It seems timely and appropriate to again remind Sanford people of The BERG. Editor and Manager the almost unlimited potentialities of the St. Johns River as a medium for the transportation of those things necessary for the continued prosperity of this city and neigh-

The figurative tears that are being shed because of the seriousness of the freight tie-up have blinded many to the remedy of the situation represented in the navigable St. Johns, offering ready accessibility to the Jacksonville piers. While river development has long been advocated by farsighted citizens, and initial steps have been taken for the construction of a warehouse at the foot of Sanford Avenue, this city is far behind in its water front program, and quick work will be required to bring it up to date.
