Burns Supporters Set Drive County Economy Strides Upward High Wins Kelly Aid

Seminole County's business economy continues to take strides forward, a record gross sales and tax collections reveal.

During March, gross sales in the area totaled \$7,104,820, an increase of 6.5 percent over the same month of last year. These figures, released by the Florida Revenue Commission, reflect a 12 percent increase for the county.

Gasoline sales and tax collections are also continuing their strong climb upward, further boosting the economy gains of Seminole.

During April of this year, 1,802.13 gallons of gasoline were sold, reflecting tax collections of \$133,147.21. This tax amount was an increase of 10.2 percent over the same month of last year.

**WASHINGTON (UPI)**—The House subcommittee yesterday took the almost unheard-of step of turning down an FBI budget request. It knocked out of a big money bill nearly \$60 million earmarked for a new FBI headquarters here.

The committee gave no reason for its action, nor did it say whether the project was permanently dead or only deferred. About \$14 million already has been spent on buying land and designing the structure.

In addition to extending the FBI headquarters, the committee also left out funds for a proposed new Labor Department building and tax court.

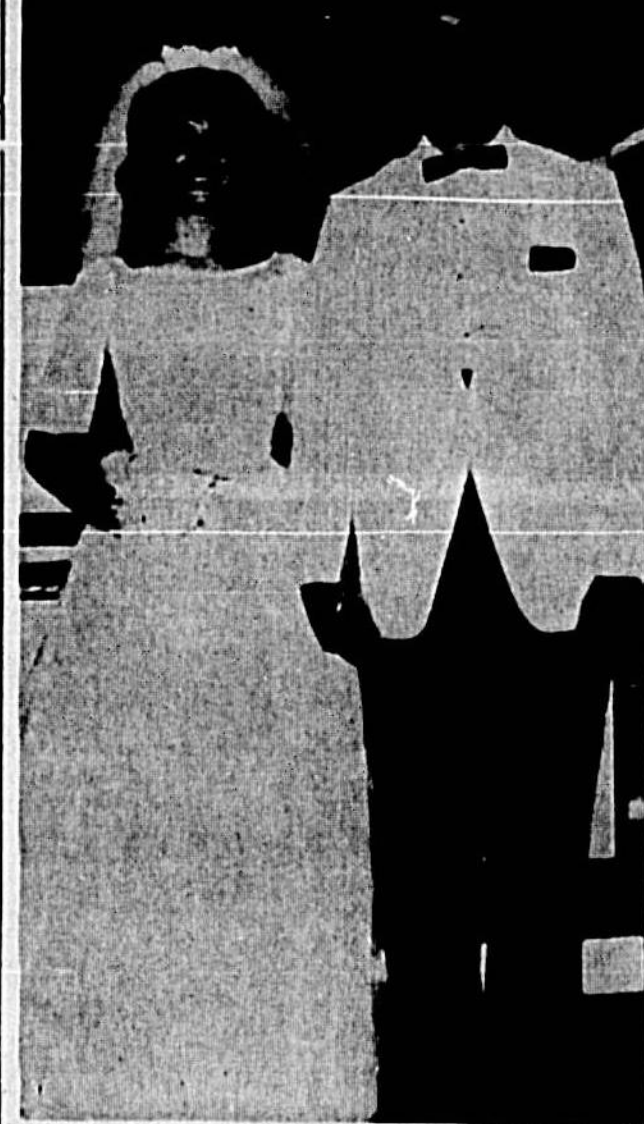

# Yank Troopers Trap VC Guerrillas

**SAIGON (UPI)** — U.S. Air Cavalry troopers today caught up with the remnants of a fleeing Viet Cong battalion and trapped them between the mountains and the South China Sea.

They killed 100 more of the enemy trying desperately to break through the tail of the two-day battle to 141.

A U.S. military spokesman said the 1st Cav troopers, using the guerrillas through jungle on heavy 81 mortar shells, had killed all survivors of escape except the sea. He said "significant contact" had been made.

"There's a lot of Viet Cong trying to get out of there and some of them haven't been successful," the spokesman said.

## United Church Of Protestants Effective In '70s

**DALLAS (UPI)** — Millions of Protestants in all parts of America will be united during the coming year in the task of planning a new church.

The new church, which thus far has no name, is scheduled to come into being sometime during the 1970s. It will be a union of eight existing denominations and will be by far the largest Protestant body in the world.

Leaders of the eight denominations—meeting in a body known as the Commission of Church Union (CCU)—reached agreement in Dallas this week on some of the basic principles to be followed in establishing the united church.

They found themselves in accord on doctrine, sacraments, worship practices and the ministry.

But they were not able to agree on how the united church should be organized and governed—specifically, how much power should be vested in the bishops and how much reserved for representative councils like synods and local congregations.

Denominations involved are the Methodist Church, the Episcopal Church, United Presbyterian Church, Southern Presbyterian Church, a Methodist Episcopal Church, United Evangelical United Brethren.

At their final session Thursday, CCU delegates voted to send four documents to their denominations to be passed along to local churches for study and comment by the 24 million people who would be affected by the union.

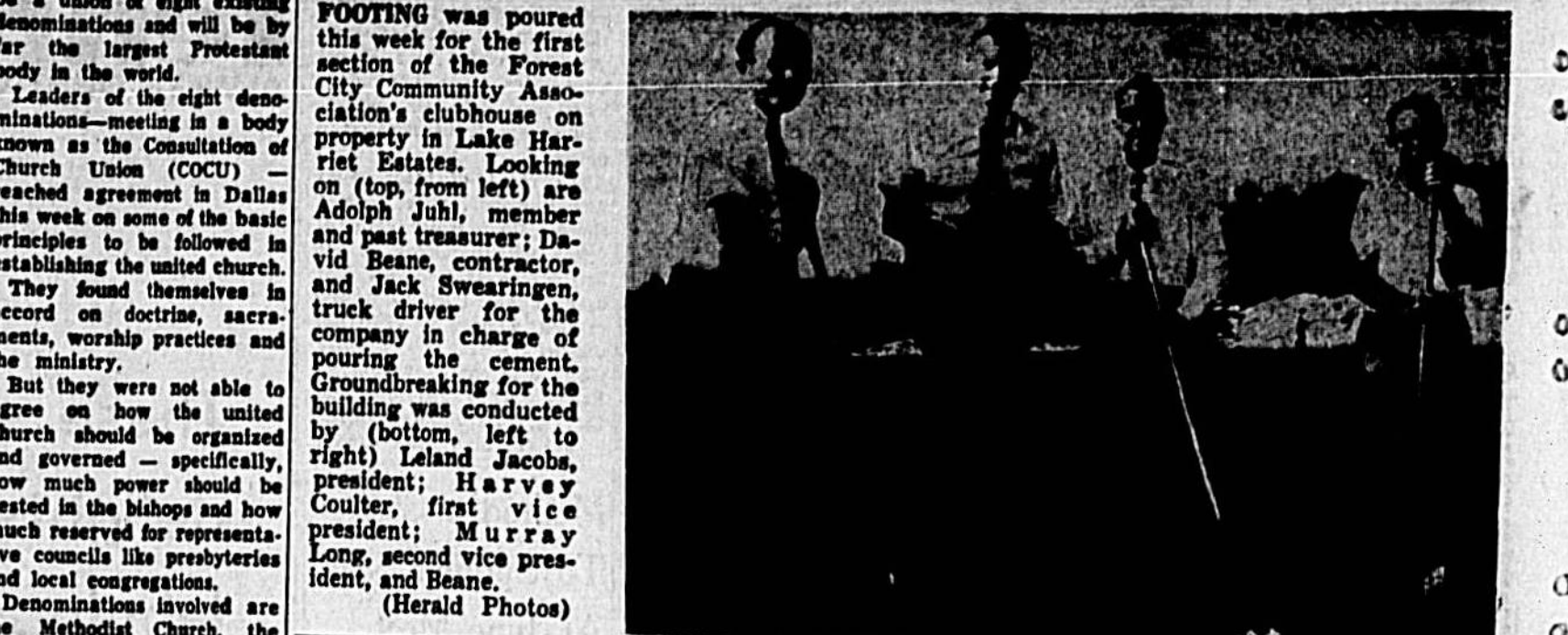

# Europe in New Role

When the 20th century began, every fifth person in the world was European. Sixty years later, the ratio was one out of seven. By the year 2000, only one out of 10 persons in this crowded world will live in Europe.

These statistics are not so much a measure of the "decline of the West" as of its eclipse.

It is not that Europe's population is stagnant. Excluding the Soviet Union, it stands at some 430 million today and is expected to increase to 600 million by the end of the century. Total world population by then, however, will have soared to six billion.

Both the present and projected populations of Europe far exceed those of either the United States or the U.S.S.R. Yet even considered as a whole, the continent's population is the affairs of the world rank well behind those of the East. This is true even in science and technology, two things which once transformed Europe and in turn made her mid-wife to the birth of the modern world.

In 1962, says Science magazine, the United States spent nearly twice as much of its gross national income on scientific research and development as Europe. In that year the United States and U.S.S.R. had more than 400,000 scientists and engineers at work while Europe had 160,000.

Adding to this imbalance, the United States absorbs about five per cent of the cream of Europe's yearly output of scientists and engineers—the so-called "brain drain."

In a recent year, West European countries paid five and a half times as much for rights to use U.S. patents as Americans paid Europeans.

Europe, of course, cannot yet be considered as a whole, despite the beginning steps taken by its major nations toward economic, if not political, unity. Old nationalistic barriers to the free interflow of people and ideas remain the greatest obstacles to the continent's realizing its full potential in the last half of the 20th century.
