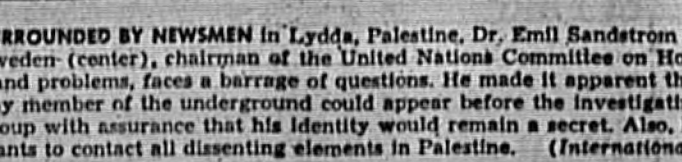

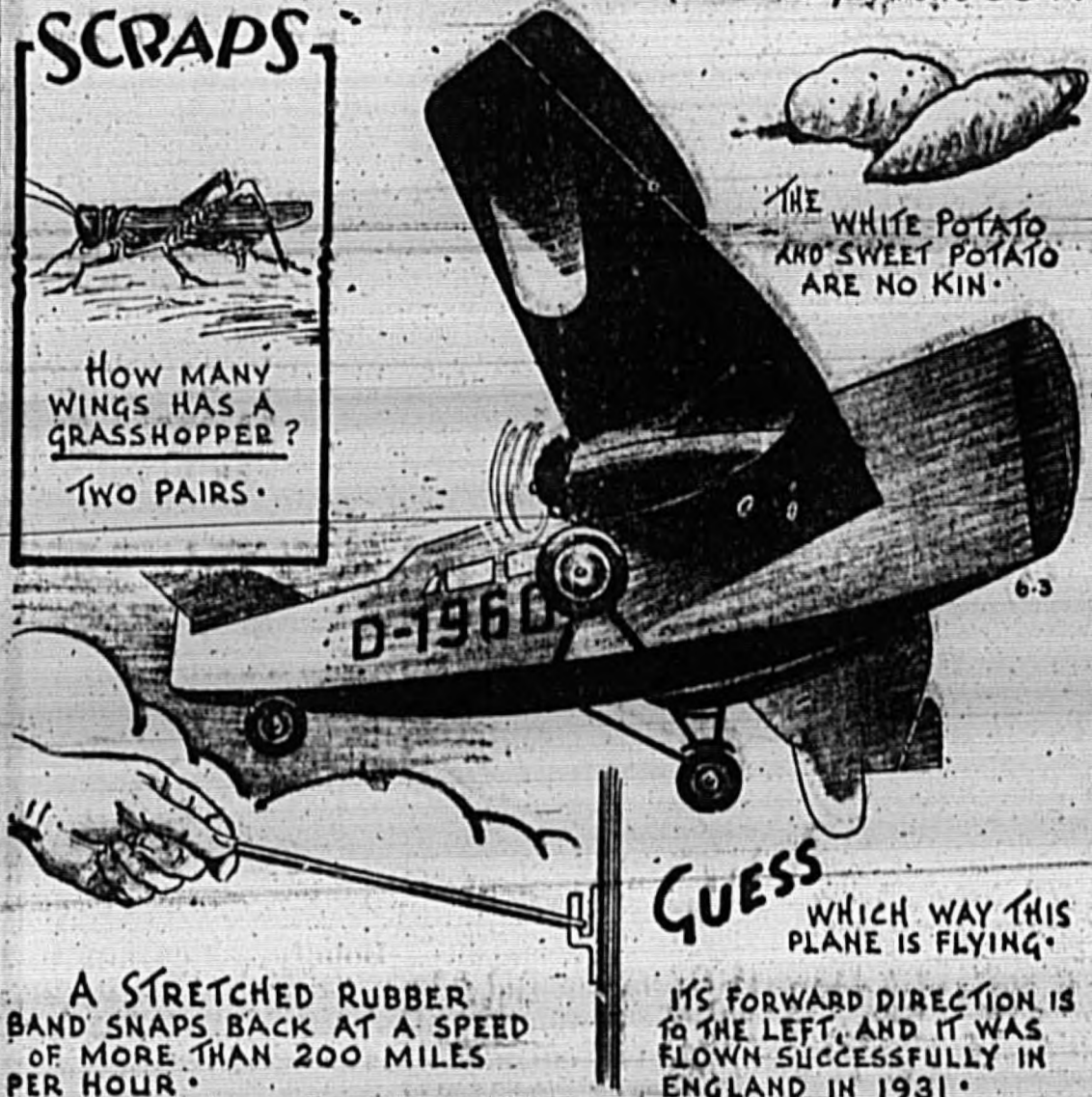

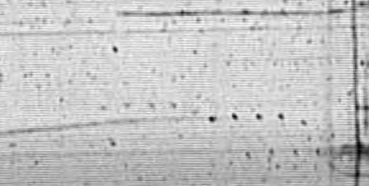

representatives who expressed interest in the plan.

Meanwhile, a British-Foreign Office spokesman said that thus far Denmark, Norway, Belgium, Holland and Italy had asked Britain for further details on the Marshall plan through their diplomatic representatives in London.

Other authoritative informants said Foreign Secretary Bevin had called for a report from British occupation authorities as to how Germany should be fitted into any plan of continental reconstruction.

In Berlin the official newspaper of the Soviet military administration in Germany observed today that "the people of Europe look with great hopes" to the Marshall plan conference opening Friday in Paris.

"All European people now suffering the effect of the war would welcome with joy the aid that can be given them by America, a country which, as is known, did not suffer from the war but without doubt actually became richer through the war," said the newspaper, the Tagliche Rundschau.

"But the Marshall plan must be, as Secretary Marshall said, a fight against hunger and must not bear any political strings like 'dollar diplomacy.'"

Two of these would authorize continuation of the information program and the third would authorize employment of clerks and secretaries for federal judges.

The House eliminated funds for bought on credit. It also requires that installments be paid off in 15 months at most.

With controls removed, purchasers will be able to buy at whatever terms a dealer is willing to give.

With this Congress session scheduled to run only about five weeks more, leaders are beginning to whip together a stretch program. (They aim for adjournment about July 31).

One big measure put down for action is that to put the Army and Navy under a single cabinet officer. It is part of the answer the administration framed to one of the major questions confronting Congress when it met.

What can be done to strengthen national defenses?

President Truman asked also for a universal military training law, but G.O.P. leaders have passed the word there will be no decision on that at this session. It is getting study and the House Armed Services Committee decided today to go ahead with hearings.

Also in today's developments: Foreign Broadcasts.—The Senate Appropriations Committee recommended that the State Department be allowed to continue its foreign language radio broadcasts, known as "The Voice of America." It recommended however, an appropriation of \$11,500,000 to finance that and other information programs instead of the \$34,000,000 asked for operations in the 12 months beginning July 1.

Radio.—The Senate Commerce Committee, continuing hearings on legislation to rewrite radio broadcasting laws here at home, heard Rolf Kaltenborn recommend that radio stations be required to give a "fair presentation" of differing views on important public issues. the new federal mediation agency created by the Taft-Hartley Act.

In any event, the lawmakers will have some time to act on the question of funds to administer the new labor law. The

Wagner Act revisions, such as the ban on the closed shop, do not go into effect for 60 days. (The new mediation set up will start operating in 30 days).

But another major provision of the act is in effect now. This provision authorizes the government to obtain 80-day injunctions to block or stave off national emergency strikes.

However, Taft says he still is not certain that this section will list its purpose in the event of a coal strike next month when the government turns the soft coal pits back to private owners. The Ohioan says it is open to question whether the government could force the miners to remain at work for a new employer with whom they have no contract.

Meanwhile, there has been swift and bitter reaction from organized labor to enactment of the Taft-Hartley Act. There are actual mine shutdowns in effect and there have been irate calls for widespread protest strikes across the nation.

Union leaders have been stung by the ease with which the House and Senate overrode Mr. Truman's veto. And they have threatened reprisals at the polls against legislators who favored the labor law.

Other labor leaders have promised to work for the prompt repeal of the act and still others are going to try to get quick court tests of the constitutionality of the law.

Cries of anger and protest have come from many of the nation's top labor leaders. One of these has declared privately he sees about 10 years of litigation ahead for organized labor and industry. There has been some scattered talk of a general strike by the more than 15,500,000 members of labor unions. But AFL and CIO headquarters in Washington are minimizing the possibility of any such move.

However, the San Francisco CIO council, in a telegram to CIO President Phillip Murray, has proposed a 24-hour nationwide work stoppage in protest against congressional enactment of a law labor bosses have described as a "slave" labor law.

Murray has made no public reply. But he has summoned his 51 member executive board to meet with him Friday in Washington in an emergency session to

discuss the situation now confronting organized labor.

Enactment of the Taft-Hartley bill also is having its repercussions on the political front.

Democratic Senator Claude Pepper of Florida says he believes the Senate's action in overriding Mr. Truman's veto has given what he calls "tremendous impetus" to a fledgling Third Party movement. Says Pepper:

"Political history has been written here. Congress has done more than Henry Wallace ever did to lift a Third Party. We have seen a demonstration that neither party can muster a majority in Congress for liberal proposals. Nobody but intellectual liberals have been interested in a Third Party up to now, but if the working people feel that their rights aren't going to be protected they may make a third

party movement a vital affair."

Some Democratic Senators, including Harry Byrd of Virginia, are not in agreement with Pepper's views on the political effects of the enactment of the labor law.

And Republican colleagues are disrupting the views of Vermont's Senator George Aiken. Aiken declares that as he sees it, the Republican party as of today has lost the rank-and-file labor vote. However, says Aiken:

"If (the GOP) has a chance to recover some of it if it will act in the next Congress to amend some of the law's objectionable features before the 1948 election."

Aiken explains that on the strength of promises from GOP leaders to sponsor such amendments, he voted with his colleagues to override the President's veto.
