Middle East Negotiators

In Washington For Talks

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Egyptian, Israeli and American negotiators are gathered in Washington to try to regain at least an appearance of renewed momentum in the stalled Palestinian autonomy talks. The negotiators were invited to Washington by President Carter to work out procedures for the negotiations, which failed to achieve agreement on the future rule of the territories occupied by Israeli forces

The talks were broken off by the Egyptians in May, when the Israeli parliament began to consider a bill that would have made all of Jerusalem part of Israel. Tuesday night the Egyptian negotiator said Egypt would not accept any change in Jerusalem's status.

Begin To Rest 5 Weeks

JERUSALEM (UPI) - Prime Minister Menachem Begin, who suffered a mild heart attack in parliament Monday, will have to spend up to three weeks in the hospital and two more weeks at home before resuming his full work load, his doctor says.

But Iraeli officials said the 66-year-old prime minister intends to keep his hand on the reins of government despite the mild heart attack, which Begin suffered shortly before his Likud coalition government survived what amounted to a no-confidence vote.



Social Security **Faces New Crisis**

After trustees of the Social Security system warned that yet another financial crisis is looming, witnesses before a congressional committee helped explain why.

It turns out that millions of dollars in Social

Security disability benefits are being paid to persons whose disability causes them no immediate problem. They are already being supported by the government — as inmates of prisons

The flow of disability checks into prisons is contributing to drug traffic, prostitution and gambling within the walls. That's a problem for the warden. The problem for the American people is that their government is wearing a blindfold as it passes out money under various "entitlement" programs. That's where the warden's problem



The easy way out is for Congress to authorize the retirement fund to "borrow" from the separate funds used to pay disability and Medicare benefits, which currently have a surplus great enough to cover such a bailout. Since his seizure of power, Fidel Castro has been the ideological darling of the Western

Detroit City Workers

Shut Down Transit System

By United Press International Striking Detroit municipal workers shut down the city's transit system early today, stranding up to 200,000 riders. In New York, uniformed employees geared up for a Thursday walkout in defiance of a court

Bus mechanics and supervisory personnel in Detroit voted Tuesday night to join 9,000 city workers who struck at midnight Monday.

City officials, expecting bus drivers to honor the picket lines, began recalling buses to the yards early today, stranding hundreds of angry riders. By 4 a.m. EDT, the bus system, which serves an estimated 200,000 riders daily in the nation's sixth largest city, was shut down

In an effort to end the walkout, which threatens to disrupt the Republican National Convention beginning in two weeks, negotiators for the city and Council 25 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees returned to the bargaining table

NEW ORLEANS (UPI) - First lady Rosalynn Carter headed a list of dignitaries attending today's funeral for Dr. Andrew Young Sr., a prominent dentist and the father of President Carter's first ambassador to the United Nations.

Coretta Scott King, Martin Luther King Sr. and Detroit pastor and political figure Dr. Nicholas Hood also were scheduled to attend the services at 11 a.m. at Central Congregational United Church of Christ. Burial was to follow in St. Louis Cemetery No. 3. Andrew Young Jr., an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ, was among several speakers expected to eulogize his father. Young Jr., a good friend of Carter's, was a Georgia congressman before Carter became president.

Haitians Win Court Test

MIAMI (UPI) — A federal judge today ruled that treatment of Haitian refugees by the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service has been "discriminatory" and ordered INS to work out a plan to change its ways. Ruling on a suit filed last year by the Haitian Refugee Center in Miami, U.S. District Judge James Lawrence King gave INS 90 days to come up with a plan for his approval.

He said the INS has rejected all Haitian applications for political asylum, and ordered the service, which decides which people who enter the country can stay, to begin looking more closely at Haitians on a "case b

Victor A. Lownes, who heads London's prosperous Playboy Club, says his club is doing less business. But this and similar omments from owners of plush West End casinos already forced to close leave the board unmoved.

"There seem to be enough clubs for the number of gamblers available," said the spokesman. "Some of the alleged breaches of the law may have arisen because too many casinos were competing with one another to attract the small number
