Audio-Visuals Aid Education



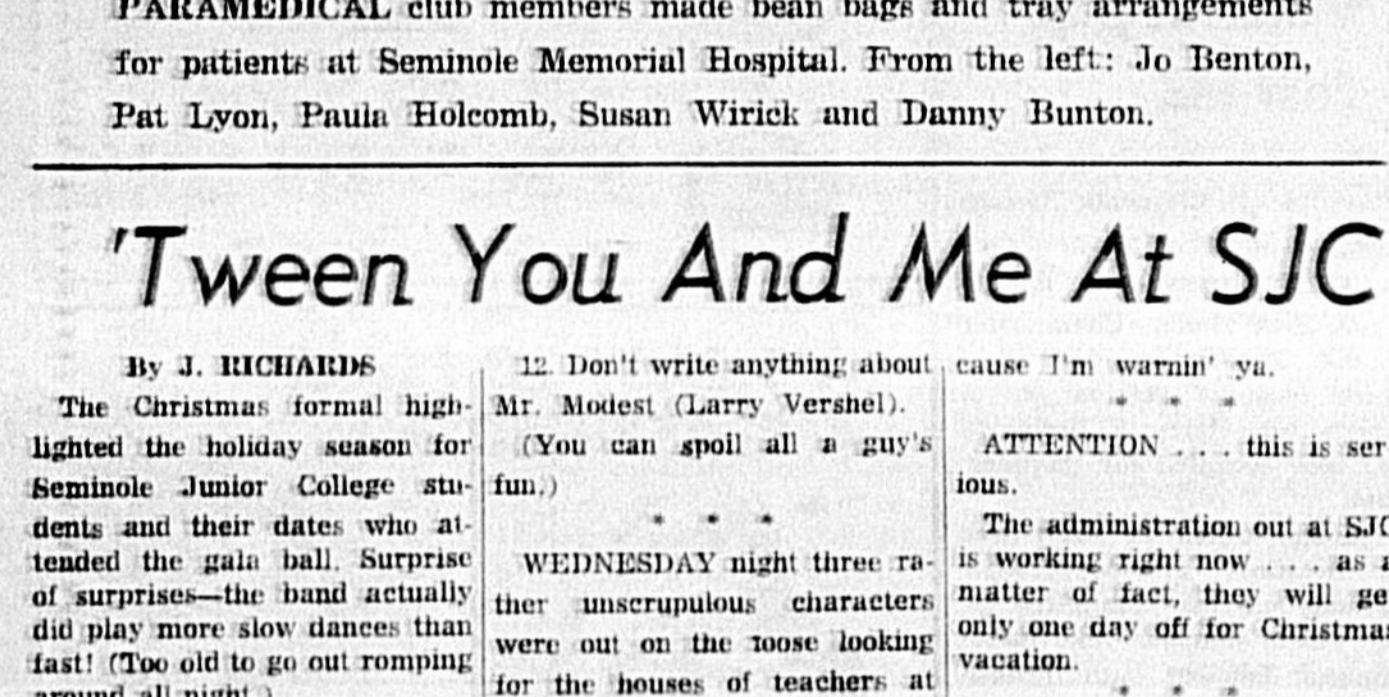

Recently four students of the Seminole High School Journalism class visited the Audio-Visual Center on Pine Street to see how various new teaching aids are made and used.



Mrs. Angela E. Taylor, Audio-Visual Coordinator, assisted by her secretary, Mrs. Betty Hallack, demonstrated several large machines that are presently being used to help make teaching throughout Seminole County easier.



When asked the main purpose of the center, Mrs. Taylor replied, "The primary goal of the center is to be of service to all schools within the county by having material and equipment available on a loan basis. It is a place where instruction in methods and technology may be learned; where principals and teachers may work on projects and view new equipment and materials, all of which is being made possible through the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (Public Law 86-252).



When the visiting students expressed surprise after learning that many of the transactions used by the center had been projected at school are made at the center James Talmadge, head of Electronic Maintenance and Courier Service, remarked, "French and Spanish tapes used by the language labs at Seminole are also made here.
