

A clamor is being raised by some who have been vicnized. They want the culprits arrested and jailed. This is newhat like closing the proverbial harn door after the Mare has escaped.

The best defense against this type of rucket is sales restance. These men, who live by their wits, have a good The pitch. If Seminole residents refused to buy, however, for a living is out of the question for the men in question. They live off easily-earned cash obtained from "bargain hunters."

It is hard to understand why Seminole residents would give their money away. When they deal with strangers whose offices "are in their hip pockets," they are asking to be "taken to the cleaners."

Sanford has reputable merchants, who dispense about every type of merchandise that can be found on the market anywhere. Customers know where to find them today. More Important, they know where to find them tomorrow, When they give the public a sales talk, personally or through advertisements, the public can believe what a merchant says.

Many reputable businesses have salesmen who travel door-to-door. These salesmen are ilcensed and have credentials from their companies. Too, they have home addresses and telephone numbers, which they are happy to furnish to potential customers. It is the salesman who is unwilling to show a ilcense, has no credentials and gives "vague" answers about his business, home address and telephone that local residents should challenge.

Sanford merchants are not seeking the "quick dollar." They know that they must continue to serve each customer. Therefore, the customer will get this money's worth.

Contrast this with the "fly-by-night" salesman. We belive the contrast will put him out of business in Seminole






