up.
 United States Department of Agriculture inspectors were in the plant's cooler today, inspecting the eggs which were being stored there when the fire broke out.
 The Pinebreeze plant in Sanford supplies eggs for much of the state, as well as shipping them to the northeast parts of the country.

Pentagon Mum On Known POW

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Pentagon says it has no information to indicate that a missing American soldier is a captive in a Cambodian prison camp as claimed by his mother.
 Mrs. Phyllis Allard of Chicago, in a copyrighted story in the New Hampshire Sunday News, said she saw her son in January 1972 for about two minutes. "I touched him and I talked to him," she said.
 The Pentagon said her son, Spec. 4 Richard M. Allard, was listed Aug. 28, 1967, as missing, not as a result of hostile action. A spokesman said Allard's name has not appeared on lists of captives who were released or who died in captivity.
 "We're not speculating on the possible," said the spokesman. "We're left with only one thing. We just don't know."
 Mrs. Allard said she told her story after the Rev. Paul Lindstrom, chairman of the Remember the Pueblo Committee, claimed that 200 Americans missing in action were still held captive in Cambodia and Laos. The Pueblo committee was organized during the North Korean captivity in the late 1960s of the crew of the U.S. Navy intelligence ship.

The State Department says no "credible information" has come to light to support Lindstrom's claim.
 Mrs. Allard said that while at the prison camp to see her son, she saw a room filled with American prisoners.
 The Pentagon claims all Americans held by the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese in Cambodia have been returned since the signing of the ceasefire agreement. Mrs. Allard says her son was held by the Pathet Lao.

McCord To Hold Talks?

NEW YORK (AP) — Newsweek magazine says it has learned that James W. McCord, the Watergate cover-up conspirator turned Congressional witness, is now threatening to tell his story in a news conference.
 Newsweek quoted unnamed sources Sunday as saying McCord was ready to tell the press that he was recruited by two men — G. Gordon Liddy and E. Howard Hunt — who told him John N. Mitchell had ordered the June 17 raid on the Democratic National Committee headquarters.
 McCord will say he was told that Mitchell cleared the plan for the intelligence operation and approved its \$300,000 budget after observing documents photographed while McCord was placing the bugs during an earlier raid, according to Newsweek.
 Mitchell, then head of the Committee to Re-elect the President, has repeatedly denied having any part in the bagging and burglary at Watergate.

Birth Control Pills Embroiled In Lawsuit

BAKERSFIELD, Calif. (AP) — Until Nov. 6, 1968, Laraine Henard was a busy young housewife, caring for four foster children and planning to adopt two of them. Now she is partially paralyzed, walks and speaks with difficulty, can do only limited work around the house.
 The stroke that damaged her brain that morning reduced her mental capacity in some areas to that of a small child. Her judgment is greatly impaired, and she and her husband — who is crippled by polio — have had to give up the foster children.
 As argued in a \$7 million lawsuit now being tried here, Mrs. Henard's stroke was caused by the birth control pills she had been taking. The Henards also contend that the manufacturer of the pills, Syntex Corp., failed to give adequate warnings about dangerous side effects.
 Moreover, as Mrs. Henard testified in halting monosyllables, that she was influenced in her decision to take the pills by a booklet in her obstetrician's office called "The Pills and Human Happiness."
 The 64-page booklet was distributed by Syntex and, according to Mrs. Henard's attorneys, gave no hint of trouble the pills might cause.
 The suit asks \$1.75 million in general damages and \$5.25 million in punitive damages. Bram Towers Hit With Rent Increase

 A 20 per cent increase in rental charges at Bram Towers has been approved by the Federal Housing Administration in Tampa and notification will be sent to the apartment complex, this week. Hugh Phillips, director of the housing management, told The Herald today.
 Phillips said, however, the increase charged to tenants for their April rents will be ordered refunded because the Towers had no authority to collect the increase at that time.
 Cause of the increase for the most part was the amount electricity costs over those estimated in the original application to FHA, he said, as well as added costs such as salaries and things that are needed to operate a building.
 After receipt of the notification, Phillips said, the residents of Bram will have to be given at least 30-days notice before the increase can go into effect.
