





Since the beginning of its national life, the United States of America has projected a crisp and straightforward image to the world. In due course Americans gained international renown for being uncomplicated, direct and honest. Either as individuals or as a nation, our

word was our bond. We stated our objectives explicitly, often with a candor that bordered on bluntness. We expected the same behavior from others in re-

Some called the United States naive and simplistic in our approach to international life -a criticism that is probably accurate. The frankness of Americans undoubtedly has resulted in occasional setbacks.

However, by and large we earned respect and, here and there, admiration. One of the problems of chauvinistic nations today, such as Germany or France or even some behind the Iron Curtain, is the popularity of Americans. Our cowboy movies, jazz, clothing styles, and even "le hot dog," are firmly planted on the continent, in Asia and in the corners of the

It is ironic then that even as other nations in the world are turning toward the style of the United States, America itself is becoming more continental - if that is the correct word.

One thing is certain - we have lost much of our neivete and simplicity. Beyond this, our word often is no longer considered our bond, as the foreign aid vote in the Senate recently ex-

Our international dealings have become complicated and sophisticated. Some would call it maturity. Is it really?
