

WHERE BUS CARRIED 14 TO DEATH IN VIRGINIA



Thirteen passengers and the driver were plunged to death at Hopewell, Va., when a heavily laden bus bound from Richmond, Va., to Raleigh, N.C., ran through an open drawbridge and sank in 30 feet of water. Death Of Rogers Milestone Of Stories Of Year

Hauptmann Trial And Long Murder Rank Second In Interest

NEW YORK, Dec. 27.—(AP)—

The most dramatic story of the

year to American newspaper readers

was the tragic death of Will

Rogers and Wiley Post in an air-

plane near Point Barrow, Alaska.

Rogers, the humorist, motion

picture actor and newspaper col-

umnist, and Post, the globe-trotting

aviator, were known in vir-

tually every home in this country,

and beyond, their fame was wide-

This was the greatest sponta-

neous news story of the year. It

was the story with the greatest

reader appeal. A glance at circu-

lation figures throughout the

country shows more newspapers

were sold on this story than on

any other one news event of the

year.

Ranking a close second in drama-

tic appeal was the trial, end-

ing in conviction and death sen-

tence, of Bruno Richard Haupt-

mann, charged with the kidnap-

ping of the Weyerhaeuser boy at Tacoma,
