Search continues for terminally ill man

LONGWOOD - Police are searching for a 66year old Longwood man suffering from dementia and terminal cancer who has been missing since Wednesday.

Robert Robinson drove from his brother's home at 104 Timbercove Circle in the Sweet-water Oaks neighborhood of Longwood. Family members believe he might have headed to his stepdaughter's home in Jacksonville, the Semi-nole County Sheriff's Office said.

Warnell Robinson was taking a nap when his brother Robert Robinson took the car keys and drove away.

Robert Robinson was scheduled for a doctor's appointment at 1 p.m., and was going to be driven by his brother. Family and police contacted Robinson's doctor, but he had not seen Robinson.

The family reported Robert Robinson as missing at 2:13 p.m.
Robinson suffers from confusion and memory loss. He needs medications for pain relief, deputies said.

Robinson is a black male, 5'11", 155 pounds, with a mustache. He was possibly wearing a green and beige sweatsuit. The car is a four door light blue '92 Nissan Sentra with license tag 729 ABX.

School readiness bill passes senate

TALLAHASSEE - The Florida Senate unanimously voted to pass out School Readiness (CS/CS/SB 366&382&708) and made good on one of Senate President Toni Jennings top priorities. The Senate's bi-partisan school readiness bill will measure the preparedness level of Florida's children when they enter school, instead of waiting until the student cannot read, write or pass academic skills tests to know help is needed.

"Far too often, our youngest students struggle to learn the basics," said President Jennings. For students to have a quality learning experience, we must ensure they are ready to learn when the school bell rings. Florida's children are our future. The early years give them the base they will need for the rest of their lives."

Last year, 30,000 of Florida's youngest children were not prepared to enter school. That is nearly 20 percent of the state's youngest children that did not know basic colors and shapes or even have the skills to concentrate. With the Senate's school readiness bill, sponsored by Senate Education Committee members Anna Cowin, Betty Holzendorf and George Kirkpatrick, children ages one through four will be better prepared to learn when the school bell rings, Currently, Florida has three well-established and success-

ful early childhood programs that interface with educational development: pre-kindergarten. subsidized child care, and the federally-funded Head Start

program. While all three programs are important for the social and physical development of children, they are not coordinated into a readiness system that measures when a child is ready to enter school.

The Senate's readiness proposal will:

• focus on children ages one through four in a variety of early childhood service settings (i.e. day care, home care, prekindergarten or family care): · establish readiness meas-

· give communities flexibility on how to meet these measures through local readiness coali-

· create a single statewide governing board to direct start-

up of school readiness system.

This bill helps ensure our
youngest children are given opportunities that will nurture their minds, ready their bodies. enrich their spirit and prepare them to learn," said Senator Anna Cowin, R. of Leesburg. These are the tools children need to be successful students."

"Florida's school readiness program will make sure all children adhere to standards that will guarantee they are ready to learn when they enter school," said Senator Betty Holzendorf, D, of Jacksonville.



The bad news is that people who consume large amounts of alcohol each day are three times as likely as nondrinkers to suffer a stroke, a condition that takes 150,000 lives a

Binge drinkers are also at greater risk for having strokes, according to a study that appeared in the Journal of the American Medical

Although moderate drinking may be good for our health and even prevent strokes, there still are many who will never touch the stuff.

Usually gathering the whole family and friends together, the celebration is steeped in long tradition and customs. Leading up to the first night of Leading up to the first night of Passover, the home is cleaned and cleared of all yeast foods, called hametz. All hamets is either eaten or removed from the house before Passover

Only foods that are Kosher are allowed, which means no leavened foods or grains. In their place, matsoh is eaten to

commemorate the Israelites who fied quickly into the desert with no time for their bread to rise. They were forced to bake the dough into hard crackers in the desert

With its Passover dishware and silverware, the Seder table is different than the regular dinner table. The centerpiece is the Seder plate, a special plate containing the five foods that remind the Jewish faith of the struggle of the largesites to their becomes the Israelites in their journey to freedom. Three pieces of matson are placed in a matson cover and placed in

The plate contains foods that have special meanings for the holiday: haroseth represents the mortar the Jewish slaves used to Jewish slaves used to assemble the Pharaoh's bricks; paraley reminds of the tears of the Jewish slaves; roasted egg is a symbol of spring; shank bone is symbolic of the sacrificial lamb offering; and bitter herbs are for the bitter offiction of slavery. affliction of slavery.

Four glasses of wine are poured to represent the four stages of the exodus: freedom, deliverance, redemption and release. A fifth cup of wine is poured and placed on the Seder table representing the Cup of Elijah. During the Seder, the door is left open to invite the Prophet Elijah in.

After the meal is eaten, the children search for the Aftkomen. The Seder is finished when the children have found the Aftkomen and

everyone has eaten a piece.



Trying to keep lands accessible to public

SANFORD - The Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish (GFC) has struggled for years against the reality that it's expensive to keep hunting lands open to public access when Florida real estate is such a hot commodity. In some wildlife management areas (WMAs) landowners 50 cents per acre where the for public access rights, business and industry are willing to pay a lot more to put the land to other uses.

Florida's WMAs—the largest

public hunting lands system in the country--have lost valuable privately owned acreage in recent years. In fact, by 1997, some corporations that had leased hunting, fishing and other recreation access rights to the GFC for many years changed course in the direction of removing all their lands from

the public system.

Last year, when landowners of two of Florida's most prized wildlife management areas were on the verge of pulling their property out of the public hunting lands system, the GFC hunting lands system, the disc and two key Florida legislators teamed up to promote a new last-resort effort to combat the trend. Specifically, the effort required legislation to enable the GPC to pay landowners more for public hunting rights in areas where hunters were willing to not more for permits.

willing to pay more for permits. With the 28,000-acre Nassau WMA and the 52,000-acre Miami Corp, WMA on the line and another 750,000 acres of and another 750,000 acres of privately owned public hunting lands in jeopardy during the next couple of years, Rep. Janegale Boyd of Jefferson County and Sen. Charles Bronson of Brevard County. took up the cause by sponsoring bills to authorize the new "user pay program," whereby the GFC has authority to charge hunters more than the \$25 wildlife management area permit fee to hunt certain

Boyd's 10-county legislative district is the largest in any state east of the Mississippi state east of the Mississippi River, and it includes more privately owned public hunting lands than any other legislative district in Florida. Her constituents stand to lose enormous amounts of public recreational acreage within the next few years if landowners withdraw their lands in favor of private lesses. private leases.

However, the user-pay program has the potential to offer landowners more money for keeping their lands open to the public in addition to relieving landowners from legal liabilities associated with hunting.

"This was a win/win aituation to keep prime hunting, fishing and other recreational lands open to the public," Boyd said. "It provides an added incentive for landswners to allow public use of their properties." Hopefully, she said, owners of lands currently in the WMA system will be less inclined to withdraw them.

SHUPE'S SCOOP

Spring turkey hunters who hunt on private lands will enjoy longer shooting hours this year. Previously, game and fresh water fish

commission rules provided that shooting hours were from one-half hour before sunrise until 1 p.m. This year, hunters can continue hunting until sunset.







Signaling to success

Are you sitting comfortably? In the brain cruising like a well-oiled perpetual-metion machine? Excellent! For the next couple of weeks, let's look at defensive signaling.

defensive signaling.

The first signal in the pecking order is for attifude. Suppose partner leads the ace (or king) from ace-king. As the leader's partner, if you play an unnecessarily high card, you are encouraging him to continue that suit. However, if you play were leaved and ing him to continue that suit. However, if you play your lowest card, you are suggesting that he try elsewhere at trick two. Note that these signals are recommendations, not commands. Partner might know exactly what is required.

Here is an example of the attitude signal at trick one. West leads the spade ace (or king): four, two, five. Well, it's pecable East started with a


singleton, but that's unlikely. And if East had begun with a doubleton, he would have played his higher card, starting an echo. So, West can deduce his partner began with three (or four) species.

If South started with two spades, West can see three defensive tricks: two spades and one heart. The fourth will presumably have to come from either minor. Also, given North's tasty diamonds, a switch to the club seven — the high card to deny an honor — seems indicated, and defeats the con-

tract.

It looks simple enough, but in my experience meet Wests cannot resist the temptation to cash the spade king (or ace) at trick two. Yet this lots the contract make, declarer discarding his club loser on the established spade queen. Is South's spade loser going anywhere? No! Even if South has the doubleton ace-queen of diamonds, he has no quick entry to the doubleton.


