



ATLANTA (UPI) - Fuqua Industries, Inc., an Atlanta-based diversified-services firm, announced today an agreement in principle whereby Martin Theatre Company, a subsidiary, will acquire a Florida chain of motion picture theaters, including the Sanford Plaza Rocking Chair Theater and the Movieland Drive-In Theatre of Sanford.

Under terms of the proposal, Martin, which operates theaters and two television stations in the southeast, would merge with Floyd Enterprises, Inc., Haines City, Fla. Floyd operates 42 theaters in central Florida, including the two Sanford houses.

The merger would be carried out through the exchange of two shares of Floyd common stock for one of Fuqua. Fuqua was quoted at 301/2 on closing last Friday on the New York Stock Exchange while Floyd was 1314 on over the counter trading.

Fuqua said Carl Floyd would remain as chairman of the board of Floyd and Harold Spears would remain as president.
