Teens wanted in late-night attack

LAKE MARY — One teen-ager is under arrest and three remain on the run following an attack on a Lake Mary teen in his living room early Monday morning.

Two teen-agers wearing masks and carrying clubs broke into 117 Mill Run Drive within The Crossings subdivision at about 3 a.m. Monday, while another two companions waited outside in a getaway car.

The two teens battered 16-year-old Tyler Jakubowski with clubs while he sat

in his living room in front of the computer. The suspects also brought heavy duct tape, and attempted to tie Jakubowski up, according to the police report.

However, Jakubowski grabbed one of the clubs and chased the two suspects from the home. As they fled, Tyler called for his father, Dennis Jakubowski, who was returning from a walk in the neighborhood.

One of the suspects was known to Tyler Jakubowski. Investigators are looking into a motive for the attack, said Lt. Ed Allen of the Seminole County Sheriff's Office.

Jakubowski suffered only minor cuts and bruises to his hands, and received treatment at a local hospital. Nothing was stolen from the home.

The two teens fled down the streets in the quiet neighborhood, while two others also fled in their dark colored Chevy Geo

Deputy Ralph Loprest spotted the Tracker, and followed the vehicle until the two passengers stopped the car and fled on foot in a wooded area surrounding a

Community remembers slain police officers

SANFORD — The loss of one's life is the greatest sacrifice any human being can make for another. On Saturday evening, the Seminole County Sheriff's Office observed its annual Law Enforcement Memorial Day Ceremony, and paid tribute to five Sheriff's Deputies who lost their lives in the line of duty. The five deputies are

Cleveland Jacobs, Robert Moore, George Pfiel, Hugh Thomas, and Eugene Gregory. The event also marked the second anniversary of the death of Deputy Gregory, who was killed in Geneva during an armed encounter.

The featured speaker was Seminole County Judge Carmine Bravo. Bravo said the last four years had given him a new insight

The children were visiting with their father, 39year-old Robert Briggs, since Friday, June 30 to be returned to their two mothers on Sunday,

Briggs returned the children at about 1:30 p.m. Saturday to the office of Diane Tennis, the attorney for the two mothers of his children. The children were then returned to their mothers.

On the move: Schools shuffle portable classrooms

SANFORD — Portable classrooms on campuses throughout Seminole County campuses are being replaced this week.

In most cases, leased portables are being replaced with portables owned by the school district to save the costs of lease payments. Meanwhile, other portables are being removed because of increased student capacity on campuses. A total of 282 portables will be used in Seminole County schools when classes resume Aug. 7, a reduction of 26 portables compared to last school year.

Leased portables at Hamilton Elementary School in Sanford and other schools throughout the district are being replaced with district portables.

At Crooms Academy, the majority of portables will be removed before the school year starts. Crooms will have a reduced enrollment this year, because no new middle school students are being admitted. The school, which currently serves "at risk" students in grades 6 through 12, will become a hightech magnet high school in 2001.

All portables are being removed from the campus of Jackson Heights Middle School in Oviedo. The school shared space with Chiles Middle School last year. Chiles is opening in August on a new campus.

All district portables meet state safety inspection standards.

However, they are made of wood. The state has different standards for existing portables and newly constructed portables. New portables consist of nonflammable materials, including concrete.

The district is looking into reducing the number of portables on school grounds. However, this would require the funds to construct new schools.

The district has \$260 million in unfunded capital improvement needs, said Dianne Kramer, director of facilities and planning for the district.

Meanwhile, the district is opening a new elementary school in Oviedo in August. A new ele-







today two years after his return. Chronic lymphatic leukemia

has drained him terribly. He goes for a blood transfusion every other week. When the hemoglobin blood count dips to 14, it is dangerous. Marty Holloran's count on Monday was seven.

"I'm alert, awake," he said. "Most of the time I feel good." Last weekend, Holloran visited All Souls Catholic Church in Sanford and spoke about the

poor people of Guyabal at four Masses. He would not be able to return, he said. He was asking for donations for Pastor Richard Trout to send to Guyabal.

"This is about all I have left - speaking," Holloran said. "When I was an agent for Prudential, they asked me to speak at conventions. I did for 25 years. Some actually thought

I was inspirational." Many who saw this kindly, white-haired man at All Souls Church on Sunday would agree, for they saw in him the face of Christ.





SCC sponsors **Comet Watches** July 21 through 24

The public will have an opportunity to see a comet if conditions allow.

Comet C/1999 LINEAR S4, or LINEAR S4 for short, should become visible to the nakedeye under dark skies on the weekend of July 23. The Seminole Community College Planetarium will hold free Comet Watches from 9:30 to 11 p.m. on July 21st, 22nd, 23rd, and 24th.

Please note the word "should." The famous comet hunter, David Levy, has often compared comets to cats.

"They both have tails," Levy explains, "and they both do exactly what they want."

LINEAR S4 is expected to reach magnitude 4 to 6 on July 23rd. If it reaches magnitude 4, it will be about as bright as the Andromeda Galaxy, which is easily visible to the naked-eye under dark skies and faintly visible under good conditions within the city.

If it reaches only magnitude 6, it will be more than six times fainter, right at the naked-eye limit for only the clearest and darkest skies.

Because of light pollution, Comet LINEAR S4, even if it reaches magnitude 4, may or may not be naked-eye visible from within the cities. But it should be visible from suburban areas. Binoculars or low power telescopes will allow a better

Light pollution is caused by outdoor lighting fixtures that

allow light to shine above the horizontal, up into the sky. The light shining up into the sky, resulting in a sky glow that washes out all but the brightest

Comet LINEAR S4, which has never been seen by humans before, was discovered on Sept. 27, 1999, by the Lincoln Near-Earth Asteroid Research (LIN-EAR) program in New Mexico. Comet LINEAR S4 will reach its closest point to the Sun on July 26th, at which time it will be 68.4 million miles from the Sun. However, it will reach its closest point to the Earth of 33.6 million miles, on July 23rd.

The Seminole Community College Planetarium's Free Comet Watch will immediately follow our "Tonight's Sky" planetarium show on Friday, July 21, and our "A Star to Steer planetarium show on Saturday, July 22. These shows start at 8:30 and end about 9:30

The Comet Watches on Sunday, July 23, and Monday, July 24, will start at 9:30 PM as well. The public is welcome to bring binoculars, and the SCC Planetarium will supply tele-

The Seminole Community College Planetarium is located on the Main Campus on Weldon Boulevard in Sanford, off of U.S. 17-92, halfway between SR 434 and Lake Mary Boulevard. For more information, the Public may call 407-328-2360.

TALLAHASSEE — The Florida Department of Banking and Finance (DBF) is currently holding over \$500 million in unclaimed property belonging to Florida present and past residents. The residents however, may not know about the money.

Each year, the DBF publishes an unclaimed property list. In the most recent fiscal year, which ended on June 30, 2000, the state processed nearly 88,000 claims and returned over \$67 million to its original owners. This was the most money ever returned during a one year period, and the most claims ever processed since the program started in 1961.





what advice could be given to children who suffer abuse in their homes and cannot leave. We receive calls of this type regularly at Childhelp USA.

dren. authorities may think a is serious enough to permanently remove children from their homes. Moreover,

the abuse may be unknown to all but the perpetrator and the victim. Often victims are scared silent because they are frequently threatened, told it's all their fault or that no one will believe them. Victims may have mixed feelings because the perpetrator is an important person in their lives.

Youngsters in these types of situations must be made aware of the following: 1. You are a victim, and

the abuse you are suffering is not your fault.

2. You do not deserve to be treated this way.

3. If you are being burned, bitten, or hit hard enough to leave marks or bruises, you are being abused.

4. If you are not being fed well enough or taken to the doctor when you are sick, if you are locked in a room for hours, or left home alone at too young an age — you are being neglected. Neglect is a form of abuse.

5. If you are made fun of, called names, told you are unwanted or that you are worthless or stupid, you are being emotionally abused.

6. If any of the above are being done to you, please find someone you trust and tell them. A family member, a teacher, the school nurse, the school counselor, someone at your church, a neighbor or anyone you can trust must be told. Ask them for help. Make them believe you. Show them the marks.

7. Try not to be alone with any person who hurts

8. Listen to your little voice inside when it says that what is being done to you is not right.

Many insects beneficial to humans

Not all insects are pests. Only a very small percentage of over one million known species of insects are considered

pests. Many of them perform functions that are directly or indirectly beneficial to humans.

They pollinate plants, contribute to the decay of organic matter and the cycling of soil nutrients. Some of them attack other insects that we consider pests.

Learning to recognize these insects in your garden will help you in making decisions on the use of:

Lady Beetles

These beetles commonly known as lady bugs, are predatory insects that feed mainly on soft. bodies insects such as aphids and scale insects. There are over 400 species of lady beetles in North America, ranging in color from orange with black spots to various shades of red and yellow to jet-black.

Adults and larvae consume similar prey and generally can be found together where their prey is abundant.

Praying Mantids Several mantids occur naturally in the southern United States. In the fall, adult female mantids produce egg cases that may contain up to two hundred eggs.

These eggs remain dormant until early summer when tiny mantid. nymphs hatch and begin searching for prey. Only one generation of mantids develop per year.

Mantids are indiscriminate predators that feed on a wide variety of insects, including many beneficial insects and even other mantids. They are widely offered for sale through catalogs but because of their poor survival rate

and indiscriminate feeding habits they are not considered to be very effective for insect pest control.

Assassin Bugs

These insects have an elongated head with a segmented beak. that is used for piercing and sucking. They are usually black or brown, but many are brightly colored and measure about 1 inch in length.

There are more than 160 species of assassin bugs in North America, most of them predaceous. They attack many harmful insects but they prey mainly on caterpillars.

Many species will inflict a

painful bite if handled.

Parasitic Wasps

Wasps are a very important group of beneficial insects, there are about 1,600 species living in North America. These wasps are very small, most of them less than 1/8 inches long and most of them are hardly noticed.

They lay their eggs on or in the body of a host-insect and the immature stage consumes the host's tissues over a period of time, eventually killing it.

Pupation may occur in or on the host. Some wasps construct numerous small, white cocoons on the body of their host. Other species pupate inside their host and the emerging wasp leaves a small circular hole in the body of the host as evidence of para-

Parasitic wasps kill many harmful insects such as whiteflies, scales, leafminers, aphids and caterpillars.

Syrphid Flies

Also known as flower flies, these insects usually resemble. wasps or bees but have only one pair of wing and do not sting. The flies vary greatly in color and size, most of the are yellow with brown or black stripes on the abdomen.

Many syrphid larvae are predaceous, especially on aphids. The larvae are slug or maggot-

like in appearance with no visible legs or head, usually greenish or translucent in color. The adult flies feed mainly on pollen.

Stink Bugs

A common predaceous stink bug in Florida is midnight blue and orange in color. As a general rule, beneficial species of stink bug can be identified by spines projecting from their thoraxes, whereas plant feeders have rounded shoulders.

The predaceous forms have short, stout beaks, while plant feeders have long, thin mouth parts. They prey on many insects, especially caterpillars.

Lacewings

Most lacewing adults are greenish or brown. Adults may be predaceous or feed on pollen. Larvae are elongate and have large sickle-shaped mandibles and feed mainly on aphids. Lacewing larvae are sometimes called aphidlions.

Learning to recognize these and other beneficial insects will help you in making better decisions on dealing with insects pests in your garden.



Sanford church has plans to open child-care facilities

SANFORD — A Sanford church plans to operate a daycare and preschool for up to 65 children.

Sanford First Church of the Nazarene, located on 7.5 acres of land at 2581 Sanford Avenue, plans to open the daycare within the church facilities in October.

Initially, the program will serve 30 to 40 children ranging

Facilities at the church can serve up to 65 children, said Pastor Jon Carnes.

"We hope to open in October, although that's moving pretty quickly," Carnes said. "We will open in the late fall."

The church will add to its recreation areas in preparation for opening the daycare. The hours of operation will be 6 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Start-up costs are estimated at \$25,000.

"We want anybody that comes in our daycare to say the is family friendly," Carnes said.
"We want the children to want
to be there. We have a lot of
families in the church who need
it, and there are a lot of families
in the city who need it."

The fees for the daycare and ministerial-based preschool will be in the medium range, compared to similar programs offered in Central Florida, Carnes said. After-school care will also be offered for elementary school children.

This will be the first time the

care program and preschool. However, about a decade ago the church did operate a small Christian school.

"We will have a curriculum for the children so they come out ready to go to school," Carnes said. "We want this to be more than just taking care of kids. Our church wants to reach out to the community."

New law now in effect for disabled person's hunting/ fishing licenses

es, applicants will need to provide a certification of total and permanent disability from the United States Armed Forces or the United States Veterans Administration.

Alternatively, a Notice of Award from the Social Security Administration for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) Supplemental Security Disability Income (SSDI) Benefits will also be accepted.

Previously, a certification from a licensed medical doctor in Florida was accepted in order to qualify for the license, but that provision no longer applies.

Susan Weaver, chief of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (FWC's) Bureau of Licensing and Permitting, said the Florida Legislature enacted the change because the guidelines given to the physicians only allowed them to qualify an individual for the no-cost license if the condition was the result of catastrophic injury.

"If you lost a leg in a traffic accident, a doctor could qualify you to receive the no-cost hunting and fishing license," Ms. Weaver said, "but if you lost a leg as the result of something like diabetes, a doctor could not qualify you."

Under the new law, she said, certification for the free license will be more uniform and will be more closely tied to loss of ability to earn income.

Another provision of the law, is that all disability licenses issued prior to July 1, 1997 became invalid as of July 1. This includes anyone who received the yellow card. Affected individuals may reapply under the new guidelines if they meet the new requirements.
