## 'Amateurs' Make Drug Control Hard

An unprecedented cocaine rush is on South America.

Due to a U.S. - European crackdown on the traditional trans-Atlantic heroin routes from France and Spain via Latin America, an increasing number of narcotics smugglers are switching drugs and moving into the cocaine traffic. Not only is there an unlimited supply of coca leaves practicaly on the U.S. doorstep, but there also is less possibility of getting caught.

The curent free-for-all, narcotics agents claim, is much more difficult to control than half a dozen heroin gangs.

Cocaine is fast reaching the fashionable smartness once attached to pot.

The result is that demand is on the increase in Italy, West Germany and France, as well as in the United States. For example, the street value of one pound of cocaine on the East Coast is \$6,800 today versus \$4,500 six months ago.

The Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs (BNDD) has had phenomenal success in stemming the heroin flow since setting up a string of Latin American bureaus early last year. Some of the biggest heroin smugglers, including Marseille's infamous Auguste Joseph Ricord, are behind bars, and U.S. heroin pushers report a dwindling supply Formerly the chief Latin American trans-

shipment point for northbound heroin, Buenos Aires has grown so hot that most of the heroin operators have fled to Uruguay, Brazil and Chile. However, they are not expected to linger long in those countries due to the mounting

The success of the heroin hunt is due primarily to the painstaking homework of U.S. and European agents.



Speculative Fever

## Gold Clouds Monetary Issue

The European gold markets are a mystery to most Americans. For 40 years private buying and selling of gold has been forbidden by law in this country. There is a bill in Congress to remove that prohibition, but if the speculative fever which has been sweeping European gold markets is what the bill would introduce, we are better off without it.

Europe's gold fever is said to portend a new "dollar crisis," but we are not convinced. If anything there is a gold crisis. There is a shortage of it. As is the case with oil, the price is going up. When speculators began cashing in dollars to buy gold, it drove the gold price upward even faster and depressed the value of dollars on currency markets. When the gold price reached dizzying heights — \$124.13 an ounce in Paris — the same speculators began dumping it to put their wealth back into the dollars which their own manipulations had cheapened. Presumably they are now prepared to take another profit as the dollar regains its strength, which it undoubtedly will.

This kind of gambling with dollars and gold distorts true values on currency markets and creates artifical pressures on bankers and businessmen. What Europe needs is not Las Vegas croupiers, but more realistic trade and monetary policies. Rather than repeal our own law against private trading in gold, we might better be encouraging European countries to consider similar restraints.

The lure of speculation in gold and foreign currencies is believed to have played a part in a sharp upward turn in the U.S. balance of payments deficit during the first three months of this year. Dollars were going aboard at the highest rate in nearly two years, even though our balance of trade was improving, industrial production was surging ahead and other economic statistics pointed to continued strengthening

Gold speculation drew attention away from a recent meeting in Brussels of the executive commission of the European Common Market. It was there where some of the real problems of the dollar were on the line. France, for instance, was still insisting that Europe be closed to import of U.S. farm products, closing off a major avenue of opportunity for improving our trade balance. The Common Market obviously has not made up its mind whether it will surrender to protectionism in its trade policies, or make concessions necessary to keep the flow of trade and currency in better balance.

The world's economic problems continually point to the need for more freedom and flexibility in the commercial relations between nations - a development we can hope for in the round of trade talks to begin in September. With the backing of the trade bill now before Congre President Nixon can hope to enter those negotiations speaking for a strong, productive American economy. Gold speculators notwithstanding, it is that economy which will continue to give meaningful value to the U.S. dollar.

**Effecting Repairs** On Dinette Chairs

To solve this I used heavy thread the same color as the plastic and sewed through it, over and over, with the stitches close enough together to cover the cording. I then used white glue to paint the thread. This was done two years ago and they are still in good condition. Being the same color as the cording, this is scarcely noticeable.-JAN

# Blackburn, Tampa Robber Charged In Lee Death Try

A convicted robber from Tampa with reported Mafia connections and convicted Central Florida Crime Czar Harlan "The Colonel" Blackburn have been charged with two 1971 assasination attempts on Clyde Lee, Blackburn's one-time bolita lieutenant.

The asthmatic 37-year-old nephew of Tampa underworld figure Santo Trafficante, authorities said, remained in Seminole County jail this morning under \$100,000 bond on charges of




