subject, particularly when both movie and television producers are rethinking the issue in light of the recent furor?

"Violence is not really the subject." Bogdanovich objects. "And this idea that violence in films is dangerous to our morals is inaccurate," he added, cautioning that he was speaking only of movies, not television.

"Boredom causes a good deal of violence. Lethargy. I don't think people go around imitiating the violence they see in movies. Oh, maybe one in a million. But life doesn't imitate art. Vice versa. The sniper events happened, And I made a film

"Violence for its own sake is bad because it's bad art-not because it's bad morally," says Bogdanovich.

What the young film-maker gets" is contrast the old kind of movie horror represented by Karloff with the modern horror of random violence, the senseless shoting, Karloff, now past 80, has been frightening fans since his classic portrayal of "Frankenstein" in 1931.

"But Karloff as a 'heavy' today is dull, tedious, almost silly." says Bogdanovich. "He's really rather a sweet old man. Even kids are finding these 'monsters' sweet and cutc. Look

at the Munsters. "Boris is a symbol of movie horror, the old Victorian type.

It has become a joke." What better idea than to have Karloff portray an aging movie actor long-famous for his horror roies who finds he is no longer taken seriously. They contrast this "back-alley" type of ho. Tor with the real horror of violence in broad daylight, in common

Bogdanovich said he was intrigued by this seemingly random violence, the senseless shootings with no motivation, neither political, nor racial, nor

So, with Karloff for a start. Bogdanovich added a gun-happy young boy, played by newcomer Tim O'Relly, and shot the film on locations in California-with scenes involving sniping at passersby from atop an oil tank overlooking the San Diego Freeway and from a drive-in movie screen tower.

If it sounds a good deal like the Austin tower snipings of two years ago. Bogdanovich readily admits he had that specific incident very much in mind when making "Targets." The real shootings took place August 1966; Bogdanovich started shooting his film in March 1967.
