#### Shah Undergoes Operation As Iran Seals Its Borders

CAIRO, Egypt (UPI) — The former shah of Iran underwent his third operation in 17 days today to drain an abscess the size of an orange on his right thigh, the well-informed Al Ahram newspaper said. There was no official confirmation of the Al Ahram report and no mmediate word on the condition of the former shah, who has undergone seven operations since leaving Iran.

In Iran, the influential head of Iran's Revolutionary Council said today the election of a new U.S. president would not make any difference in deciding the fate of the 52 American hostages.

### Officer's Job Assured After Closed-Door Pact

## Longwood Keeps ARMON Land Ordinance

In voting down 3-2 an amendment designed to clarify a city ordinance regarding non-conforming lots, the Longwood City Commission has created even more confusion.

Bowing to public pressure from residents in the Lake Wildmere area, Commissioners John Hepp, June Lormann and William Mitchell voted against the amendment while commissioners J.R. Grant and Mayor Steve Uskert voted in favor of the controversial ordinance. An ordinance putting a temporary moratorium on construction on non-conforming lots was approved unanimously, however.

City Attorney Marvin Rooks had been directed by the commission to draw up the amendment to clear up confusion over an amended 1958 ordinance on non-conforming lots of record after he gave an interpretation differing from one by former city attorney Ned Julian Jr.

In 1958, an ordinance was passed requiring a 5,000-square-foot minimum lot size with 60-foot frontage for residential zoning with lots of record that were not contiguous and had "single and separate" ownership excepted. In 1970 another ordinance was passed increasing the area to 10,000 square feet and the frontage to 100 feet. A subsequent amendment adjusting the zoning eliminated any reference to single ownership or noncontiguous frontage as being necessary for an

Julian had interpreted the city code to mean the intent was to continue to require these for an exception, but Rooks interpreted the ordinance strictly as written advising that the city must issue building permits on this basis.

#### Sanford Man Drowns In Jacksonville Pool

A 48-year-old Sanford man on his way to a Georgia alcoholics clinic drowned in a Jacksonville motel swimming pool.

After clowning around in the water, Simpson ducked under the surface but never came up, said Jacksonville Police Det. J.L. Tarmenter. He was pronounced dead on the scene at 5:15 a.m., Tarmenter said.

Since 1976, Simpson, employed as a mechanic at Clem Leonard Shell, 2500 Park Ave., had lived with his sister and brother-in-law, Mary and Marvin Revels.







### Confusion **Over Tax Cut**

Americans have good reason to be confuse about cutting federal taxes, even though 'tis a consummation devoutly to be wished. The average citizen doesn't know what to believe because of conflicting information from the nation's political leaders.

The Republicans led by Ronald Reagan propose a 30 percent reduction during the next three years in individual taxes and an acceleration of business depreciation, with 10 percent off next year. They cite a persuasive case for how retaining about \$25 billion in the private sector would stimulate the economy and help pull the nation from its worse recession since World War II.

President Carter lost no time in roundly denouncing such tax relief as "irresponsible" "sheer deception" ... "a free lunch, something for nothing." And Sen. Alan Cranston advised his Washington colleagues that Californians proved they don't want a tax cut by defeating Proposition







# Thighs And Drumsticks On The Grill

The backyard barbecue is always popular at this time of year but with inflation and energy shortages keeping more people close to home the grill might well become the center of

Cooking chicken outdoors instead of expensive red meats can mean real savings. According to the National Broiler Council, chicken thighs and drumstricks are especially good buys now. They are in abundant supply and both are ideal for barbecuing on the grill.

Like all chicken, these parts are rich in protein but low in calories and in fat content. The dark meat is especially moist and is preferred by many chicken lovers. It is compatible with most other foods and adapts well to a variety of seasonings so you can create many pleasing combinations when you cook thighs and drumsticks outdoors. They're good finger foods, too - ideal for informal eating.

Barbecuing chicken should be a leisurely process, savord and enjoyed but never hurried. The aroma of chicken cooking on the grill is tantalizing and will whet the appetite, so start the fire well in advance of serving to allow time for proper cooking. Once the chicken starts to cook, the chef should remain nearby to turn and baste it to perfection.

Charcoal makes a hot fire; space the coals so no two touch and wait until it's ash-covered (about 30 minutes) before beginning to cook. The rack should be 6 to 8-inches from the heat. Place the chicken on the grill skin side up and turn every 3 to 5 minutes for even cooking. It takes about an hour to cook chicken on the grill, depending on size and thickness of the

#### DRESS UP CHICKEN THIGHS FOR ECONOMICAL ELEGANCE

Chicken thighs are in good supply now and are an especially good buy at the meat market, according to the National Broiler Council. They're great for outdoor cooking, whether for a family meal or economical entertaining.

Use your favorite barbecue sauce and baste the thighs as they cook on the grill. Or bone them and produce a truly elegant treat, such as "Poulet Mignon" (below). Simple to prepare with a minimum of ingredients, it's a truly different dish that will appeal even to chicken lovers who usually eat only white meat.

**POULET MIGNON** 8 broiler-fryer chicken thighs, boned 8 slices (about 2" x 3") mozzarella cheese 8 strips thick bacon teaspoon salt

On flat surface, place boned chicken thigh, skin-side down.

Place cheese alice inside thigh, gently wrapping thigh around cheese. Check to be sure cheese is tightly enclosed; secure with food pick. Attach one end of bacon strip to food pick and wrap remainder of bacon around thigh several times. Secure with §" wood or metal skewer, penetrating through entire mignon. Repeat for all thighs. Place thighs on grill, skin side up, 6-8 inches from best. Turn every 3-5 minutes for even cooking. Grill for about 40-45 minutes, or until fork can be inserted in chicken with ease. Remove chicken from grill; add

salt and pepper. Makes 4 servings. To bone chicken, simply place thigh on cutting board, skin-side down, and cut along thin side, joint to joint. Holding one end of bone, cut meat from one join; then pull or scrape meat from bone. Cut meat from opposite joint.

Bake in 400-degree oven 35 minutes or until golden brown. Cool in pan. At serving time, remove pan and cut into wedges.

34 to 1 cup sugar

2 tablespoons cornstarc & teaspoon salt 1 pint fresh strawberries, sliced in half

3 cups sliced fresh rhubarb tablespoon lemon juice tablespoon margarine or butter

can (10 biscuits) refrigerated buttermilk or country style Cinnamon-sugar mixture

In large saucepan, combine sugar, cornstarch and salt. Stir in strawberries, rhubarb, lemon juice and margarine. Cook over medium heat, stirring frequently until hot, bubbly and slightly thickened. Pour into 2-quart casserole or baking dish. Heat oven to 400 degrees F. Separate dough into 10 biscuits; cut each in half with scissors. Arrange cut-side down on hot fruit mixture in circle around edge of casserole. Sprinkle with cinnamon-sugar mixture. Bake at 400 degrees F. for 15 to 20 minutes or until biscuits

are golden brown. Serve warm with cream or ice cream.

TIP: Frozen strawberries and rhubarb may be substitute for the fresh fruit.

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. For Ice cream squares, combine cereal, sugar, butter, coconut, nuts, flour, cinnamon nutrneg and salt. Spread evenly over 151/2 x 101/2-inch jelly rolf pan. Bake 12 minutes, stirring frequently. Cool completely Combine cereal mixture and peanut butter until well blended. Spread mixture evenly in bottom of an 8-inch square baking pan. Freeze until firm. Spread ice cream evenly over crust. Freeze several hours or overnight. Meanwhile, for sauce, combine sugar, cornstarch and salt in small saucepan. Gradually add orange juice and cook, stirring constantly, until thickened. Remove from heat and stir in butter until melted. Stir in orange peel, lemon juice and orange sections. Chill. Remove dessert from freezer 15 minutes before serving. Cut into squares; spoon sauce over each. (Leftover sauce keeps well in refrigerator up to 2 weeks.)
