Investigators searching for suspect

Seminole County Sheriff's Department Major Crimes Unit investigators are looking for two suspects who forced their way into a home, handcuffed an 18-year old female and took a safe. It occurred just before 11 a.m. Monday in the 2000 block of Starwood Drive near Oviedo.

The victim told deputies a man came to the door claiming to have an invoice from her stepfather's business. The victim let the suspect call her stepfather on her cell phone. The suspect said the reception was bad and gave the phone back, then asking for a drink of water. Before the victim could respond, he followed her into the house, held her down, put handcuffs on her ankles and wrists, then covered her with a quilt from the home.

At that point, another man, whom the victim could not see, but only hear, came into the house. The stepfather, who had been on the phone with the suspect, sent someone from his business to check out the home. Upon arrival, the witness saw an unfamiliar black Lexus SUV parked in the garage and two men exiting the home.

One suspect fled on foot, while the other got into the SUV, ran over a palm tree and some bushes, and drove off. The witness attempted to follow the vehicle but could not keep up. Deputies and the Longwood Police Department's K-9 unit attempted to track the suspect who fled on foot, but did not have success.

The suspect was described as a Puerto Rican male, with blond hair and yellowish skin. He was wearing a hat that said Boricua. His height was estimated at between 5 foot 10 to six foot tall, age approximately

Malloy, who has served as vice chairman, was re-elected to that





eminole County Sheriff's Office employees want to make this holiday season a little brighter for more than 700 area children. All they need is the commu-

Partnering with Kids' House of Seminole County, the sheriff's office is planning the county's first United Christmas celebration. The event will benefit children who have been the subject of abuse/special needs cases investigated by the Child Protective Services (CPS) Team during 2002.

"Many of the children we deal with come from families with special needs," said Marie E. Carling, an investigator/family services specialist for CPS. "These children are in desperate need of a happy time."

The idea for the Seminole County United Christmas celebration originated after Sept. 11, 2001, Carling said. The members of CPS want-



ed to find a way to unite the community at a local level in a way the country united following

the tragic events of last year. "We wanted to bring together the individuals, churches, clubs and businesses of the communi-

ty," Carling said. "We decided Christmas seemed a key time to unite people." There is already a growing list of United

Oviedo man arrested after attempting to abduct two women

Shortly after 7 a.m. Saturday, there were two separate attempted abductions of adult females reported to the Ovledo Police Department.

The separate incidents occurred within minutes of each other in the same general area, with descriptions of a similar white male and vehicle involved in each case.

In the first case, a 26-year-old female was walking in the vicinity of Alafaya Woods and Alexandria boulevards, when she was approached by a white male in an older light blue car. After driving past repeatedly, he stopped and approached the victim, grabbing her forcibly from behind. The woman resisted and screamed, which attracted the attention of others in the area and caused the man to release her and flee in his vehicle.

Within minutes, a separate incident was reported to 9-1-1. The report was from callers with cellular phones less than a mile away, near Alafaya Woods Boulevard and Conley Drive. A white male of similar description reportedly lunged at two females, grabbing one from behind. Despite their

screams and resistance, the male overpowered a 33-year-old female, forced her into his vehicle and drove away. The victim's com-panion immediately used her cell phone and called 9-1-1, as did other nearby witnesses.

Once in the vehicle, the second victim continued to risks the man by grabbing and twisting the car's steering wheel. After a few blocks, the woman was able to jump out of the car. A couple in a passing vehicle had followed the man's vehicle and phoned in a description and tag number.

The victim's physical injures included multiple lacerations and

Oviedo police located the vehicle traveling westbound on Mitchell Hammock Road from Alafaya Woods Boulevard. On Waish Road, the driver attempted to flee his vehicle on foot, but was apprehended by Oviedo officers.

Arrested was Edward Steiner,

31, of Walsh Drive, Oviedo. He has been charged with two counts of kidnapping, two counts of battery, fleeing and attempting to elude an officer and resisting arrest without violence.

He is being held in the Seminole County Jail with no bond.

Second of three 17/92 closings to begin Friday

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has announced the second of three planned French Avenue (U.S. Highway 17-92) closings in Sanford is set to begin Friday, Nov. 22, at 8 p.m., and end no later than

Monday, Nov. 25 at 6 a.m. The closure will be at the southemmost railroad crossing at Sixth Street.

The northern crossing was closed for repairs earlier this month.

The work is to be performed by CSX Transportation, Inc. crews and their subcontractors. As with the adjoining crossing, the rubberized crossing base will be replaced with concrete segments, and a single welded section of track will span the entire four-lane roadway.

ing motorists of the impending road closure will be in place near the track crossings for a week prior to the work. The third crossing, on French

Avenue, in the vicinity of 13th Street will be reconstructed after the Christmas/New Year holi-In all, the three projects will cost an estimated \$452,000 which will

be reimbursed by the Florida Department of Transportation.

CSX Transportation, Inc. will be reimbursed by the FDOT for the cost of the three projects, which total an estimated \$452,000.

Other upcoming railroad crossing reconstruction projects include crossings on SR-46 west of Mellonville Avenue in Sanford, and SR-134 just west of CR-127 in Longwood. Both will occur after the holiday period.

Millennium sends signatures into space

When the Space Shuttle Endeavour mission STS-113 launches to exchange crew on the International Space Station, its payload will include signatures from Millennium Middle School along with about 500,000 students in the U.S. and around the world who participated in this year's Student Signatures in Space® pro-

Student Signatures in Space (S3), a program of the award-winning Space Days educational initiative, provides elementary and middle school students the opportunity to send their digitized signatures into space and to feel a personal involvement with the mission. Jointly sponsored by NASA and Lockheed Martin Corporation, the \$3 program is one component of the Space Day initiative co-chained by U.S. Sen. John Glenn.

On Space Day 2002, students at

Millennium Middle School and 550 other schools in the U.S., Canada and eight other countries signed 53 posters in anticipation of the shuttle mission this fall. The STS-113 mission will bring the total to 2.5 million student signatures flown in space since the program began in 1997. Next year's poster signing will take place on May I as a part of Space Day 2003, "Celebrating the Future of Flight."

"Student Signatures in Space is a lot of fun for kids as well as teachers, but more importantly, it sparks student interest in the space program, creates a connection to math and science studies, and brings it all home on a personal level," said April Tensen, coordinator of the S3 program.

Other Space Day educational programs include the Design Challenges and the Cyber Space Day Webcast. All are designed to inspire student interest in science, math, engineering and technology through the wonders of space.
Millennium Middle School also



Picture Perfect Cookies

Whether hosting a festive holiday get-together or attending someone else's seasonal soirce, having food to share with others is essential for successful entertaining.

Perhaps you have been searching for the perfect little gift to give to someone special. What could be better than giving - or receiving - something homemade? And, better still, something that is deliciously edible? Why not make the holidays picture-perfect with a homemade, fresh-baked batch of decorative cookies. Perfect as a party dish or even as a gift, homemade cookies are sure to warm the hearts - and the appetites - of everyone, whatever the occa-

The following festive recipe, courtesy of "Le Cordon Bleu Home Collection: Cookies" (Periplus Editions), is deliciously fun to make - it happens to be a great holiday activity for children, too!

Paintbox Cookies Makes about 36 Preparation time: 25 minutes plus 1 hour refrigeration

Buy a variety of different-sized paintbrushes and the cookies become your canvas.

11/4 cups unsalted butter, at room temperature 11/2 cups sugar

2 eggs
2 teaspoons vanilla extract
3 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon salt

4 egg yolks Red, blue, green and yellow food coloring

1. Preheat the oven to 350 F.

Brush two baking sheets with



melted butter.

2. Cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add the eggs and vanilla and beat well. Sift the flour, baking soda and salt into the mixture and combine. Wrap the dough in plastic wrap and refrigerate for about

one hour, or until firm. If it becomes too hard, leave at room temperature for about 20 minutes.

 Place each egg yolk in a separate bowl. Add a teaspoon of water and beat well with a fork.
 Add a few drops of a different food color to each one.

4. Divide the dough in half; keep half refrigerated and roll out the other half between two sheets of waxed paper to about 1/8- to 1/4-inch thickness. Cutout shapes and use enough to fill the prepared baking sheets. Use small paintbrushes to paint the cookies, adding a little extrawater to the food colorings to create a more translucent effect. Allow the "paint" to dry before baking, 5. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes, or until lightly colored. Cool on a wire rack. Repeat with the remaining modure, preparing the baking sheets as instruct-



The Colonial Room's history actually goes back further than 1977, the year Painter left the wholesale foods industry to buy the restaurant. Touchton's Drug Store operated a lunch counter for years. In 1967, the store's owners, Glen McCall and Emie Mills, expanded one building west and converted the lunch counter into a full-scale restaurant in the new space. They named it the Colonial

"There was already a sign up on the wall that said Colonial Room, so we just kept the name," Painter

The drug store and the restaurant shared a front door - you had to go through the store to get to the restaurant - and a bathroom for 16 years. Nine years ago, Painter expanded his own opera-

tions to include a banquet room and restrooms and installed his own front door.

"It was just time for us to do it,"

he said Despite purchasing an existing business, Painter said he had some doubts about the chances of success. His bosses at the wholesale food company were encouraging him to keep his job and let someone else run the restaurant.

"I told them this was something I wanted to do, and I would never know if I could make it if I didn't try it myself," Painter said.

He encouraged his wife, Dot, to keep her job, though.

"I thought she might ought to stay at the bank because we might not have anything to eat if the restaurant failed," said Painter, who was born and raised in East

It never did, though downtown Sanford suffered through some bad times. Dot eventually joined

her husband at the restaurant and still helps out with outside catering

Painter credits his success to two things: food and service.

"You don't have anything else,"

Painter spent nine years work-ing for a cafeteria chain in St. Petersburg before he got into the wholesale food business, so he knew what it would take to succeed. He started with a tried-andtrue set of recipes from his days at the cafeteria and he put together a top-notch wait staff who have been loyal to the Colonial Room and its customers.

"We've been very, very fortu-nate," Painter said. "A lot of the wait staff has been with us for many years, and that helps tremendously.

Ironically, it was the constant turnover of employees that drove him out of the restaurant business in the late 1960s.

"Trying to keep good help was extremely hard," Painter said. "I just wanted to be away from it. I didn't think I would run another

Painter points to manager Angle Graham as the reason the

Colonial Room's wait staff remains stable. Graham has been with the restaurant for, as she jokingly puts it, "17-and-a-half long years."

"Angle's good with peo-Painter "The staff knows she can be demanding, but they know she's going to be

Painter still puts in a lot of time at the restaurant. In fact, one of the cooks is on vacation, so "Mr. Bill," as he's known to his employees, is slinging the pots and pans.

"That's where the fun is anyway," he said. So what does

Painter cook when it's just him who's doing the eating? Could be a little of anything, but he has a fondness for fried bologna sandwiches, which



"In our survey of hiring inten-January/February/March peri-od," Rachel Marshal of Manpower said, "Seven percent of the firms queried plan staffing level increases. Ten percent project reductions, and 63 percent expect no changes during the winter months. The other 20 percent are uncertain of their needs."

"Three months ago, prospects : were brighter when 33 percent anticipated workforce additions, while seven percent thought payrolls were too high. At this time last year, employers were more encouraging as 30 percent predicted personal gains and 20 percent reported cutbacks were planned," she added.

During the first quarter, reductions are anticipated in wholesale/retail trade. Mixed . readings come from durable . goods manufacturing and services. Other sectors are expected .. to hold steady.

The national outlook reveals that 20 percent of the employers queried intend to staff up, while 12 percent indicate they will reduce their workforces as the new year begins. Another 62 percent plan to maintain present ievels and six percent are unsure of their plans for the quarter that includes January/February/

Statewide, the largest expected increases in jobs are expected in Sarasota (53 percent). Other large increases of 40 percent are expected in Jacksonville and Pensacola. The lowest expected if percentage of increases were listed for the Orlando area.







Continued from page 11A said Oviedo head coach Greg Register. "They were much more physical than us tonight. They took away a lot of the things we like to do on offense. Boone had a good game plan against us. We just took what

they gave us." And that's where Lingard comes in.

Less than four minutes into the game, Lingard split the Boone defense and sprinted 47 yards for the game's first touchdown. Then, with Oviedo trailing 15-7 with 2:53 left in the second quarter, Lingard pinballed around until he found some running room and went 56 yards for another touchdown.

After Boone stretched its lead to 21-13 early in the third quarter, Lingard struck again but in a most unusual way.

Facing third-and-one from their own 27-yard line, the Lions sent Lingard on a sweep to the right side. The Braves appeared to have Lingard penned in for a huge loss but he pitched the ball back to Will Harrison, who reversed the field and went 73

yards for a touchdown. Now trailing by two points pending the point after conversion, the Lions brought in

"Jumbo" - an offensive backfield that features the sizeable trio of Lingard, Clint McMillan, and LaDarian Rudolph (three of the pillars of the Oviedo defen-

sive line). Lingard bulled in behind McMillan and Rudolph to tie the score.

The Lions used Lingard as a decoy to score the go-ahead touchdown midway through the fourth quarter. As Lingard swept left, taking most of the Boone defense with him, Bobby Raulerson took the handoff, cut back to the right, and dashed 72 yards for the score.

"Howard has just one speed and that's full speed," said Register. "He's a really big part of the offense now. He fights for every yard he can get and he draws the attention of opposing defenses every time he's on the field. That creates a lot of possibilities for the rest of the offense.

Lingard finished with 149 yards rushing on 13 carries while Harrison had 103 yards on five carries. Quarterback Lee Sloan completed four of nine passes for 31 yards.

Jonathan Hurt led the Boone attack with 67 yards and two touchdowns on 26 rushes while quarterback Travis Brown was




