

Movie Actors Guild Accepts Contract

HOLLYWOOD G-The Screen Actors Guild has accepted a new contract for actors in television entertainment films, ending a 12day strike. The actors voted 735 to 307 Tuesday to end the strike.

Spokesmen for both the Guild and TV film producers said the agreement will give actors residual pay for second runs of filmed programs, a key issue in the dispute. Under the old contract the actors got a percentage of the original pay for third through sixth runs. The new contract, to run through March 31, 1960, provides for pay-ment for second through sixth runs.
