These germs come from per sons who have or have had the diseas-They are developed in the intestinal tracts and become available for distributioon from the excreta of such individuals. Plies alighting from such evacuations carry the germs on their feet and leave them upon food, to be taken into the digestive systems of other and new victims. It's hard to think of anything more disgusting.

"The germs increase rapidly in their new lodgings and the doctors soon have another case of typhoid and a new source of infection is started. Recent bacteriological investigations have shown that the conditions most favorable for the breeding of flies exist in the excreta of horses. The next most favorable are in the stools of human beings. Where such evacuations are from typhoid patients the maggot of the fly become infected with germs and remains threatgill its natural life a source of diager.

As a protection against the discus two principal precautions are to be observed, and safety demands that both shall be practiced with all the earnestness and care that a regard for the sacredness of human life itself can suggest.

First, keep all food from flies. Second, kill the fly, exterminate the race if such a thing were possible.

It is known that the fly is an extensive traveler. Experiments have proven that he often goes from four to eight city blocks under his own motive power, Aided by a favoring breeze he may go much further. In railroad trains or in other conveyances he may travel hundreds of miles. And the real danger lies in the fact that no one can tell where
