

S. Vessel Retained By Japan's Navy

Officials Think Crew

YOKOHAMA, Feb. 22.—(A.P.)—A Japanese navy today retained the American tanker Kellough, which was being examined Saturday to determine if it is guilty of espionage at the fortresses at the mouth of Tokyo bay.

The tanker, although owned by a Japanese company, was chartered to the U. S. Navy from Yokohama toward its tanks half full of oil from California. It was expected to float in the next high tide, but the ship had spent the night in the fortresses, the Navy officials were reported to have ordered the skipper to be taken off the vessel in order to allow the Navy's investigators to examine the ship and determine whether the ground was intentional.

Soviet Press Sees Germany Planning, Hungry For War

Nazi Fascism Held Moving Toward Conflict
In Central Europe, Later With Russians

MOSCOW, Feb. 22.—(A.P.)—Official organs of soviet opinion upbraided Germany yesterday with accusation of plans for aggression in both eastern and central Europe.

On the heels of the approval of the London agreements extended by Max Baer, commissar for foreign affairs, on the condition they are made effective in their entirety, the authoritative press pictured the Nazis as hungry for war under the disguise of "diplomatic chattering."

General display was given charges by the Czechoslovakian newspaper Narodni Politika that Japan, Germany and Poland were preparing for war against the soviet union. The influential Pravda and Izvestia, however, concentrated their attacks on Germany with incidental jibes at England.

"German fascism," said Pravda, "is getting ready to occupy east and central Europe in order to prepare for war on the western front. That is why it is against the eastern pact and mutual assistance."

"Further, it is trying with English help to destroy Franco-Soviet co-operation. The English bourgeoisie must take into account that the mass of English toilers does not want war and does not approve of encouraging the adventurist plans of German fascism."

"The Germans are maneuvering," said Izvestia, "to avoid all except the air pact in order to leave their hands unpledged in the east, and even the British press is now compelled to realize this."

"It is necessary to look the facts in the face to prevent their springing war, from passing words to action."

"The situation is very tense; Europe demand decisive measures."

Soviet Russia has lined up with France and Great Britain in an effort to obtain from Germany unconditional adherence to principals of the London agreements.

Bardo Lashes Out At Artificiality Of Present Plans

Manufacturer Sees
Government Interference
As Ruinous

TAMPA, Feb. 22.—The federal government cannot possibly regulate industry as well as the industrialists and to supplant individual initiative with political control means economic ruin, C. L. Bardo, of New York, president of the National Association of Manufacturers, said yesterday in an address at the Hillsborough Hotel.

Speaking on the subject, "American Industry's Plan for Industrial Recovery," at a meeting sponsored by the Associated Industries of Florida and the industrial committee of the chamber of commerce, Mr. Bardo asserted that artificial measures would never result in a permanent recovery from the depression.

"We are paying too high a price for industrial stimulation," he said, "and we will never make any real progress until we have devised ways and means of bringing about a more normal recovery. Not even another \$1,000,000,000 appropriation is going to do it."

England Proposes Steps Leading To European Security

LONDON, Feb. 22.—(A.P.)—Great Britain today opened negotiations directly with Russia, Germany and Italy to determine the next step to be taken for the general settlement of the issues of European security and armament.

It was understood that England and France had come to an agreement on what course to pursue in view of recent notes from Germany and Russia.

In these notes Germany said she needed a certain protection in view of Russian power and Russia insisted that Germany should agree to the proposed European Security Pact in its entirety.

Schunigg Heavily Guarded In France

PARIS, Feb. 22.—(A.P.)—France made clear last night that Chancellor Kurt Schunigg of Austria, arriving to confer with French statesmen, should meet no such fate as that of the late King Alexander of Yugoslavia.

In sharp contrast to the noisy and pompous that attended Alexander's arrival at Marseille that fatal day last October, Schunigg and his foreign minister were escorted to the train at Nancy, 10 miles from the capital, and smuggled into Paris by automobile.

As police arrested 800 individuals and communists at the east station where Schunigg was expected to arrive, Premier Laval and Foreign Minister Laval were greeting the visitors at the station of Nancy.

Hitler Orders Conscription Of All Money

German's Cash Will
Be Used To Buy Up
Raw Materials And
Consolidate Debts

BERLIN, Feb. 22.—(A.P.)—Adolf Hitler conscripted the nation's cash yesterday to buy raw materials and consolidate debts.

In one of the shortest laws passed by the Nazi government, the hunt for liquid assets was begun and will spare none upon whom the reichminister of finance wishes to call for money.

Lutz Schwerin von Krosigk, the finance chief, was given wide powers to seize funds through equities, and is limited only by the fuhrer's personal estimate of the extent to which he should strip liquid assets from those who have them.

Von Krosigk may go to banks and demand loans. He may go to private firms and individuals and insist upon their parting with such cash reserves as are not absolutely essential to their well-being.

Though official sources were silent on this point, there was a widespread belief in financial circles that the government may to a certain extent call upon Germans who still have bank accounts and securities abroad to make this contribution.

Rebellious Democrats Were Complaining About Procedures

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22.—The fires of rebellion among House Democrats over patronage matters were quenched last night with President Roosevelt agreeing to take a personal hand in the dispute.

Representative Sabath, Democrat, Illinois, a member of a House Democratic caucus the President had expressed his willingness to intervene.

The rebellious Democrats had two complaints:

1. That too many good federal jobs were being given to Republicans.
2. That bureau chiefs and assistants were discourteous to congressmen.

Sabath reported to the caucus that the President would appoint a man in each government department to take care of congressional requests. He would, in effect, be the contact man between the department and Capitol Hill. This is intended to remove the present bad feeling that exists.

On the second issue—how far deserving Democrats—however, Sabath indicated Roosevelt had announced his previously determined stand that the best men would be appointed to federal jobs regardless of their political affiliations.

Andrews Spans Nation To-Set New Record

NEW YORK, Feb. 22.—(A.P.)—In an unbroken dash across the continent, Lt. Andrew Andrews yesterday set a new transport record from Los Angeles to Floyd Bennett field.

The former record was held by Andrews' brother-in-law, the famous James Doolittle.

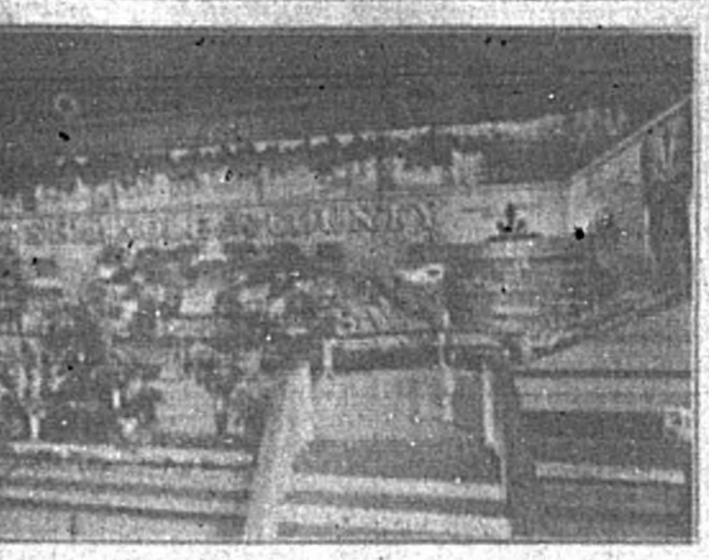
In a single sustained monoplane, Andrews made the West-East transcontinental flight in 11 hours, 34 minutes and 18 seconds.

Treasury Reports Large Increase In U.S. Tax Income

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22.—(A.P.)—While tallying up with one hand a \$333,394,104 increase in several months in its tax income over a corresponding period in the last fiscal year, the treasury yesterday drafted with the other a new device for its borrowing system.

The monthly statement by the Bureau of Internal Revenue disclosed the January collections at \$1,995,656,565, in comparison with \$1,824,924 in January, 1934. This brought the fiscal year's total to \$2,781,844,978, an amount \$1,507,740,476 over last January, while the cumulative figure showed an improvement of \$116,213,250 in January over the same month of last year.

Taking advantage of easy money market conditions, Secretary Morgenthau, announced that nine month bills would be added to the financing program of the government. Hereafter, the treasury will issue weekly \$30,000,000 of 273 day bills, to be sold on a discount basis to the highest bidder, in addition to a similar amount of 181 day bills under the new program will be sold Feb. 27.

"It is a move to obtain money for the government at a lower rate of interest," he said.

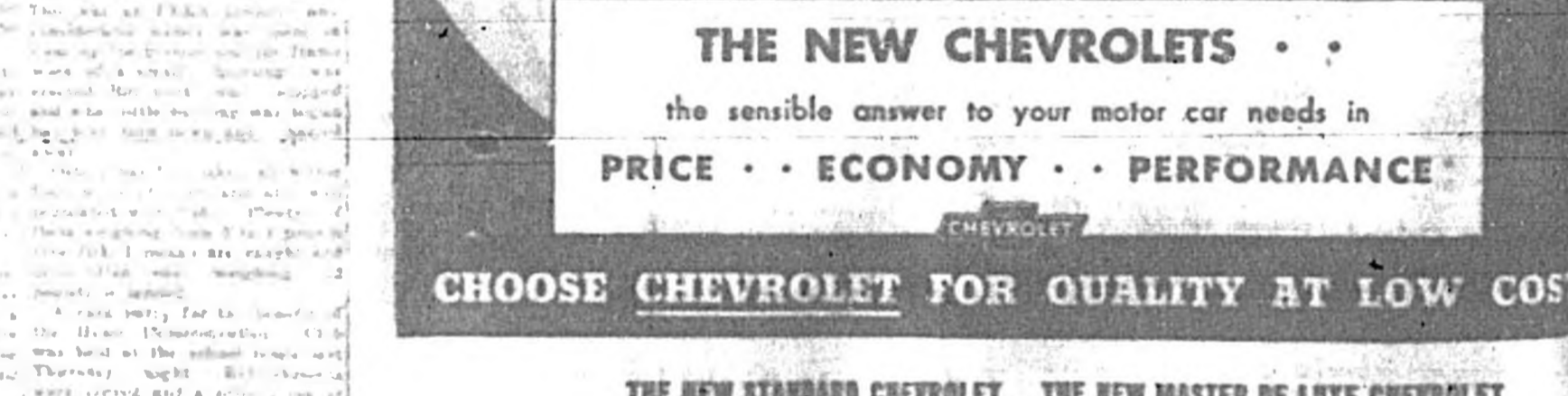

...of the monthly. The close vote reflected the bitterest surrounding the giant appropriations measure which was debated 18 days in the Senate appropriations committee before it was reported to the floor. It passed the House under one of the most strictly depressed branches of American enterprise.

The one-vote margin was a stinging defeat for President Roosevelt and a tremendous triumph for organized labor whose leaders threw their full strength into the fight.

Twenty-one Democrats deserted the White House to join with 21 one farmer-laborite in favor of the amendment. Only two Republicans—Metcalf, Rhode Island, and Hale, Maine—voted with 41 Democrats against the measure. Senators Fletcher and Transwell of Florida voted against the amendment.

Labor's victory, however, may be short-lived. The Administration will make an attempt to eliminate the proposal when the measure is passed and sent to conference with the House.

The amended amendment, now offered by Senator McCarran, Nevada Democrat, it specifies the government must pay the prevailing wage rate on construction initiated under the pending act.

Government spokesmen charged the amendment would wreck the jobs program and make public employment so attractive that it would be impossible ever to get relief workers back to private payrolls. It was the plan of the Administration to pay a maximum

about a return to more normal business conditions. But in order to secure favorable congressional action on the proposal, an essential industry must work as a unit not only to present its case but to elect the men who will control the legislative process.

"There has been much talk of the forgotten man. Some say he is the man who is out of work," he said. "I say he is the man who by his labor creates the wealth that keeps us going and helps to finance the others. Shall we continue to make him the goat? Taxes are increasing and will continue to increase and we can't stop them except by getting together and studying our problem."

Referring to social security and social reform plans, Mr. Harbo said that some sound plans were needed, but that it was a problem for society as a whole and that industry alone should not be made to carry the entire burden. He described unemployment insurance as impractical in its present form saying that no satisfactory system of putting it into effect has yet been devised.

Some of the NRA code provisions should be eliminated, he said, although the cotton, textile, coal and oil industries were generally in favor of this type of regulation while others are lukewarm. All, however, prefer self-regulation to government regulation, he asserted.

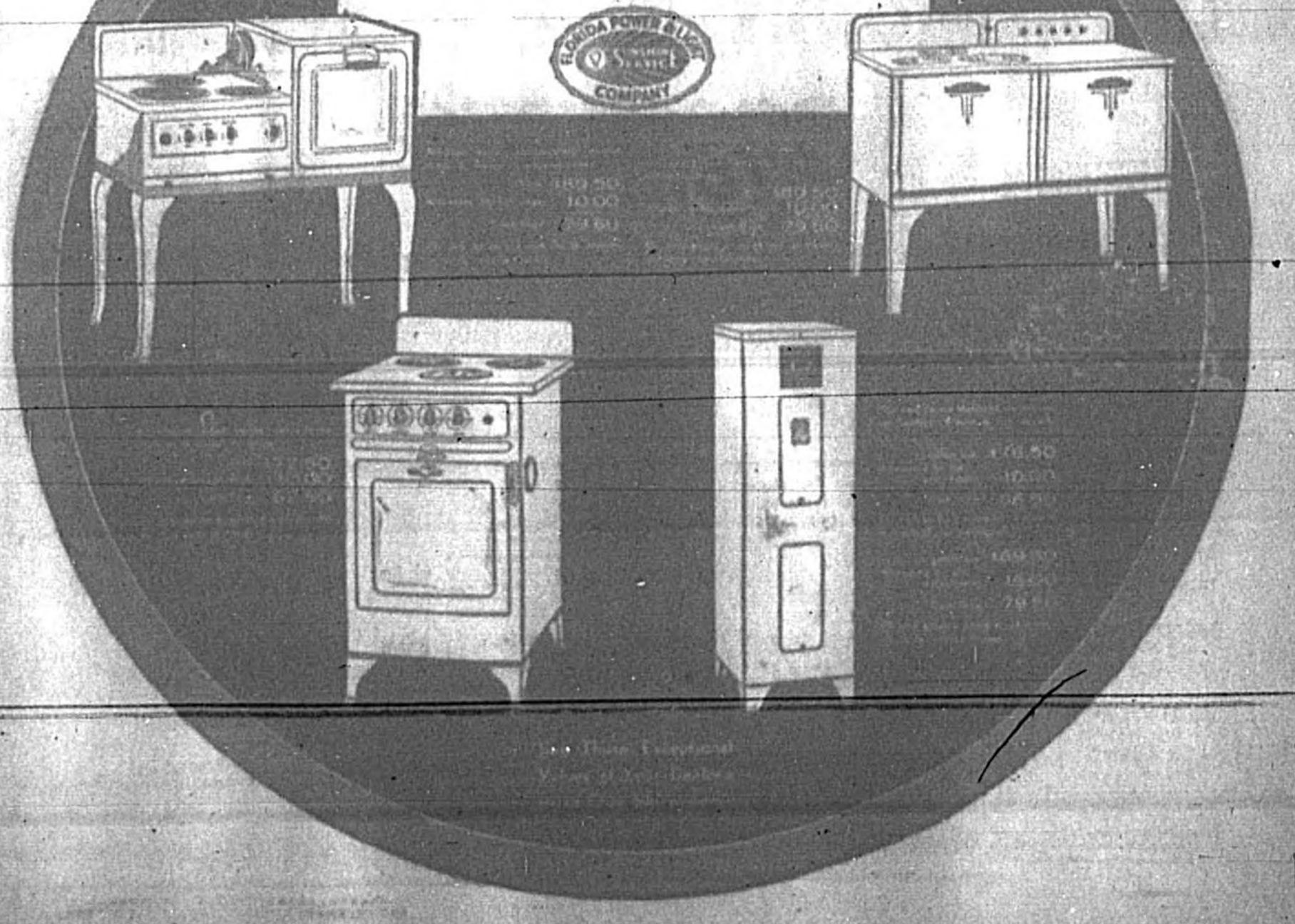
