

# County Could Be Sued On'illegal' Impact Fees

County Atty, Thomas Freeman said today the county is in eopardy of being sued if county commissioners don't bite the

pullet and halt collection of impact fees. "I recommend that the county commission adopt a valid rdinance to collect the fees - or stop collecting the fees,"

He went on to say an ordinance is needed "so that we will ot be held legally responsible for illegal collections." County Commissioner John Kimbrough said last week that reeman wants the fee system halted because the county atorney promised developers in 1974 that collection of impact fees

"John Kimbrough will continue to lie about the legality, but you ask 25 attorneys and you'll get the same answer — collection of impact fees is illegal," Freeman said. "The Robin Hood theory is illegal... to take something from the rich you first have to have a valid ordinance," Freeman

In response to Kimbrough's charges that politics is the real reason behind Freeman's ruling, the county attorney really took

Freeman accused Kimbrough of using Joe McCarthy-like tactics by clouding the issue with statements and half-truths in an effort to hide the fact that Freeman, as county attorney, officially ruled last Tuesday that collection of the \$310 per unit

"John not only looks like Joe McCarthy; he is beginning to sound like him," Freeman said. Kimbrough said Freeman in 1974 promised a halt to impact

fees. In return, Kimbrough said the money previously collected would be freed for use in political campaigns. On Friday Kimbrough said, "Freeman has got the pressure on him to produce. Now it's coming to the wire, and Freeman is being told, 'you'd better start making some noises; it's on the

Freeman denied any campaign promises were made by him

"The only campaign promise I know of in 1974 was the \$2,000 promise Kimbrough made to the Rumberger law firm,"

The county attorney charged that Kimbrough promised to keep former county attorney Howard Marsee of Pitts, Eubanks. Ross & Rumberger in as county attorney in return for a \$2,000 contribution to Kimbrough's 1974 campaign for the county More than a year ago, however, Marsee was ousted by the

In his ruling, Freeman refers to a recent Florida Supreme Court decision. In that ruling, the court said that impact fees can be collected, but it must be done by ordinance. Freeman says fees collected must be applied solely to expansion of new facilities, and secondly, the funds must be

Shortening Firm Expands To New Plant Without those criteria, an ordinance "will be struck down,"

At issue is about \$250,000 already collected and some \$5million on the books for future collection.

Kimbrough claims that the Freeman ruling is an attempt to 'gag'' him. The commissioner says he refuses to back down. He also says that if developers don't pay the fee, homeowners will. But Freeman said his ruling applies solely to the \$310-per mit fee, not to "voluntary contributions" such as school sites roads and other contribution given the county by builders.

Though Kimbrough said he predicted in his 1974 campaign hat Freeman would seek to halt collection fees, Freeman says that was easy to predict because former county attorney Marsee already had ruled the county could not legally collect

Also, Freeman says Florida Auditor General Ernest Ellison has recommended the county halt its present policy.

**FBI Harassment Victims** May Receive Notices

WASHINGTON (AP) - Atty. Gen. Edward H. Levi may soon instruct Justice Department officials to notify perhaps thousands of Americans that they were victims of the FBI's harassment campaign, according to knowledgeable department sources.

"I think the attorney general is looking very favorably on the plan," a ranking official said in response t questions Monday.

Levi expects to receive written recommendations this week from officials developing the plan. The FBI conducted 12 counterintelligence programs, known as Cointelpro, at various times between 1956 and 1971 to harass and disrupt militant political groups on the left and right.

### Ford Backs Aid Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) - While Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger pitched for congressional approval of \$1 billion in military aid to Turkey, President Ford used a Pentagon backdrop to warn Democrats he will veto the defense appropriation bill if they try to cut it.

Both got a mixed reaction. Kissinger told the House International Relations Committee that failure to approve the four-year aid accord he signed last week would cause "irremediable damage to U.S. Turbish relations." The accord provides for the reopening of 26 U.S. bases closed by Turkey last July in retaliation for a congressional arms embargo.

But Kissinger acknowledged that the accord, which will reopen bases used to monitor activities inside the Soviet Union, was not linked to settlement of the Greek-Turkish dispute over Cyprus. It was the Turkish invasion of Cyprus with the use of American-supplied weapons that led Congress to impose the Turkish embargo.

WASHINGTON (AP) - For Ronald Reagan, the first four days of May loom as crucial ones, with a set of presidential primary elections his managers believe will make or break his campaign for the White House. First, Reagan plans an effort to define in his own terms the issues of the campaign for the Republican nomination.

The families headed by a person who is 65 or over have a median income of \$7,298 per year, compared with the national median of nearly \$13,000. And the

majority of the 1.3 million persons who sank into the poverty ranks last year are senior citizens. Apply what amounts to an affirmative action program to assure senior citizens a few more jobs and even a \$1.7 billion dollar housing subsidy are but drops in the bucket.

Congress apparently realizes as much. Even as the Older Citizens Act was being debated, a Senate Special Committee on Aging began conducting a broad and deep national study to get at the roots of the special problems faced by elderly people who are more ravaged then most by an inadequate income, lack of ob opportunities, inordinate medical costs and an unconcerned

Preliminary information dribbling from the Senate committee, which is due to issue its report next month, is not encouraging. The group apparently is sticking to familiar turf with such recommendations as transferring the Social Security program from the Department of Health, Education and Weifare to a special agency, and raising the salary base on which Social Security taxes are paid to as much as \$25,000.

The sad fact is that no amount of tinkering with the Social Security program is likely to solve the financial problems of retired persons, because the tax will become counter-productive long before it is large enough to make a significant contribution to the problems of the elderly.

By the same token, federal subsidies across the spectrum of problems is not the economic or philosophical answer. If the entire federal budget were divided among the nation's 23 million poor, each would receive only about \$16,000, and this is a patent
