BERLIN, June 6, (AP)-A chigh Russian military source said today, that a body found in Berlin has been identified with fair certainty as that of Adolf Hitler. The mmoke blackened and charred body was one of four discovered in an underground fortress beneath the Reichs chancellory after the fall of Berlin. Asked why no official an-houncement was made by Mos-cow this source said as long as any element of uncertainty axists the Russians do not wish to state definitely the body has been



### Language Trouble

Mandarin, the dialect spoken by nearly two-thirds of the population of China, has been the official Chinese government language for centuries. Thousands of poets have used its perfect imagery, hundreds of treaties and similar documents must have been written in it. But, probably because of the difficulties its complicated construction presents to Western minds, it was never used as an official diplomatic language until the San Francisco Conference.

As a result, headaches have ensued for the few available Chinese printers. For in Chinese, each word is represented by a separate character, unique in itself, instead of being a combination of letters from a short alphabet like our own. This is said to have meant that, in order to provide word-for-word translations of official documents, nearly a thousand new characters had to be designed for words which had no exact equivalent in Mandarin, and then these had to be cast in type metal before printing could begin.

Here were a thousand completely new words in a few weeks. And some Americans worry about the speed with which we change our own language to meet our needs.






