PENNSY RAILWAY PREDICTS HEAVY FLORIDA TRAFFIC

Survey Reveals Present Season Will Be Heaviest In History

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 18.—After a careful survey throughout the territory served by the Pennsylvania Railroad, it is predicted that the passenger movement between northern cities and Florida winter resorts, during the season now opening, will be one of the heaviest in the history of this business.

Tangible evidence in this effect is found in the fact that reservations for Pullman space already made with the railroad in New York, Chicago, Philadelphia and other important northern centers considerably outnumber those on hand this time last year and requests for accommodation are steadily increasing. Private car movements to Florida already scheduled also are running ahead of last season.

Anticipating a heavy passenger movement the railroad has arranged new and faster train services for southern travelers this year. Several new flyers, embodying the very latest features of luxurious transportation, will be added to the fleet of fast southward-bound trains, which in the summer time of many of the through express trains will be materially shortened. Of special interest will be the assignment of a number of new cars to the through Florida trails, with many improved features of convenience and service.

The "Miamiian" and the "Gulf Coast Limited," which are scheduled this season to leave New York at 9:40 A. M., arriving Tampa 3:30 P. M., St. Petersburg 4:45 P. M., and Miami 6 P. M., the following day, will have 10 minutes out from these running 4 miles to Miami, 25 minutes from Tampa, one and 25 minutes from the St. Peterberg station. For the first time in the history of Florida winter travel, arrangements have been made to operate an additional section of these trains during the height of the season to accommodate the increased travel expected. The extra section has been regularly scheduled and will appear on the timetable.

The "Florida Special," which will leave New York at 7:50 P. M. and arrive at Miami 7:50 A. M. the second day, will also operate its schedule, making the trip in 30 minutes less time than last year.

The "Everglades," which heretofore has operated from New England points to the South, will this year also carry cars from New York and Philadelphia, arriving there at 10:30 A. M. and leaving Florida at 10:30 A. M. the second day.

VISITORS ARRIVE IN CLEWISTON TO SEE SUGAR MILLS

Motorcades To Little Okeechobee Town Becoming Popular

CLEWISTON, Jan. 22.—Clewiston, capital city in Florida's sugar belt, will see more winter visitors this year than ever before in its history, according to the number of people coming from all sections of Florida to see the new 1,000-ton-a-day mill of the Southern Sugar Company which was started on its 1930 grinding season a few weeks ago.

Two motorcades from the East Coast during the past week brought the total number of visitors to the mill to more than 2,000 to date and the second motorcade, which came from West Palm Beach on a Sugar Belt tour, included more than 200 cars and two buses, bringing more than 100 people to this community on the southern shore of Lake Okeechobee.

With the mill in operation, it is possible for visitors to see the 200-ft. railroad engine cars dumped into the cane pit at one end of the factory and follow the sugar-making process through the crushing and boiling until the sugar is separated from the molasses and the latter weighed, bagged and loaded into the waiting box cars for shipment to the refineries in Georgia.

It is estimated that more than 10,000 Floridians and winter visitors in the state will make the trip during the next three months to see in operation the latest sugarcane factory in the United States.

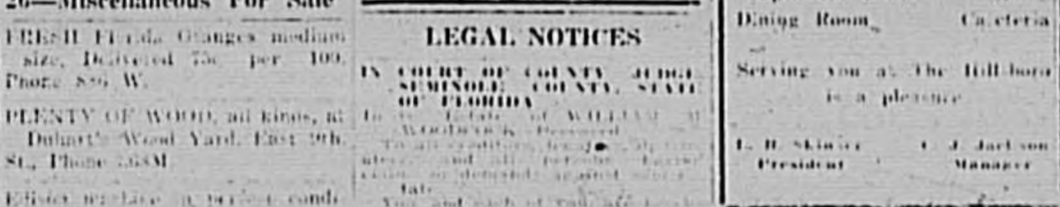
