It contains excellent recipes for good eating while eating right for the heart at the same time. It also supplies good menu for meals that will be safer for heart worriers.

In Finland, registries for heart attacks, stroke and high blood pressure have been set up. Doctors, newspapers, radio and other sources will emphasize publicly the risk factors. Pamphlets are mailed by doctors to opinion eaders such as teachers and union officials. Although the task of changing public taste is staggering, current spot checks indicate much progress has so far been made. In five years, the government, sponsors and the public itself will know how totally effective their efforts have een. Have they been able to nduce the group to stop smoking, decrease reduce high blood pressure. A decrease in the number of heart attacks will be the final

The people of North Karelia will have to make socially acceptable the habit of no smoking anymore, to eat and serve to guests meals with fewer saturated fats in them, and far more vegetables. The new way of life - a wise one and decidedly full of health and promise. Can Americans follow the Finnish lead?






If President Nixon survives the continuing perils of Watergate and other inquiries, the nation evidently is going to witness the spectacle of a chief executive who finds in every issue a challenge which is basically a contest with

No one doubts that when problems reach the presidential level for decision, they are indeed challenges of a higher order. But Richard Nixon is peculiarly preoccupied with the way problems impact upon his own makeup, and with the public's impression of this interaction. His most recent press conference was

replete with references which went beyond the Middle East war and Watergate to the matter of how he was behaving as he responded to them. It was as though he regarded each day's

chores in the White House as some kind of aptitude test. Most typical were such comments as "the tougher it gets, the cooler I get" and "because I have been through so much, that may be one of the reasons I have what it takes."

Again and again, as so often before, the President pictured himself as a man pounded relentlessly by unfair critics and yet as a man who could and would endure these allegedly brutal slings and "carry out the best of my responsibility the duties I was elected to carry out last November."

But what comes through here is the portrait a president who spends an inordinate amount of time, and hence of the American people's time, attending not specifically to those duties but to the way he is perceived as a performer. Many public figures and political analysts have said recently that Watergate and related matters cripple the President. It is possible to argue that Mr. Nixon has always been crippled in his public life, in the sense that he has always been at least partly diverted from the problems at hand to a consideration of his own en-

report from James David Barber's broad study of presidential performance called "The Presidential Character.'

"In psychological terms, Nixon substitutes technique for value. His energies are taken up with the struggle to resolve certain fairly continuous conflicts among (his own) character

"Viewing Nixon as self-monitor and selfmanager highlights his search for signs that he is performing correctly. . . Nixon is seen as a man on the run, watching himself run, criticizing his form as he runs. He TENDS himself.'

Barber's thesis may be contentious, but the President's public utterances-over the years and not just in the extroardinary heat of 1973make it at least partly supportable

To the extent this is so, to the degree Mr. Nixon devotes himself to his personal entanglement with problems rather than simply the problems themselves, he can be judged a waster of precious White House hours and a parttime performer.

This leaves us with the ironic circumstances of living with a president who we are told works all the time and allows himself little or no fun, but who manages nevertheless to apportion too little of his day to the public's business.

Assuredly, the President deals in fact with the Middle East war, with Watergate, with China and the Soviet Union and nuclear arms control. But the evidence is strong that his prime business is Richard Nixon.



White House

Double-Cross

By JACK ANDERSON

WASHINGTON - Not long after Bebe Rebozo took a \$100,000 cash gift intended for President Nixon from industrialist Howard Hughes, the President's friend joined in a White House plot to link Hughes to the Democrats.

This amazing double-cross is revealed in confidential

White House memos, which we have uncovered in the course of investigating Rebozo's role as a money raiser for the The memos show that in January 1971, White House staff

chief H. R. Haldeman sought to plant stories in the press tying the eccentric Hughes to Democratic national chairman Larry O'Brien. This was only a few months after Rebozo had received

the last of two \$50,000 installments, paid in \$100 bills, from a Hughes aide. Yet Rebozo apparently had no hesitation to help expose the financial ties between the phantom billionaire and the Democrats.

AWARE OF DEALINGS

Rebozo was careful to request, however, that he be kept informed "if any action be taken with regard to Hughes" because of "his own dealings with the Hughes people." Both Haldeman and Dean, therefore, knew of Rebozo's dealings with Hughes, although the memos don't make clear whether they were aware the billionaire had slipped Rebozo

\$100,000 for the President Haldeman decided, nevertheless, to go ahead with the plot even if it meant "embarrassing" Hughes. Haldeman instructed Dean, however, to keep "Bebe out of it at all

Haldeman asked White House counsel John Dean in a memo, dated January 18, 1971, to begin "an inquiry into the relationship between Larry O'Brien and Howard Hughes." Dean reported back his "preliminary findings" on January 20, 1971. Among others, Dean spoke to Rebozo.

that his information regarding (a retainer paid by Hughes to O'Brien) had come from Robert Maheu, the recently released head of Hughes' Nevada operation," reported Dean "Bebe said that this information had come to his attention at a time when Maheu was professing considerable friendliness towards the Administration, but that it was not documented information. any direct knowledge by Hughes himself. "Bebe is under the impression that Maheu had a good bi of freedom with Hughes' money when running the Nevada operation. Bebe hurther indicated that he felt he could acquire some documentation of this fact if given a little time and that he would proceed to try to get any information he

"He also requested that if any action be taken with regard to Hughes that he be notified because of his amiliarity with the delicacy of the relationships as a result of his own dealings with the Hughes people.'

Dean also reported that Robert Bennett, son of Sen Wallace Bennett, R-Utah, represented Hughes. "Bennett informs me," wrote Dean, "that there is no doubt about the fact that Larry O'Brien was retained by Howard Hughes and the contract is still in existence . . . Bennett also indicated that he felt confident that if it was necessary to document the etainer with O'Brien that he could get the (documents)." Two days after receiving Dean's report, Haldeman sent

im confidential instructions. "You should continue to keep in contact with Bob Bennett, as well as looking for other sources of information on this subject," Haldeman directed. "Once Bennett gets back to you with his final report, you and Chuck Colson should get together and come up with a way to leak the appropriate

Extension adopted a resolution Wednesday calling on the board to delay implementation of new rules requiring the Highway Department to obtain environmental permits as a prerequisite to road projects.
