





WASHINGTON (AP) - More than 500 weather balloons weekend to help the space agency check the effectiveness

The balloons are being released at three-hour intervals from 8 a.m. EDT today to 8 a.m. EDT Sunday from points in virtually every state east of the Rocky Mountains. The National Aeronautics and Space Administration said Friday the purpose is to provide "ground truth" data and comparing it with information provided by four weather satellites. The data will be analyzed at NASA's Marshall Center in Huntsville, Ala.

LONDON (AP) — Dutch Roman Catholic missionaries charged in a diary published in British newspapers today that Portuguese troops in Mozambique massacred 113 Africans and buried them in a mass grave.

The charges were made by five missionaries, known as the Pipcus fathers, who ran the Sacred Hearts mission at Inhaminga, about 120 miles north of the port of Beira in the Portuguese colony where a guerrilla war has raged for the last decade.

The missionaries said they closed the mission down in

Their account of the alleged massacres was contained in a diary published by the Times and the Guardian.

Prodigy Checks Spassky

MOSCOW (AP) - A 23-yearold Russian chess prodigy, Anatoly Karpov, has eliminated Boris Spassky with unexpected ease from the world challengers' competition. Karpov defeated Spassky in the 11th game in the series Friday to win the series 4-1. He meets another Russian, Viktor Korchnoi, in the fall to decide who will meet world champion Bobby Fischer in 1975. Spassky was considered the favorite when the series started, and he took the first game. But Karpov, rated Russia's best player last year got the needed four victories with nine matches to spare in the 20-game series. Observers compared Karpov's achievement with Fischer's when the American crushed Spassky to win the world title in 1972.

We'll be glad to do it. All citizens who are 18 years of age or over and who have resided in Florida and Seminole County for 60 days may register to vote. Florida has two primaries, commonly known as the first and second primaries. You will be able to vote in the primaries only for those candidates of the party in which choice or for any independent candidates who are qualified to run. Further, you may register to vote at the Seminole County Courthouse in Sanford or at the branch office in Seminole Plaza at

Casselberry. You have until 30 days before the first primary in September to register. Five days following the second primary the books will again be open to registrants. By the way, when you register to vote in Seminole County and

Can a real estate broker licensed in Seminole County actually obtain listings and sell real property in another county without being licensed in the other county?

The answer to your question is yes. The license a real estate broker purchases each year from the Seminole County Tax Collector's office is a State and County occupational license and that office and its representatives may do business anywhere in Florida. In addition, the broker and all of his sales people must hold individual real estate licenses issued by the Florida Real Estate Commission. These licenses, too, are good anywhere in

However, this probably has nothing to do with your question but a real estate broker who is a Realtor and is, for example, a member of the Seminole County Board of Realtors, may do business in -shall we say-Lake County. But unless he is a member of the Lake County Board of Realtors the Seminole County Realtor cannot hold himself out as a Realtor in Lake County. He can operate in Lake County as a real estate broker but not as a Realtor.

The most highly concentrated pueblo architecture may be found today in Arzona, New Mexico and Colorado and ranges in age from the 700s up to the present if you consider modern adaptations of the ancient style.

One of the richest areas of pueblo architecture is in the Albuquerque, Santa Fe and Rio Grande River valley of western and southwestern New Mexico.

Here the architecture of the Southwest, so different from the architecture of the West, the Midwest and the South which it borders, has its own distinctive flavor—a flavor derived from the blending of three cultures, the Indian, Spanish and the Anglo-Americans.

This blending of three cultures permeates the languages, customs, relighous beliefs, folklore and art of the region but most of all the architecture leaves an indelible impression on the land regardless of the passage of time.

In an age where tradition and old ways are frequently discarded for the new, pueblo architecture in Santa Fe and surrounding areas is hardly being shuttled away.

Connally Tied To Dairy Cover-Up

Bob A. Lilly, former lobbyist for Associated Milk Producers, Inc., said Connally, then Treasury secretary and in command of the Internal Revenue Service, "may have resolved" the tax matter, according to notes taken by a

lawyer who interviewed Lilly. Also, co-op lawyer Jake Jacobsen once told the milk producers' leaders that Connally had written about the matter directly to R.L. Phinney, the IRS district director in Austin, Tex., an informed source said.

Phinney, a long-time friend and former business partner of Connally, acknowledged that he had been involved in the 1971 audit, but denied that Connally or anyone in Washington had contacted him about it.

Also made public was a letter that Lilly wrote to Jacobsen when the tax audit began. The letter was dated Aug. 26, 1971, a few months after Jacobsen had enlisted Connally to help persuade President Nixon to raise milk prices. Lilly asked Jacobsen to help again. Lilly said Doyle Bond, an IRS agent from San Antonio,

Tex., the milk producers' headquarters, was asking questions about some suspicious checks. Lilly said Bond had indicated he might get a promotion if he could "raise an issue over our questionable expenditures." Those questionable expenditures may total several million

dollars, recent disclosures indicate. But when the audit was over, nothing new had been uncovered-and the milk producers owed no extra taxes.
