is seventh. It is fifth in Florida. It is possible that tuberculosis has been increased due to the stepped up tempo of the people. They do not eat enough, and just now there is cause for more worry, all of which contribute to the easy development of tuberculosis.

Although tuberculosis is highest between the ages of 18 to 45 in the rest of the United States, over one-third of the 1,000 deaths from the disease that occurred in Florida in 1941 were over 45. Many died in this state in their thirties, seventies and even nineties. This is due largely to the mistaken idea that Florida climate is healthful to tuberculosis and the large influx of these unfortunate people from the north each year, Dr. D. me added.

Tuberculosis can be cured if detected early, Dr. Dams stated. It is often fatal if discovered in the advanced stage. When the disease first starts in the lungs, no symptoms are noticeable. An early of the lungs, however, will reveal the presence of tuberculosis in the stage.

"As the disease develops, week by week, the person infected usually notices a tired feeling, gradually loses weight, often coughs with expectoration, may spit up blood, run an afternoon fever, have night sweats, experience indigestion or poor appetite, hoarseness or huskiness of voice. Unless pleurisy develops the patient seldom experiences much pain in the chest."

About 400 persons can be X-rayed each day, Monday, Sept. 4, will be for white people and Tuesday, will be for colored. The program for the rest of the week will be published later.



Just Where Is Middle East, Reporter Asks

Just what sort of geographical picture hits your mind's eye when you encounter the terms "Middle East" and "Near East" which appear so often in these war days?

Since you are a truthful person your answer likely is that the expressions strike you as being very like the traditional boarding-house hash—in very uncertain composition—since that describes them very exactly. Not even in character the world around is there much unanimity in defining these localities.

In an effort to pin the thing down I recently made inquiries in both Washington and London. The result was what Colonel Durante might call colossal, amazing and staggering. In charge of the whole area from Greece to Afghanistan, inclusive. The U. S. War office has no official classification for the territories. Officers handling the department's war communications say they prefer to think of Egypt and Libya as North Africa and the Middle East as comprising Iran, Iraq, Asiatic Turkey and territory cut off by a line drawn from about where Asiatic Turkey begins to the east of Palestine and Syria leaving Syria and Palestine for the Near East.

The British Foreign Office has no fixed division of Middle East and Near East. Generally Egypt, Palestine, Trans-Jordan, Iraq, Arabia, Syria, Turkey and Greece are considered as in the Near East. The Middle East includes Iran, Afghanistan and India.

The British War Office doesn't acknowledge the existence of a Near East region military. It includes in the Middle East, Iraq, Trans-Jordan, Syria, Iraq and Iran.

The whole area falls within the British sphere of influence, and as references to the zone almost invariably are in the military sphere, it is the British War Office definition is perhaps the most useful of the lot for the time being. Probably it is the one we see most often in print.

Landing On North America Mainland Is Said Possible

(The following story is by Sam Jackson, Wide World Features writer who toured Alaska extensively shortly before the outbreak of war between the United States and Japan.)
SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 4. (W. W. P.)—Events in Bering Sea indicate that America may be on guard against a Japanese landing on the mainland of North America. The stepping-stone strategy of invasion which the enemy employed so successfully in the bright sunlight of the tropics might be much easier when hidden by the dense fogs of Alaskan waters. Japanese are in possession of the line of the Aleutian island chain with a force estimated to 25,000 men. Considering the size and terrain of the occupied islands, this latter figure is incredible unless the Japanese are assembling a real invasion force and quartering the men on troops-ships. Our Navy has bombarded, sunk and battered enemy vessels at Kiska Island, but has not dislodged the invaders. The most disquieting report is one from fishermen that the Mikado's forces have taken over the four Pribilof, long famed as the source of the finest sealskins in the world. The U.S. Navy says it has no information to support these reports. The islands are undefended and have a population of only 412 natives and 14 government agents. This might indicate that instead of heading for the populous southeastern part of Alaska, the Japanese plan to seize the mouths of the Yukon and Kuskokwim rivers or to take over the immense Seward peninsula and its tiny "metropolis" of Nome. "Everyone at the Base has contributed 100 per cent," said Supervisor Stevens. "When we get through with our work here, the near 2,000 acres won't yield an old nail—we'll have everything, probably 10,000 pounds or more."

Chairman Dawson is highly pleased with the scrap donations and co-operation. "We have a great supply now but we are going to double and triple it. I am not going to give out exact or approximate figures now but when the time comes, I want to say that Seminole County, Florida, can beat any other county in the United States. I am grateful to the Naval Air Station and Supervisor Stevens for the manner in which they have so wholeheartedly co-operated in this drive."

Spanish Shake-up Is In Favor Of Allies

MADRID, Sept. 4.—(AP)—Ramon Serrano Surer, brother-in-law of Generalissimo Francisco Franco and avowed admirer of the totalitarian system, was named as Foreign Minister and Falange leader Thursday in the greatest governmental shake-up since the Spanish Civil War. He was succeeded as Foreign Minister by Count Francisco Gomez Jordana, long-time soldier-statesman who was Foreign Minister in the old Primo de Rivera dictatorship and held the same post when the United States recognized the Franco regime April 11, 1939. Franco himself took over Serrano Surer's place as chief of the political Junta of the Falange, Spain's only authorized party.

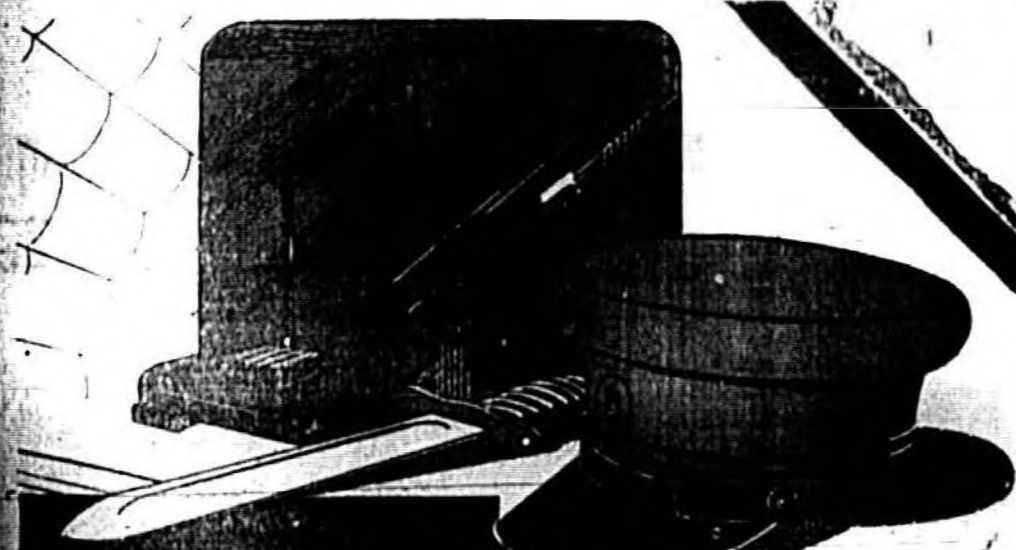

Great Fires Roar In Rhineland City After RAF Attack

Frankfurt, Nazi Fort City, Is Blasted For 35th Time By British Warplanes

(By Associated Press)

In the western air war, waves of RAF bombers attacked Frankfurt, Rhineland fort city last night in the sixth night raid on Germany this month and the 35th raid on Frankfurt. Great fires were started.

Meanwhile, Vichy quarters said Washington's blunt rejection of Vichy protests over American air raids on Nazi-occupied France has not been received officially yet. These quarters asserted the bombing of Rouen by United States Army flying fortresses was executed at Stalingrad's orders.

The RAF sent heavy forces of bombers across the English Channel last night after Boston (Douglas) bombers, in two separate operations, had blasted the docks at Le Havre and Cherbourg from which Nazi submarines sometimes sail.

The size of the night raid, like those of the daylight hours, was a military secret, but watchers at a south coast English town said the starlight bombers thrashed with the continuous thunder of motors as the planes raced to the attack.

Two of the escorting fighters were missing after the attacks on Le Havre and Cherbourg, but there was no mention of losses among the bombers.

A coastal command plane shot down a German plane off the southwest coast of England today.

The Berlin radio said two British planes flew over Germany in daylight and one described as a "Gloster" was shot down. The same radio said eight British planes were shot down in the raid on Le Havre and another near Brest.

British Planes Smash At Supply Lines Of Rommel

ANKARA, Turkey, Sept. 9. (AP)—A member of Wendell Wilkie's party today said German officers captured in Africa disclosed that German Field Marshal Rommel is suffering from some malady and may be relieved of his command. He also said Hitler is sending 10-year-old boys in Rommel's army, and the Germans are war-weary and dejected.

(By Associated Press)

On the Egyptian front, a continued lull is reported in ground fighting, while RAF planes attacked Rommel's long drawn supply lines on the Sidi Barrani road.

Edward Kennedy, Associated Press war correspondent with the American tank crews in the Egyptian desert, reported Tuesday that the Axis tanks destroyed by the U.S. forces were of the German type considered virtually invulnerable when they broke through France two years ago and were greatly strengthened by facing armor.

Kennedy said any illusions about the invulnerability of this type would be dispelled by a look at the number of Hitler's anti-tank shells and by now reduced to burned out and smashed junk heaps.

Kennedy pointed out that although the numbers destroyed by the British were not available, they were not comparable to those which fell victim to the British, for the Americans formed only a small part of the desert in the past week of battle.
