CLEVELAND, Apr. 8.—Ohio State University's 50-year-old swimming coach, Mike Peppe, is just a little fellow physically. He doesn't have to look up to anyone when it comes to turning out championship swimming teams. Since taking over as swim coach at Ohio State in 1939, Peppe's teams have won four Western Conference championships, four NCAA titles and seven AAU crowns. Three times, in 1943, 1946 and 1947, his teams completed grand slams by winning all three of those big events. In the last ten years, individuals coached by Peppe have won 119 titles, 35 in the Big Nine, 38 in the NCAA, 29 in the indoor-AAU and 17 in the Outdoor AAU.

The name of Harry Vardon is virtually forgotten now, except by oldtime followers of the game of golf. Yet, the British professional of the twenties is shown by the record books to have been one of the greatest golfers of all time. The records of Walter Hagen, Gene Sarazen and other golf immortals do not compare with that of Vardon. Only Bobby Jones can boast a record in national championship play that surpasses that of the British pro. Vardon won the British championship six times. Actually the railroads earned only 2 3/4% in 1946. To provide the service you want, railroads need to earn at least 6%. Our estimates indicate that even with the recent freight rate increase, the return for 1947 will be only about half that requirement.

Why it takes 6% to make the grade... Impartial research polls show that, on the average, people think we make 15%. They also think a fair return would be 10%. What We Make But for the year 1946, with the biggest peak-time traffic in history, the railroads earned only... 2 3/4%. This is less than one-half the comparable earnings for other industries. The reasons for this low return are not hard to find. Since 1939 railroad wages have increased 52 1/2% and the prices of fuel, materials and supplies have gone up 61 1/2%. But freight rates have just recently been increased an average of only 17 1/2%—a year after the effective date of the last big wage increase. What About This Year? It is estimated that the return for 1947, even with the recent freight rate increase, will be only about half the 6% minimum return required to provide the improvements and service needed. This will be because of increased costs of materials and supplies, because cur-
