A Good Investment

"In good times and bad, in doubtful times and boom times there is just one real wealth and that is, well selected real estate," says Arthur Brisbane.

"When you ask yourself, 'What shall I buy?' ask yourself also 'What will remain firm and solid, no matter what happens?'"

"The answer is, the ground beneath your feet. Everything that men do must be done on the earth—apart from flying and going to heaven when we finish here.

"Goods must be bought and sold, factories built, hotels and apartments raised on the earth's surface.

"You can't hang them suspended in the air. They must all be on the ground. And he who owns the ground, his part of it well chosen, owns best and safest wealth."

NUMBERS

ST. PETERSBURG INDEPENDENT

Here and in Tampa it is called "bolita," in New Orleans, "dixie," in Havana, "papas" under the simple title of "numbers game."

Everywhere it is the same crazy, money, a daily gamble on numbers. In New York it has become such a racket that officials are frankly bewildered in efforts to discover some effective means of control. In the recent case against "Dixie" Shultz, his own agents estimated the annual "take" at more than \$100,000,000.

Six murders have been blamed on the warfare of gang leaders who control this gigantic illicit industry.

Their City will be interested to know that the daily lottery in Harlem was introduced 40 years ago by a Spaniard named Jose Marsalino. At first, the lucky numbers were determined by the New York Stock Exchange, then of the Federal Reserve bank. The last three digits of the total determined the winning number each day.

Some Marsalino found Harlem in a very receptive mood. In a short time the black belt was full of "policy" kings and queens who grew rich. The business proved so lucrative, indeed, that the regular racketeers began to take it over, and funerals were arranged for policy kings who were reluctant to abdicate. Paul Harrison, New York columnist, tells the story:

"For awhile the supreme ruler of the Harlem racket was a West Indian negro named Casper Holstein, a dark, dapper man whose gentle voice would fool you. Now, sensible Casper Holstein is alive today, and playing poker at his Park Hotel, because he did not argue with Mr. Dutch Schultz and Mr. Schultz's machine gunners when they dropped around to suggest that he take a vacation. That was in 1931.

"By that time, something like a hundred thousand Harlemers were playing 'numbers' regularly, and the profits to Mr. Schultz counted.

ing his bookkeeping books, ticket-sellers' commissions and bribery expenses—were estimated at something like \$25,000 a day. Police tried ineffectually to curb the racket, as they had tried many times before. Harlem became more than usually impoverished; people couldn't pay the weekly installment collectors for insurance companies and burial societies.

"The insurance companies went into a huddle and conceived an idea for wiping out the numbers game. They persuaded the newspapers not to print the bank drawings from which the lucky numbers had been obtained. That stopped the policy operators for exactly 24 hours. They resumed business with the understanding that the winning number each day would be the three digits in the left of the digit in the total price paid by the participants on the third, fifth and seventh days at certain tracks.

"And if the newspaper refused to print the numbers, it was to be understood that there were plenty of alternatives—such as the hourly temperatures in New York City, or the final digits in total numbers printed in three pre-determined columns of the daily New York Times."

Earthquake Bares Rich Treasure In Honduran District

1700 Year Old Mayan Civilization Now On View At Copan

PEGUIGALPA, Honduras, Mar. 18.—(AP)—Recent earthquakes which caused widespread destruction and loss of life in the Copan district of Honduras have given archaeologists new treasures of 1,700-year-old Mayan civilization.

Constant Stromovik, head of an archaeological commission now working in the area, announced findings opened by the earth tremors had laid bare stone staircases leading to vast subterranean galleries.

The commission which Stromovik heads is working under auspices of the Carnegie Institution of Washington.

The archaeologist said the relics disclosed by nature's phenomenon indicate Copan is the most important center of ancient Maya civilization yet found.

Gold statues and utensils inspected in a preliminary survey of the underground chambers show the ancient craftsmen possessed a skill in metal working hitherto unsuspected.

The discoveries, Stromovik said, exhibited to the world, with proof of inestimable and start.

He told of a pair of boots miraculously wrought of solid gold which lay beneath a warrior's statue of heroic size. Floors of the extensive cross-shaped rooms and amphitheaters, he said, were surprisingly well preserved beneath coverings of scarlet paint.

Stone canals and an intricate sewerage system connecting various sections of the galleries were among other marvels Stromovik described.

Abysinia Seeks Aid Of League In Africa

GENEVA, Mar. 18.—Abysinia yesterday presented a note to the League of Nations reportedly asking the League council to intervene in the Italian-Abysinian dispute growing out of border clashes in Northeast Africa.

The Abysinian note is reported to say that direct negotiations with Italy have failed and therefore asks the council to act on Addis Ababa's appeal filed last January. The council suspended action then, pending outbreak of blood.
