Concern Justified

Controls Will Worsen Food Situation

It is understandable that people are concerned about high food prices, because for many Americans food is the biggest item in the family budget. This is particularly true for the low and middle income families, who constitute a majority of the people.

If these Americans are not impressed with comparisons showing their food costs are still relatively low in comparison with costs for inhabitants of other nations, it is also understandable. They judge conditions on the basis of their experience-not in comparison with people elsewhere—and this experience tells them food is taking a bigger share of their budget than it was a year ago, or five years ago. So, naturally there's a clamor for govern-

ment to do something about rising food costs and that something usually translates into calls for price controls.

It may be that some temporary controlssomething comparable to the meat price ceiling-may be desirable for holding the line on other food items. However, we believe it should be strictly short-term and removed as quickly as possible, because any long-term controls of food prices could, just as farm groups and Agriculture Department officials say, result in higher prices and black markets in the future. This is because agriculture is totally dif-

Nibbling At Press Freedoms

The question of whether editorial comment should include the name of the writer is debated often and at length at seminars where the opinion writers gather to talk shop.

And predominant feeling is that, since the editorial represents impersonal newspaper policy, it should be unsigned. The newspaper masthead is the editorial "by-line."

True, some newspapers do include the writer's name or initials at the end of comment pieces. Most do not. The decision, quite properly, is that of management, which must be the target of outrage and charges of bias or inaccuracy.

The decision cannot be mandated by legislation, as is being attempted in the Rhode Island statehouse, where the House of Representatives is considering a bill setting fines up to \$500 for failure to identify writers of newspaper or magazine editorals.

The measure is frivolous, but the Legislature still should be reminded that it is tugging at First Amendment freedoms, which already are suffering strain.

Food production depends on many variables. the chief of which is weather. Insecticides, herbicides, fertilizers and plant and animal science have reduced those variables for the farmer in the last couple of generations, but weather still can dictate whether it will be a profitable or unprofitable year for him. Extreme wetness last year reduced grain production; the unseasonable cold in early spring is going to mean that a lot of fruit growers don't have a crop

There's been griping for years about farm subsidies. Why should the government pay farmers not to grow produce? Why should the government pay farmers to follow good conservation practices and sponsor research that increases productivity, while at the same time

paying them to take acreage out of production to avoid surpluses? The reasons lie in the difference of the

agricultural economy from other segments of Farming has been family based - a mass of small units of production - in contrast with other major industries. Consider how few separate producers there are of oil, coal,

automobiles, medicines, appliances, furniture,

steel, electric power, lumber, or even farm

equipment. In spite of antitrust laws, these relatively few producers can control production and prices to the point where their operations will be profitable in most years. They can avoid wide swings in prices and in supply. In addition, most of these industries are unionized, so labor costs are fixed by contract.

Hanoi Can't Take Over South---Yet

An analysis of the data indicates that at this time and in the near future it is unlikely North Vietnam could successfully achieve a military takeover in the South - however flagrantly Hanoi flouts the truce. This conclusion assumes North Vieinam is indeed

mounting a large-scale build-up both within and along the principal borders of South Vietnam. Likewise, barring some unforseen domestic disruption in the South, the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese are too weak and divided for a political takeover in the near

Hanoi's top strategists are aware of these facts. This is clear from a careful analysis of reports out of North Vietnam, Hong Kong and Tokyo.

With a situation as hopeless as this one, and with opinior as divided as in Hanoi at present, Asian Communist theory as developed by Mao Tse-tung and Ho Chi Minh calls for a slow building of a base for victory at some

To accomplish this building, North Vietnam requires three things:

1. A safe supply line, preferably by sea. 2. A stockpile of weapons at strategic spots.

3. An assortment of small bases for equipping and training underground operatives on the spot.

What Hanoi must of necessity do now is acquire a major seaport in Cambodia for supplying its underground in the rich rice delta of South Vietnam to bolster its operations in that area, and a minor port in the northern area of South Vietnam to assist its build-up in the Hue and associated regions. The Cambodian port is by far more im-

If we go back in the recent history of the Vietnam war, losing Sihanoukville in Cambodia (followed by an American blockade of the entire Cambodian coast) doomed . Hanoi's takeover of South Vietnam by guerrilla operations and led to the bungled Easter invasion across the Demilitarized Zone.

Hanoi therefore must have the port back that once was called Sihanoukville if Ho Chi Minh's successors are to have any hope of conquering the South. The Laos trails are too costly an operation, though there is considerable evidence Hanoi will continue to use these military roads at least as auxiliary lines of supply.

A port, then, is what the present battle for Cambodia is all about - along with some crucial rice areas and riverroad routes into South Vietnam. Hanoi could probably care less about who controls the capital city and the government of Cambodia, unless that control affects the ports, the rice, the key rivers and roads.

With supply routes through Cambodia and some South Vietnamese ports in their hands, the North Vietnamese could afford to hold and wait, rebuilding their underground and military structure for a more opportune day sometime in the future - after the United States has lost interest in the area.







Miller's last Hambletonian winner, which is likened to the Kentucke Derby, was in 1950 when he guided Lusty Song to victo y in 2:02. That was also Miller's first Hambletonian

Miller and Connolly are "old friends." In fact, Connolly worked for Miller when the latter owned the Meadowlands which is just outside of Pittsburgh (Pa.). When Miller sold the track in 1970 Connolly left to work at Pocono Downs. And just recenily Miller has reacquired the Meadows which operates both a flat and harness season.

The name Simpson is familiar in harness racing since John Simpson Sr. having driven 1,467 winners during a career that is now in its twi-light. The senior Simpson also has driven 90 times where his horse has bettered the two minute mark. Of those 71 have been pacers.

Among the junior Simpson's top feats was a double twominute effort on the same day with two different horses. It happened September 29, 1971 at Lexington, Kentucky when he piloted Mooney Hanover to victory in 1:59,2 and as well as leading Shep's Pride the same afternoon in 1:59.4.

Records for 1972 are not yet available but in 1971 the juneor Simpson was the 10th leading driver on The Grand Circuit with \$103,007. In total winnings that year Simpson's mosey total reached \$371,745.

Agnew To Help Nixon 'Mop Up'

seeking to put his White House in order, is said to be considering an expanded role for Vice President Spiro T. Agnew now that two top aides have left because of the Watergate scandal. The President was closeted in the Oval Office with Agnew Tuesday, discussing the vice

president's new responsibilities. What they will be is expected to be announced

A restructuring of the White House staff, made necessary by the resignations Monday of chief of staff H.R. Haldeman and top domestic adviser John D. Ehrlichman, also was discussed with Agnew and at a 30-minute meeting with the CabiA restructuring of the White House staff made necessary by resignations (of key aides) ...was discussed with the Cabinet.

"It's a meeting that has to be seen as important," a White House source said. "We can assume that the subject dealt with the future more than such things as Watergate."

A participant in the Cabinet meeting said Kenneth R. Cole, executive director of the Domestic Council, will take over some of the duties handled by Ehrlichman and eventually may replace him.

It was also reported that Stephen B. Bull assistant to the President, has taken on added duties in short-term scheduling and paper flow. It is not considered likely that he will replace Haldeman-but rather that the chief of staff's duties may be taken over in part by the Office of Management and Budget

Haldeman and Ehrlichman were seen leaving the White House Tuesday carrying stacks of
