Every summer the problem of hiring vacationing students becomes more and more pressing. This year we were so impressed with one solution to the situation that we would quote from a letter written to every member of the Florida Congressional delegation by Philip J. Lee, president of the Florida State Chamber

Wrote he: "Each year at this time as our schools and colleges close, hundreds of thousands of young men and women, boys and girls, find themselves with time on their hands - too

"Of those nations where a minimum wage is in effect, it is my understanding that ours is

"I think it stands to reason that all employ ers will first exhaust every effort to obtain experienced people so long as they must pay minimum wages before reaching into the group of inexperienced young people. This understandably accounts in large measure for the fact that the unemployment of teenagers in the socalled ghetto areas now averages 20 per cent.

"This year, as in many previous years, our Federal government has appealed to private employers to set up program for giving jobs to young people during the school recess. The Florida State Chamber of Commerce endorses this program, and I have consistently urged our members to cooperate.

"However, the minimum wage provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act as it affects our student population frustrates the efforts of business to create summer jobs for young people by stretching the cost beyond all limits.

"Today millions are on overtime pay while for three months our brightest youngsters who want and need to work are condemned to roam
