

Burglar, Holdup Alarms-99% Are False

Herald Staff Writer Ninety-nine per cent of the burglary and holdup alarms received by Sanford police in the first eight months of this year were false alarms or caused by equipment

Only six of the 1,057 alarms could be considered legitimate, Police Chief Ben Butler said in a report given

Five of the six were burglaries or attempted burglaries. One alarm was vandalism to a business. Two of the burglaries were to schools and three were to businesses. In at least three of the cases police made arrests. City commissioners, considering adoption of a false alarm ordinance that would assess fees for police service for excessive false alarms, agreed to postpone further discussion until after Oct. 1 when Wallace LaPeters, of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, takes over as police chief and Butler

City Manager Warren Knowles has suggested adoption of a false alarm ordinance that would make businesses and establishments with more than three false alarms a month subject to a charge of \$25 per response by police on excessive false alarms.

Knowles said the statistics police gathered on false alarms for January through August shows some businesses have unusually high numbers of false alarms and this requires police response and takes officers away from normal duties.

Capt. Earl Bourquardez said average response time by officers to the alarms is "two to three minutes" and said each alarm call requires at least two patrol cars respond. Knowles estimated actual cost of responding to a false alarm at \$20 to \$25.

Several types of burglar and holdup alarms are in common use locally. Some are connected directly to police headquarters, some are telephone message type alarm systems and others are audible signals at the place

of installation utilizing bells or sirens.

Knowles called the alarm service by police "a fringe benefit" that the city isn't techincally required to furnish. Many of the false alarms are set off by business employes, Knowles said "Most of them don't even realize what they're doing."

He said the police department is starting a program in which "major offenders" of the false alarm barrage will be personally contacted by officers and the problem created by the alarms discussed.

Alarms listed by police in the report range from banks, manufacturing plants, retail and wholesale businesses and schools to professional offices, liquor stores, private homes, grocery stores and government offices.

One shop had 85 alarms during the eight month survey period. A wholesale distributorship had 65 and one bank nad 53 while another bank in the same chain had 46 false

In a recent "gripe session" with city commissioners policemen exposed the false alarm problems and the survey report was requested by city officials.

Since publicity on the meeting in which policemen related that when they responded to false alarms in some instances they were laughed at by personnel at the businesses Mayor Lee Moore has received a letter from

one of the banks with a high rate of alarm calls. Moore said bank official's report they've instituted an inhouse program to monitor all false alarms caused by bank personnel and a program to educate employes. He noted that bank officials admit there has been laughter in the past "but not toward responding officers but the bank personnel setting off the alarm.


Seven of the false alarms listed in the police survey report were at city hall and one was at the police depart-

City commissioner A.A. McClanahan said in most cases where high false alarm rates are recorded the problem can be traced to personnel not familiar with the alarm systems or to lack of maintenance of the equipment and systems by businesses with the alarm systems.

Seminole County Set To Adopt Comprehensive Plan

Herald Staff Writer Adoption of a comprehensive plan fo Seminole County tonight will not mean a decrease in the size of the county's 16member planning staff, according to County

A final hearing and adoption of the plan are scheduled for 7 p.m. in room 203 of the courthouse in Sanford. In addition to new responsibilities for the

planning division which will be added by adoption of a comprehensive plan, Kercher cites three additional factors requiring a continuation of his staffing level: - The rapid growth of Seminole County over the last 15 years. In 1960 the county had

less than 55,000 residents. The county's current population is now 140,000, an increase of 155 per cent in less than 20 years. - An increase in the level of services provided by county government. In 1970,

proposing a countywide parks program.

About the same time, commissioners voted to convert county dumps to transfer stations feeding a countywide sanitary landfill. The county added fire protection to unincorporated areas in 1974 and got into the

sewer business that same year. An increase in the number of intergovernmental coordinating agencies and mmittees to which the county belongs, many of which are required by state and federal laws. Planning staffers now participate in 13 such committees or agencies.
"Prevision of services has become more

complicated and extensive due to the county's rapid urbanization. Ten years ago Seminole was a rural county. Those days are over,' Kercher says.

Seven members of Kercher's staff almost half - are paid through the federally financed manpower program called CETA Act.) Six staff members spend all their time getting the county's records of new addresses up to date. Four of the six are part-time temporary employes, and the two others are hired under the CETA program.

"Except for the addressing program workers, who are carrying out a new program approved by the county commission, we've been at our current staff level for three years, ever since the county commission got into comprehensive planning," says the county planner. "Comprehensive planning is a continuing, ongoing process. Adoption of the plan itself is only one step in a continuing

Planning staffers will be working on a longrange transportation plan and monitoring long-range water and sewer plans. In addition, planners will work on locating a site for a major county park in the greater Sanford area as part of the commissioners' plan Seminole and three in southern Seminole. Other items on Kercher's work program

relating to the provision of services include staff work on re-zoning proposals initiated by the county for areas where there would be a higher intensity land use than shown in the comprehensive plan and state planning law requirements for an electric utilities plan, a mass transit plan and a "special transportation facilities" plan for ports, airports and rail facilities. In the area of regulation, the planning staff

will work on regulations for preparation of environmental impact statements, which will be required for public and private land development in the county once the plan is

Kercher says these procedures would coordinate county responsibility for several ordinances relating to flood-prone areas,

Man, 73, Charged With 1963 Church Bombing

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) - Robert Edward Chambliss, 73, of Birmingham, was being held without bond today after being indicted on charges of first-degree murder in the Sept. 15, 1963 church bombing in which four black youngsters were killed.

The girls died in a restroom area near the stairwell in which the explosion occurred. Nineteen persons were hurt.

Bitter Showdown Seen

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Carter administration and Congress seem headed for a showdown over indications the Senate is preparing to kill much of the President's energy program. Stung by recent setbacks, Carter accused the oil and gas industry of trying to "jeopardize our national future" by waging a heavy campaign against the program in the Senate. Carter threatened to veto the energy bill Monday after the Senate Finance Committee rejected his proposal to force conservation by taxing U.S. crude oil.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Judge Charles Galbreath, 52, appeared in the Tennessee Su-preme Court building wearing his robe, but he found his seat on the Court of Criminal Appeals taken by another judge. Judge William Russell, presiding member of the threejudge panel, said Monday he replaced Galbreath because of remarks about a colleague that appeared in a Nashville newspaper.

Peach People Push Picking

WASHINGTON (AP) - The National Peach Council is urging the government to permit volunteers to handle DCBP, a crop pesticide that has come under increasing regulation be-cause of a suspected link to sterility in men. Robert K. Phillips, executive secretary of the council, has proposed that older people and those who don't want children ought to be recruited to work with DCBP.

"We're auditing one oil company right now that has 360 sub-sidiaries," says executive director Eugene Corrigan. "It's a job that would cost a fortune for any single state." The commission is under attack in the courts. U.S. Steel and a dozen other firms have charged it is an unconstitutional joining of states and a threat to the confidentiality of tax returns.

State courts in Washington and New York have disagreed, and the U.S. Supreme Court will hear the case in its next term. comprised mostly of Western states right now - could see coniderable growth. Corrigan says nonmember states are already beginning to adopt many of the tax provisions shared by compact

The reason for the corporate opposition is simple: the tax commission is costing some of these companies a lot of money. In 1975-76, the commission, acting on the basis of its audits, recommended that member states assess an additional \$2.5 million in taxes. One year later, following audits on some larger

companies along with an increase in the number of audits, recommended additional assessments rose to \$10 million. The commission spent \$320,-000 to conduct last year's audits

and has increased its audit staff from six to nine this year. "The Tax Commission has helped us a lot," says Colorado's corporate tax chief, Ted Middle. "We've nailed a couple of companies that were simply telling one state one story and another story to us."

About \$8 billion in state and local corporate income tax will be collected this year. Officials estimate that between 10 per cent and 30 per cent is going unpaid. "If we're missing 10 per cert, and that's a low guess, then it's pretty nearly \$1 billion a year," says Corrigan.

Economist Stan Schwartz at the Colorado Department of Revenue says corporations often have an advantage over raditionally overworked state tax auditing divisions because "too many companies hire far too many accountants to figure out how to pay far too little taxes." The tax commission is the auditing arm of the Muiti-State Tax

Compact, the formal agreement that binds the 20 states. It was created by state tax officials seeking uniform tax laws after they found that corporations were playing states off against each other what Corrigan calls "a massive game called tax avoidance." The most common way of illegally avoiding state taxes is for a corporation to juggle its books to make it appear that more inome was earned in states with low tax burdens.

Delivery of urban-level services in developed unincorporated areas will take place through creation of special taxing districts. Commissioners have called this a "user pays" philosophy. Such

services include sewer and water service, urban fire protection, garbage collection and local drainage improvements.

Short-range development plans for the county's unincorporated areas are intended to let county resid into know how their neighborhoods fit into long-range growth goals of the county. Certain areas are earmarked for intensive development; others are not intended for urbanization.

The plan's adoption also makes clear that Seminole is an urbanizing county that bears little resemblance to the sparsely pepulated Seminole County of 1980 when there were less than 35,000 county residents. Now there are 140,000, and the recent increase in building permit applications means the growth will

Along with the growth has come a demand from county residents that county government insure Seminole County will be a desirable place to live in 10, 15 or 50 years.

Board of County Commissioners since I've served on the commission (beginning in 1974)," said Commissioner Williams.

Voting in favor of the plan were Commissioners Williams, Bob French, Bill Kirchhoff and John Kimbrough.

"I voted against the plan for the same reasons I voted against the development framework (policies portion of the plan) June 21. It's an abridgement of personal freedom," said Kwiatkowski.

opposing the plan: "It infringes upon personal and private rights. It violates the basic rules of management. It is based on setting up special taxing districts, a concept which is untried. It may be a real horror story in the making."

The comprehensive plan consists of three elements: -A "development framework," which spells out the basic and facilities, embodying a "user pays" philosophy for urban-level services provided to unincorporated county areas through establishing special taxing districts.

A short-range development plan, which includes land-use plans for the county's unincorporated areas and a five-year

capital improvements program. -An intergovernmental coordination statement. For the first time, homebuyers will have some assurance about the future development (or non-development) of their neigh-borhoods and surrounding areas, said Kimbrough, whose vote for the plan was one of his last acts as county commissioner. (He will

leave the commission at the end of the week to move to Virginia.) "This was really a running battle between Realtors and homeowners," said Kimbrough. "The homeowners wanted assurances about the future character of their neighborhoods."

Though adoption of the plan did not rezone any land, the land-use maps will be legally binding on the planning and zoning commission and county commission when they take up requests

The county's planning staff will initiate requests for rezoning in "small number of cases" where the plan indicates a lowerstensity use than current zoning, said Bill Kercher, county

Five county residents Tuesday night requested the future land asse designation of their property be changed before adoption of

The county commission voted down each request. The commission also voted to handle all rezoning requests now under consideration or which were submitted by Tuesday night under procedures in effect before adoption of the plan.

Five Indicted In Land Fraud

WASHINGTON (UPI) - A federal grand jury today indicted five men, including a national real estate figure and a partner in a prestigious Pittsburgh law firm, on charges they bilked \$6.2 million from more than 600 investors in a Florida land deal. David Addis, head of the Justice Department's land fraud unit, said the indicted officers and former officers of LTP Inc., sold mortgages on Florida land parcels located "on top of a sewage treatment plant, on a golf course and in a lake." "Virtually all the investors had no access to their property," he

Most of the investors were elderly or disabled persons, many of

whom "lost their life savings," Addis said.

Among those indicted on charges of mail fraud and conspiracy are wealthy Florida land developer Frank Carcaine, the first chairman of the Washington-based American Land Development Association, and Stephen Stepanian, a partner in Pittsburgh's largest law firm, Reed, Smith, Shaw and McClay. Addis described the alleged scheme as "the biggest Florida

land fraud in years." He said most of the investors received worthless land in the 830acre rural Oriando, Fla., development known as "The Swallows," and about \$1 million of their money was illegally diverted to another venture owned by the five men in Foxburg, pa.
