Lockheed Brass May Resign; **Boeing Now Probe Target**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Even as the waves from an international bribery scandal involving Lockheed Aircraft spread across the globe, the government has disclosed it is investigating whether the Boeing Co. engaged in similar activities.

The Securities and Exchange Commission said Thursday it has received information that Boeing "may have made illegal payments to certain foreign government officials in connection with Boeing's foreign operations." A spokesman for Boeing said in Seattle that the company denies any wrongdoing either in this country or

Lockheed's board of directors scheduled a meeting today in Los Angeles for discussion of disclosures of international payoffs by the firm. There were reports that two top company executives would resign.

'Sloganeering' Criticized

WASHINGTON (AP) - Secretary of State Henry ! Kissinger says Ronald Reagan and other presidential candidates are tampering with world peace by reducing the discussion of sensitive foreign policy issues to "partisan sloganeering."

Kissinger was asked Thursday at a news conference about a Reagan charge that detente has been a big plus for the Soviet Union, while benefits to the United States have been limited to "the right to sell Pepsi-Cola in

Without mentioning Reagan by name, Kissinger said the relationship between the United States, the Soviet Union and China is "too delicate, too important for world peace to be used for simply partisan sloganeering."

Advice On Marijuana

WASHINGTON (AP) - Don't fret about their health if your teen-agers are experimenting with marijuana. The majority of them are these days and it's safer than booze or cigarettes, says Dr. Robert L. DuPont of the National Institute on Drug Abuse.

DuPont confesses he smoked pot himself when he was ounger and didn't know better. Not that DuPont, a physician, is a marijuana advocate. Quite the contrary, he told newsmen Thursday. "If it was up to me I would stop use of all of these drugs (marijuana, alcohol and tobacco) at the wave of my hand," he said.

Strategic Benguela Railroad Seized By Leftist Angolans

By The Associated Press Soviet-supported Angolan and Cuban forces have completed their conquest of the strategic Benguela Railroad across central Angola and pushed their advance to within 30 miles of the southern border of the southwest African country, reports from Luanda said today. Leaders of the Western-backed National Union (UNITA) repeated a call for guerrilla war against the victorious Popular Movement (MPLA).

The Soviet news agency Tass reported from Luanda. the MPLA capital, that the town of Luso, in east central Angola, fell to the MPLA after heavy fighting and that considerable amounts of equipment and armaments were

Tass said the capture of Luso gave the MPLA fu control of the 1,000-mile railroad that spans Angola from the ports of Benguela and Lobito to the Zaire border. The report said the railroad is being repaired.

Chinese Officials May Shift

TOKYO (AP) - Acting Chinese Premier Hua Kuofeng's two chief rivals - First Vice Premier Teng Hsiaoping and Second Vice Premier Chang Chun-chiao - are expected to be given commanding positions in the Communist party and withdrawn from government administration, the Peking correspondent of the Kyodo news agency reported today.

The Japanese news agency's report said Hua was named acting premier by the 16-member party politburo, but the 149-member party central committee had not met yet to confirm or reject the appointment.

The tone of President Ford's economic report to Congress was optimistic, but the substance was only mildly reassuring True, 1975 brought a significant gain in curbing

nflation, which dropped from the 12 per cent rate of 1974 to a more respectable 7 per cent. economy is on the "upward path" claimed by Mr.

But the President conceded that the road to full economic recovery is long and steep.

It may also be dotted with congressional pitfalls. The taxing and spending policies outlined earlier by the President and upon which he has based his projections have not yet won the er dorsement of House and Senate.

A balky Congress, impatient with continued high unemployment, may reject the spending limits of Mr. Ford's proposed \$394.2 budget in an effort to stimulate creation of new jobs or t

As the President pointed out, such stimulants risk refueling of inflation, but some lawmakers believe the gamble is warranted in the face of unemployment figures still hovering at the 8 per

Neither is there any certainty that Congress envisioned by Mr. Ford to give Americans more money to spend on consumer items. Nor is it likely that the President will find Congress receptive to this proposals to give tax breaks to business to encourage new plant construction and new jobs.

It is difficult to reconcile the President's assumption that the public will have more spendable money with his acknowledgement that inflation will remain - even under the most favorable estimates - at about 6 per cent by the

And his lure of a major tax cut in 1979 is not only remote, but highly uncertain with more immediate matters still unresolved.

Mr. Ford can be excused for boasting the resiliency of the economic system, which has withstood severe strain. Few will quarrel with his goals of reduced government spending and reduced

But the faint signals of economic gains must be nurtured carefully if the system is to maintain its direction along the upward path.

Troubles Dim Flame

The opening of the 1976 winter Olympics at Innsbruck found much of the world holding its breath. The anxiety was not so much over who is going to win but over the fate of the games themselves as an international institution.

As it is, police and soldiers assigned to provide security at the Olympic Village in the Tyrolean Alps outnumbered the athletes by about five to one. The tragedy which befell Israeli athletes at the hands of Palesinian terrorists at Munich in 1972 hangs like a cloud over a scene that is supposed to symbolize the opportunity for sports to create good will between the nations of

No amount of police protection can deal with other problems that have risen to mar the spirit of the Olympics. The divergence between nations on what constitutes amateur and professional status of athletes remains unresolved, and only time will tell whether judges and referees in 1976 will be more capable of delivering unprejudiced decisions than they were in

The summer games may begin July in an incomplete stadium in Montreal, with Canadian taxpayers faced with underwriting the deficit in a budget that originally was fixed at \$310 million but has spiraled to more than \$1 billion.

No matter how much sportsmanship individual athletes bring to the adverse games, the winds of politics and economics are in danger of snuffing out the Olympic flame. If 1976 does not see a change in the weather, the outlook for the games in 1980

# Soaring: A Natural High

eful up there you wouldn't believe it But the 20 Lake Brantley High School students and one normally earthbound reporter who took their first glider flight last weekend got much too excited to simply sit back and enjoy the silence.

It was a bad day for gliding, cold, windy and cloudless. Gliding in Central Florida - where there are no mountains - depends on thermals, wind currents created by the sun's uneven heating of the earth. Lakes and woodlands absorb heat, while open fields and sandy stretches reflect it - and a glider can soar up into the

On a good day, you can glide for hours. The world's record for staying aloft is 56 hours and an eight-hour flight is nothing unusual. But last Sunday, the longest ride lasted a little less than 20 minutes. But 20 minutes is more than long enough for the

normally earthbound reporter. The climb up - at the end of a tow chain pulled by a conventional powered aircraft - is long and steep. The winds bounce you around and the other plane's bouncing is transmitted down the tow chain to multiply the effects. The two-man glider, a lightweight plane designed to float on the slightest wind, seems dangerously fragile. But then the spinning dial reaches 2,000 feet and you pull a knob, releasing the tow chain, and soar peacefully

along, high above the earth. It's almost eerie. There are no engine noises, no throbbing motor underneath your feet to reassure you that, yes, there is something keeping you up here, 2,000 feet above the ground. You're just gliding, silently. Acres of forest slide past. You can see Oviedo, Lake

This morning he stays on the ground, taking pictures, answering questions, joking with the young flyers. The atmosphere on the gound is very much like waiting in line for a particularly wild roller coaster ride. But the glider beats any roller coaster on earth. The slow, wide circles thousands of feet above the ground, looking down on houses and trees and cars reduced to the size of toys, is absolutely breathtaking - and the natural fear of flying puts an edge of excitement onto it.

And it's naturally real - soaring just like a bird, on wings and air currents and, for those of us who don't understand the scientific reasons why the glider won't suddenly crash to earth, a prayer. The glider is more like a bird than a powered airplane, even though it's built of aluminum, for it simply skims across the treetops on a breath of wind. The reality


