Dispute Holds Up \$10 Million Project

Construction on a \$10 million project, said to be one of the area's most exclusive residential developments, could be prevented until a dispute between an Atlanta investment firm and the Seminole Board of County Commissioners is resolved.

Homes scheduled to be built in the Hanover Woods subdivision on Markham Road, about one mile north of Lake Mary Boulevard, will require a water distribution installation. However, who will pay for the water plant is now undetermined. Until the matter is settled, building permits cannot be issued.

Russell Swain, a Longwood builder, said the Hanover Woods development will contain 71 homes on one-acre

"It will be one of the most exclusive projects in the area. I have one order for an eight-bedroom, five-bath home with a selling price well above \$300,000," Swain said. He

said the average price of the homes in the development will probably be in excess of \$150,000.

County administrator Roger Neiswender told commissioners this week he has received a proposal from the Atlanta firm of CMEI, Inc. asking the county to pay \$104,000 to purchase the uncompleted water plant. But Neiswender said the original developer promised the plant would be conveyed to the county without cost the pledge was made when the development was planned in

"They're asking the county to buy a system which had originally been pledged as a donation," commissioner

The dispute, however, does not involve the original developer, Geiger Development. Neiswender said Geiger experienced financial difficulties in 1974 shortly after tentative agreement over the donation of the plant to the county had been worked out. Hanover Woods then became the project of CMEI, which assumed Geiger's

A letter dated Sept. 24, 1974, was sent to the county by the Orlando law firm of Lowndes, Piersol, Drosdick and Doster, counsel for Geiger Development. The letter reads in part: "Geiger offers to convey the water distribution system in the Hanover Woods Subdivision as designed and constructed with PVC pipe, once it is fully completed and properly approved, together with all of the required easements, to Seminole County."

Official minutes of a Sept. 23, 1974, commission meeting also quote Geiger officials as offering to convey the water plant to the county. However, before a contract for the title transfer could

be drawn up, Geiger pulled out of the project. Floyd Whittaker, CMEI executive, said the water plant is about three to four weeks away from completion. He said it will be worth between \$300,00 and \$400,000. According to Whittaker, CMEI had planned to have the water system run by a private utility, but the county

expressed interest in owning the plant.

But Whittaker said negotiations over the plant were in a "delicate stage right now" and he did not want to comment on whether or not a previous agreement had been made for the donation of the plant to the county.

County attorney Nikki Clayton said the hold on building permits would reamin in effect until a solution to the

water plant question can be found. That hold on permits has some builders "frantic," according to Graham Campbell, independent contractor. "Some builders don't understand why they can't get a permit. They're already paying interest on the land and

they are a little frantic," Campbell said. Bill Martin, sales manager for Huskey Realty,

marketers of the homes, said some banks are asking for a written assurance from the county that the homes will be guaranteed water service before they are willing close on the sale of Hanover Woods lots. Martin said he expects the matter to be resolved before most of the building begins.

Franco's Wife, Daughter Among 50 Killed In Fire

SARGOSSA, Spain (UPI) — Flames engulfed the plush Hotel Corona de Aragon early today, killing at least 50 people and injuring scores more. The injured included the widow and daughter of Generalissimo Francisco Franco. The civil government of Saragossa reported the death toll had reached 50 and that 81 injured were admitted to four hospitals in the northern Spanish city, 160 miles west of Barcelona.

Among the guests in the city's most luxurious hotel were Carmen Polo Franco, the 79-year-old wife of the late Spanish dictator. She was in Sargossa to attend the graduation of her grandson, Cristobal Martinez Bordiu Franco, from the General Military Academy.

Authorities said the fire started in a ground floor restaurant when boiling oil spilled from a machine making churros, traditional Spanish breakfast fritters. Flames spread quickly through the 10-story hotel, which contains much wooden paneling.

160 Cars In Chain Accident

Route 46 near Sanford was accidental in nature, Seminole County Sheriff's deputies TOKYO (UPI) - A chain reaction of motor vehicle accidents in a highway tunnel Wednesday night destroyed about 160 cars and left at least six persons dead, police destroyed about one-third of the

Police said the fire that followed the wreck in one of the worst highway accidents in Japan was out of control almost 24 hours after it erupted. They said the mishap occurred in the 1.27-mile

and Nagoya in central Western Japan. The fire that was triggered by the initial wreck spread to other vehicles, including a truck loaded with inflammable chemicals, forcing drivers and other occupants to abandon their cars and evacuate, police said.

Factory Ship Whaling Banned

LONDON (UPI) — The International Whaling Commission, brushing aside fierce opposition from Japan and the Soviet Union, has agreed on an indefinite ban on factory ship whaling. The U.S. delegate predicted other major conservation victories during the weeklong session.

"This will be the greatest series of conservation measures we have had," said U.S. delegation chief Richard A. Frank following the landmark decision by the 23-nation commission Wednesday.

Frank said new measures are likely to include creating a "whaling sactuary" in the Indian Ocean, slashing y 35 percent to 50 percent the current 20,000 quota on killing whales and imposing a ban on importation by mem countries of whale meat caught by "pirate" whalers.

Somoza Rejects Rebels' Offer

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (UPI) — The Sandinista rebel junta offered to safeguard the lives of Anastasio Somoza's followers if the Nicaraguan ruler resigned but Somoza rejected the offer today and declared: "Nuts to you!" A Sandinista communique issued Wednesday in San Jose, Costa Rica, said the rebel government promised to guarantee the lives of guard officers and privates and pledged safe conduct passes out of Nicaragua for those military and government officials "not guilty of serious crimes against the people.'

In a telephone interview with UPI early today from his windowless, fortified bunker in Managua, Somoza said, "They the junta are crazy because that the plan does not give anybody any guarantees in Nicaragua. So they guarantee exile, which is not within the constitutional rights with which we live today."...

Begin Returns From Talks

JERUSALEM (UPI) - Prime Minister Manachem Begin returned today from two days of talks with Egyptian President Anwar Sadat in Alexandria and said the two countries are moving into a phase of friendship

He said his talks with Sadat were held in an atmosphere of "real understanding and true friendship." Begin said oil-related problems between the two countries have been "completely settled" and Sadat reassured him that Egypt would sell Israel oil from the wells in the Gulf of Suez at world prices after they are returned later this year.

Tunisia Releases Jet's Crew

AMSTERDAM, Netherlands (UPI) - The crew of a U.S.-owned cargo jet detained in Tunisia for 30 hours for refusing to fly PLO weapons to Sandinista rebels arrived safely in Amsterdam late Wednesday under U.S. Embassy orders not to discuss the affair. Capt. Paul Marabele of Kansas City, Mo., flew his

Global International Airways 707 into Schipol Airport after U.S. Ambassador Stephen Bosworth negotiated the release of the aircraft from Tunisia. The Tunisians unloaded the weapons as well as relief supplies bound for Nicaraguan refugees in Costa Rica.

Brothel Madams Executed

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — Revolutionary courts executed three women for running brothels, a man for importing pornography from Israel, and two others for sabotage and murder, the state radio reported today.

The three women, all accused of working as madams in Tehran's red light district, were the first women to be executed by the revolutionary Moslem government.

SALT Negotiator Nitze Blasts Proposed Treaty

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Paul Nitze, a leading critic of SALT II, said today the arms limitation treaty "limits the wrong things" and fails to force the two superpowers to make significant reductions in their strategic forces. He also said he doubts the United States will be able to maintain "essential equivalence" with the Soviet Union if the SALT II treaty is ratified. Nitze, a past SALT negotiator and former deputy

secretary of defense, expands on his criticisms before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee as the panel winds up its first week of hearings with "Critics Day." Also scheduled to testify against the SALT pact was retired Lt. Gen. Edward Rowny, who served until June 30 as the representative of the Joint Chiefs of Staff on the SALT delegation. Rowny's dissatisfaction with SALT led him to resign from the Army and to boycott the signing of the SALT II treaty in Vienna. As a negotiator, he had been invited to attend.

Ethics Hearing Nears End

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Herman Talmadge says his Georgia constituents never expected him to be a bookkeeper, and he's guilty only of delegating financial responsibilities to staff members who made honest errors. In his first public testimony, the powerful Georgia Democrat Wednesday swore that his ex-wife Betty Talmadge and his former aide Daniel Minchew lied to the committee about his financial affairs.

Talmadge, testifying before the Senate Ethics Committee, claimed his pocket money came from small gifts of cash forced on him by loyal constituents, not from cash hoards as suggested by his accusers. He offered little new

Talmadge was returning to the stand today to answer more questions under oath, and committee Chairman Adlai Stevenson, D-Ill., expressed hope this would be the last day of the financial misconduct hearings that began

'Bob' Just A Depression

NEW ORLEANS (UPI) - Weak-kneed tropical storm Bob, crumbling into a large thunderstorm as it crawled northward, dumped several inches of rain in Mississippi and Alabama but did little else in Louisiana to live up to its fishing village.

Bob, the Atlantic zone's first hurricane of the season and first to bear a masculine name, deteriorated quickly over south Louisiana Wednesday afternoon into a tropical storm. Bob was expected to weaken further to a tropical depression by today. Tourists in the French Quarter quickly returned to the

streets Wednesday and tiptoed over small branches and twigs — the only sign a storm had come and gone.

One person died in the storm's passage. A man in the small fishing village of Lafitte, La., was killed when a metal roof he was repairing collapsed.

Hearing Held On DC-10 Crash WASHINGTON (UPI) - Federal aviation experts are

investigating the use by airlines of shims - pieces of metal used to fill spaces - on the DC-10 and other air-

The issue arose during a Senate Commerce sub-committee hearing on the DC-10 investigation. The hearings are to resume today with testimony from American Airlines and McDonnell Douglas officials as well as spokesmen for the Airline Passengers Association, a Texas-based group that sued to get the DC-10 grounded. Charles Foster, head of the FAA Office of Aviation Standards, said the use of shims is a "common practice and is approved." But National Transportation Safety Board Chairman James King said the board's experts are investigating why the shims were on the DC-10 involved in the nation's worst air accident in Chicago in May.

Health Care Costs Can Be Cut Easily

Unnecessary hospitalization has long contributed to the alarming escalation of healthcare costs in the United States. And now that most American cities are experiencing a surplus of hospital beds. physicians find it easier than ever to admit patients who might just as well recuperate at home. The fact that 90 percent of all hospital bills are

paid by so-called third parties - insurance companies or government agencies - leaves little direct incentive for physicians, hospitals or patients to economize.

The inevitable result is steeply rising health-care costs that in turn produce pressure for what we regard as ill-advised government controls. A more constructive solution was suggested

recently by Blue Shield of California. It recommended that physicians add 700 specified surgical and medical procedures to the list of those that should be performed without hospitalization. Most of these minor operations are routinely conducted under local anesthesia and, barring complications. patients need not run up their bill by spending any time in a hospital.

No doubt some will argue that these recommendations should be made binding and that Blue Shield of California should refuse to pay hospitalization for procedures on this list. But making the list advisory rather than mandatory leaves physicians free to determine the need for hospitalization on a case-by-case basis, which is the way such decisions should be made. The list does, however, put doctors on notice that their decisions will be audited and must be justified.

Blue Shield of California is the only Blue Cross-Blue Shield organization in the country pursuing such a program. Should it succeed in paring healthcare costs, and we think it will, Blue Cross and Blue Shield insurers in other states will be hard pressed not to subject their own healthcare costs to similar

Logical Ruling

The facts are that Frances B. Davis, a deaf person, was refused admittance to the nursing program at Southwestern Community College of North Carolina because college officials believed she could not be properly trained as a registered nurse. She sought relief from the decision and the case eventually reached the Supreme Court.

Davis believed she had the right to take the nursing course and to receive special help to compensate for her disability because of the Rehabilitation Act passed by Congress in 1973. At issue was a section of the act which said that "no otherwise qualified handicapped indivudual" can be excluded "solely by

reason of his handicap." The high court's 9-0 ruling recognized there are practical limits to the rights of handicapped persons.

It held that "an otherwise qualified person is one who is able to meet all of a program's requirements in spite of his handicap," and also an educational institution is not required under the law to lower or substantially modify its standards to ac-

The handicapped certainly deserve special consideration and increased opportunities to become active and productive members of our society. The nation is committed to such goals. But there are limitations in this life for everyone — the fit and the lame. Writing for the court, Associate Justice Lewis F. Powell said, "The ability to understand speech without reliance on lip reading is necessary to patient safety." The Supreme Court was right in its ruling.

Doubts On High

WASHINGTON (NEA) - Uncertainty about President Carter's chances for re-election now has reached unprecedented heights - to Vice President Walter F. Mondale, handpicked by Carter as his running mate less than three years

During recent trips back to his home state of Minnesota, Mondale quietly passed the word to fellow Democrats: Kindly avoid making any commitments regarding the 1982 race for the U.S. Senate seat from that state.

Those who have had personal conversations with the vice president on the delicate subject say Mondale clearly is concerned about the possibility of being out of office if the Carter-Mondale ticket loses in 1980. Mondale, apparently seeking to minimize or

eliminate opposition for the Democratic nomination in the Senate race, has held public office during virtually his entire adult life and was a member of the Senate before joining the Carter ticket. If he seeks to return to the legislature, Mondale undoubtedly would face Republican opposition, probably from the current officeholder.

Sen. David Durenberger, who was elected only

last year to fill the remaining four years of the final term of the late Hubert H. Humphrey Sen. Howard H. Baker Jr., R-Tenn., may encounter some difficulty in retaining his position as Senate minority leader while

Baker acknowledges that "at some point" late this year or early in 1990, "I'm going to have focus all my attention on the presidential



Stabler Staying A Raider?

NEW YORK (UPI) - You have to say this much for Ken He tried so hard, he wound up right back where he started which explains why he's likely to be showing up at the Oakland Raiders' camp in Santa Rosa, Calif., this weekend.

The 33-year-old quarterback is one of those players who doesn't ordinarily communicate with mere reporters anymore but the last time he deigned to do that he said he was generally unhappy over his situation with the Raiders. He felt they simply didn't appreciate him. Furthermore, he believed this whole attitude stemmed from the top, meaning Al Davis, the Raiders' boss.

Stabler's attorney, Henry Pitts of Selma, Ala., claimed his client was "the premier quarterback" in the NFL and that Davis was being so intransigent about the whole thing, he wouldn't even consider trading Stabler to another club. The clubs Stabler had in mind were the New York Giants, Los Angeles Rams, Atlanta Falcons and Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

When this information was relayed to Davis by a San Francisco newsman, the Raiders' managing general partner told the reporter to determine from Stabler and Pitts what they thought Stabler was worth on the open market. The answer came back that they felt Stabler should bring two front line players and two firstround draft choice in any kind of trade.

Davis said that was fine with him. He went along with it. He did specify, however, the two front line players would have to be "young" and "free of injury." These would be the "minimum requirements." By that, Davis said, he meant he'd take two young front-liners from a club like the Giants, Falcons and Buccaneers but if there was to be any deal with the Rams, he

Upon hearing this, Stabler, through Pitts, sought permission to make a deal for himself with the clubs of his choice. Davis sent back word to Pitts to go right ahead.

The Giants were Stabler's first choice for a number of reasons. First of all, he liked the idea of playing for the Giants' new coach, Ray Perkins, who was a teammate of his at Alabama, and secondly, there was the added exposure he'd get being in, or at least, very close, to a city like New York.

Historically, the Giants could be thinking back 18 years ago when they also traded for a veteran quarterback in the Bay Area many people thought was washed up after he had played for the San Francisco 49ers 10 years, and how this balding 35-year-old gamester by the name of Y.A. Tittle led them to the last championship game in which they were involved.

If they made a deal for Stabler, the Raiders naturally would be interested in getting a young quarterback in return. What about Phil Simms, the Giants' top draft choice? Would they consider giving up someone like him and, say, one of their linebackers like Harry Carson? I put that question to George Young, the Giants' new general manager, and he didn't duck it at all.

"I think Stabler has been a great player in this league," he said. "I know Ray (Perkins) thinks a lot of the guy and they're great friends, but we're committed in a different direction." From speaking with George Young, I come away with the impression that he wouldn't mind having an experienced quarterback, a five-time All Pro like Stabler, but he isn't about to give up what it would take to get him. I can't say I blame him, especially at this stage where most of his efforts with the Giants

revolve essentially around building some kind of foundation with young players.

I also get the feeling the Raiders would make a deal for Stabler if one could be worked out. I even think they'd take a chance with an untried prospect like Simms out of little Morehead State. If the Raiders are leaving it up to Stabler and Pitts to make the deal,

however, the chances of one being completed are practically nil, keeping in mind neither have ever swung a trade before and it's a Two thoughts keep coming back to me on all this. Wasn't it only a couple of weeks ago that some fans at the NFL draft booed the Giants for making someone like unknown Phil Simms from little Morehead State their first draft choice? And he could turn out to

be the next Terry Bradshaw, who came from little Louisiana And wasn't it not that long ago that young, eager Ken Stabler, ting up splinters on the bench watching Daryle Lamonica and George Blanda ahead of him at quarterback, wondered when he'd ever get a chance to play for Oakland? He thought those two guys would never leave. What he wouldn't give to play more for the Raiders, I remember him telling me. And now he says he doesn't want to anymore. Sometimes, those football players act nearly as nutty as baseball players.





Outlaws Bury Their Dead

TELOGIA, Fla. (UPI) - In the startled silence after the gunfire, the spent cartridges clinked like a ghostly echo to the bottom of the rain-damp grave. Then long-haired, bushybearded men lowered the coffin

into the earth and, having laid to rest Leonard "Terrible

Terry" Henderson, they gunned their massive motor-

cycles to a vicious wail and sped away. Two hundred members of the Outlaws came to this little town Tuesday to see Henderson buried right. They let his family do it their way, then they did it the Outlaw way. Henderson was one of five members of the biker gang slaughtered in Charlotte, N.C. Police called it the Fourth of July Massacre. Some officers said they were certain the Outlaws' arch enemies, the Hell's Angels, were behind

Hundreds of townspeople lined the road when the procession of 91 bikes and a number of cars and vans carried Henderson to the Good Hope cemetery. Henderson's family sat in chairs by the grave while the Outlaws stood back and a local Methodist minister, the Rev. Larry Potts, eulogized Henderson for "the love he had for his mother."

The black-clad family, the women among them sobbing, were then led away and the Outlaws - in their denim or leather vests emblazoned with the skull and crossbones stepped forward, headed by a man named Stitch. "He lived as an Outlaw, and by God he died as an

Outlaw," Stitch said in a stark eulogy. Then he told the bikers to remember Terrible Terry in their own way. After a few seconds of silence, two of the bikers screamed out an obscene curse upon the Hell's Angels. And then, about 50 of the bikers swiftly produced pistols, from their boots, their belts or their "old ladies" purses and a ragged 15-second barrage rolled over the cemetery.





Vets Exposed To Nuclear Test Radiation?

Norman Grammel, 47, remembers the day in 1954 when he stood on the deck of the 600-man seaplane-tender U.S.S. Curtiss off the Bikini Atoll nuclear test site and watched with amazement the huge mushroom cloud that followed the detonation of a

hydrogen bomb. Today he thinks that event may be the reason he has less than two years to live. He is dying of bone cander. The Orlando veteran believes he was exposed to radiation generated by the nuclear tests. He also believes there are others like him in central Florida. "I can't believe I'm the only poor fool this has happened to," he

Neither can John Peters, Commander of the Sanford office of the Disabled American Veterans. Peters said he believes there may be a number of veterans in Seminole County who were present during nuclear tests and may

have been exposed to radiation. The long-term effects of that radiation can lead to cancer and other defects, medical "If anyone believes they may have been exposed, I would urge

them to contact our office," Peters said. If a veteran is able to establish a link between his exposure to radiation and cancer or other illness, he would be eligible for increased pension benefits from the Veterans Administration (VA) Peters said. The problem, however, is proving to the VA that the cancer is

"When I was first told I had cancer two years ago, the doctor asked if I had ever been exposed to radiation. I told him I had been

that his present skin cancer may be related to the day he flew at 9,000 feet over the Bikini blast.

"They tell me to prove I was there, and that I was exposed. It's been over 25 years. I don't remember the names of all the others I served with that day. I'd only been assigned there a few days before the test. When I tried to get some proof of my being there through my service record, they (the VA) told me those records "He wrote two letters to the VA saying that my illness shows all had been destroyed in a fire," he said.
