

The physicist left a photographic plate, wrapped in black paper, near a quantity of the flourescent uranium. When he later examined the plate he found that a distinct impression had been produced upon it. The Curies pursued the hint given by Becquerel's discovery and emerged from arduous experiments with radium.



If any additional impetus were needed following the dropping of the first atomic bomb, to drive Japan out of the war, it should surely have been furnished by the Russian declaration of war on Japan. There can be no alternative now for the Japanese but to surrender and the end may come quickly at any time. To prolong it further would entail a reckless disregard for life and property which we do not believe even the Mikado's warlords would care to entertain.

It has of course been obvious from the beginning that sooner or later Russia would come into the war against Japan. Though fearing the Germans more, she could have hated the Japanese no less and until the unprovoked Nazi attack far more friction and provocation for war had occurred along the Siberian border. Only the dangers of a two front war has kept the Russians at peace with Japan up to now.

A clash of interests between the two countries developed more than 50 years ago and the passing of years, with Japan's further encroachments upon Korea, Manchuria and China proper, has not served to assuage Russian sensibilities. Repeated border clashes, boundary disputes and differences over fishing rights were far more the rule between the two countries than empty gestures toward

Still smoldering in every Russian's heart is resentment against the humiliating defeat by Japanese forces in the war of 1904-'05. Then, as if the mere destruction of two Russian fleets at Port Arthur and in the Sea of Japan were not enough, powerful forces were landed in Manchuria and in a series of battles from the Yalu to the fall of Mukden, the most tremendous battle of all history up to that time, the Russians were whipped to a frazzle.






