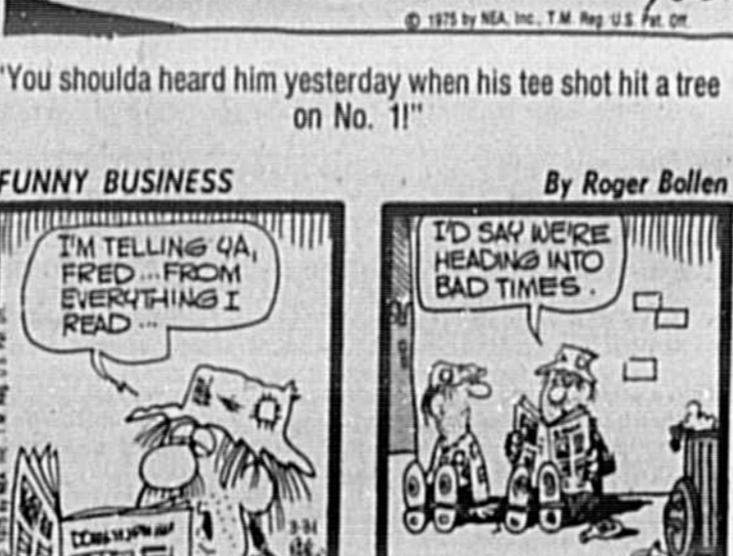

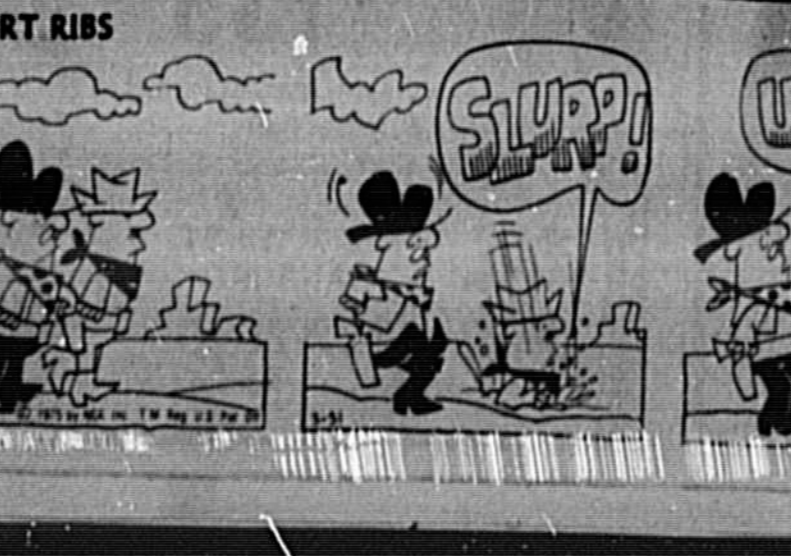
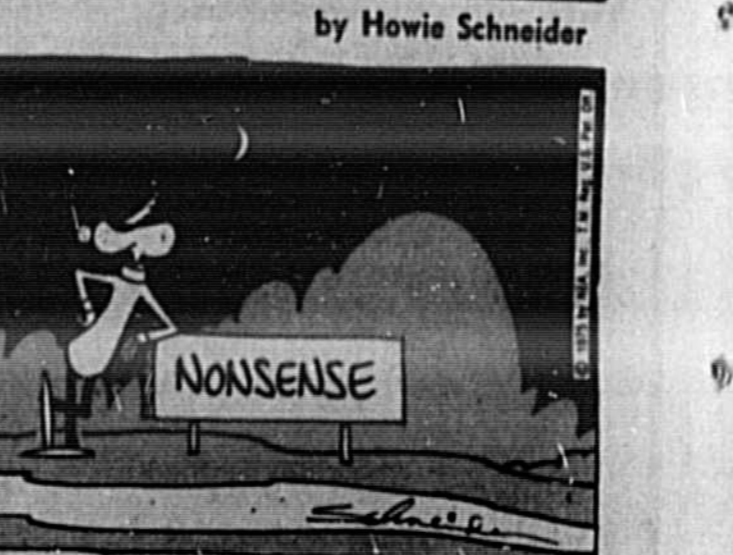

Brownlee Addresses Chamber 'Personality Breakfast' 'Action Orlando' Gains Attention



The Greater Orlando Property Sale, a segment of the 'Action Orlando' promotional campaign, is attracting national attention and drawing response from interested industrialists to the Central Florida Area, including Seminole County, an Orlando Area Chamber of Commerce official said today.

Tom Brownlee, executive vice president of the Orlando Chamber, brought the members of the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce up-to-date during Sanford's 'Personality Breakfast' on the public relations campaign.

'Action Orlando,' while initiated by the Orlando Chamber, is aimed towards boosting the economy of the three-county area of Seminole, Orange and Osceola.

"Everything we're going to do is going to be done in the three counties. This is the way it's got to be," Brownlee said.

Brownlee said the Sanford Municipal Airport will be a "tremendous asset to the whole area" and will be included in the promotional material circulated in the campaign.

The 'Property Sale,' which began March 14 for a six-week period, is a promotional idea to offer industrialists a rebate on real estate purchased in the area.

Area Industrial Parks officials agreed to work with 'Action Orlando' program to offer the rebates, Brownlee said.

Brownlee said there has been a surge of telephone calls and written inquiries into the 'property sale.'

The 'Action Orlando' program was put in gear in late 1974 when members of the Orlando Chamber saw the hurt in the economy was hurting the pocketbooks of the area businesses.

"It was not a favorable

report," Brownlee said. After an investigation into other cities working to solve similar urban problems, Brownlee said a New York Public Relations firm was sought and other area chambers were solicited to join in the campaign.

The firm of Harrah-Rotman-Druke was selected to head up the three-year campaign to attract national attention to the Central Florida area.

Brownlee said a \$450,000 budget "to be stretched" over the three-year period was established and to be funded by donations from individuals and companies in the area.

Brownlee said 45 per cent of the total campaign budget will be devoted for industrial development.

To date, the program is \$28,000 short of reaching the budget figure, Brownlee said.

He said he is expecting between \$20,000 and \$25,000 in total donations from Seminole County.

A steering committee to help guide the campaign also has been established with representatives from the three counties.

Representing Seminole County are Everett Huskey, Bob Harrell, Bill Baker and Georges St. Laurent. Also on the committee are eight representatives of Orange County and one from Osceola.

LONGWOOD — Council Chairman J. R. Grant's continual reminder that the city's coffers are bare bore fruit last night.

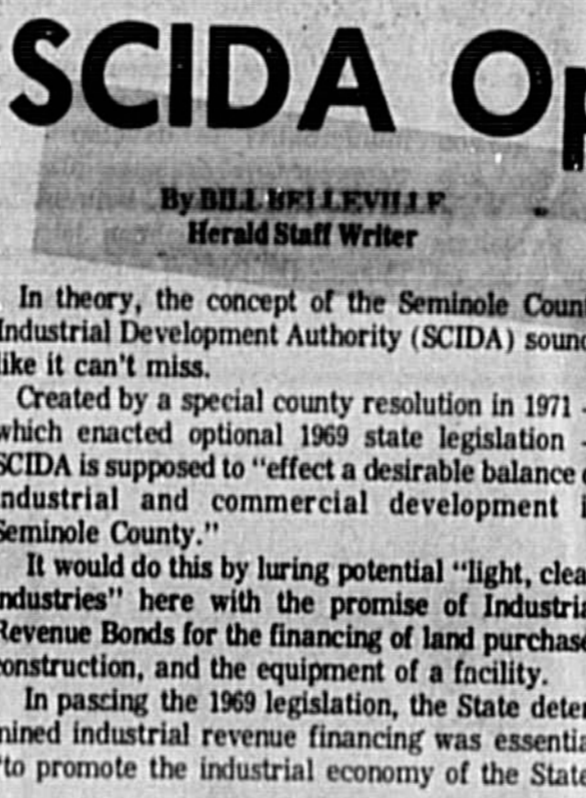
"I'll buy the six inch pipe and three fire hydrants if the city provides the labor for installation," builder Al Stolle said in answer to Grant's reminder.

SCIDA Operation Looks Great--On Paper, At Least

In theory, the concept of the Seminole County Industrial Development Authority (SCIDA) sounds like it can't miss.

Created by a special county resolution in 1971 which enacted optional 1969 state legislation — SCIDA is supposed to "effect a desirable balance of industrial and commercial development in Seminole County."

It would do this by luring potential "light, clean industries" here with the promise of Industrial Revenue Bonds for the financing of land purchase, construction, and the equipment of a facility.

In passing the 1969 legislation, the State determined industrial revenue financing was essential "to promote the industrial economy of the State."

Analysis

But in SCIDA's four years of reign, bonds for only one industry, Continental Coffee, have been issued. And, as one government official admits, "seven agencies were standing in line to take credit for Continental's location here."

In four years, SCIDA has gone through three directors and is currently searching for a fourth. Steve Dvorzhak, who served for two weeks.

The county has budgeted \$181,862 of the taxpayers' money for SCIDA's operation since 1971 — most of which goes to a director's salary and for advertising the merits of the county to the rest of the world — but has spent only \$28,000. The discrepancies in these figures is explained by the large gaps that have elapsed between the control of a director; no director means no salary and no one to authorize advertising expenditures.

Board members have come and gone, the five-member board is currently one member short, and the originator and current SCIDA chairman both feel that the agency has a serious problem.

"When I authored the idea of SCIDA four years ago," former County Commissioner Greg Drummond explains, "it was with the idea that it would protect us against the crucial economic situation we're going through now."

"Right now, it doesn't define the expense that it's costing the county," Drummond says the county "should do what it takes to get SCIDA functioning again." Before it's "killed off, a concerted effort

Payton Gets Probation In Parade Accident Case

A 19-year-old Seminole Junior College student accused of hitting two Seminole High School students with his car in a Christmas Parade band staging area on Seminole Boulevard Dec. 5 was put on three years supervised probation yesterday by Circuit Court Judge Clarence T. Johnson Jr.

Johnson meted the probation on Joseph Randolph Payton on a contest plea to two counts of culpable negligence and fleeing or attempting to elude pursuing police after the traffic incident in which he allegedly ran through barricades and was apprehended by officers near his 120 Shirley Ave. home after a 10 block chase.

The court noted that "a number of petitions have been received from the community. A lot of people are concerned with what you've done. They want you removed from Seminole County."

Johnson also noted from court records that is August 1974 Payton was convicted in New Smyrna Beach of passing in a no passing zone and fleeing or attempting to elude police and paid fines totaling \$202.

Payton was placed on one year probation, in that case, Johnson said, on a misdemeanor possession of marijuana charge.

In the December incident in Sanford, State Atty. Abbott Herring's office dropped charges of driving while intoxicated and failure to stop at the scene of an accident with injuries charges against Payton as part of the negotiated no contest plea to the other three charges.

"The fact that you were drinking is absolutely no defense or justification," Johnson lectured Payton. "I'm just glad, at this point, that somebody caught you before someone was killed. You're a menace on the road."

As part of the three years probation, Payton's driving privileges are suspended for two years. Child in apparent inability to handle alcohol in Orlando.

Bentsen: Main Issue Will Be The Economy

U.S. Sen. Lloyd Bentsen (D-Texas), announced candidate in the 1976 Democratic presidential bid, said in Orlando yesterday the country's economy will be the top issue on the voters' minds when it comes time to elect another president.

"The main issue will be the economy and what to do about it," Bentsen said during a brief press conference at McCoy Jet Port.

Bentsen, 54, traveled to Jacksonville last night in a jaunt around the state "to get better acquainted with the state and gain support" for his push to win the Democratic nomination.

Although the Texas millionaire did not commit himself to running in the Florida primary, he did say that his name will be on the ballot "in a number of the larger state primaries and Florida is a big primary."

He said at the present time the public has not decided on a candidate for the 1976 election.

Bentsen, after serving three terms in Congress, left Washington politics and returned to Texas where he built a financial ring of properties with a life insurance company, banks, savings and loans, a mutual funds company and a financial holding company.

Bentsen said the conservative, was elected to the Senate in 1970.

The fact that he has had non-Washington experience, as well as Washington experience, Bentsen said will be an "asset" to the strength of his campaign.

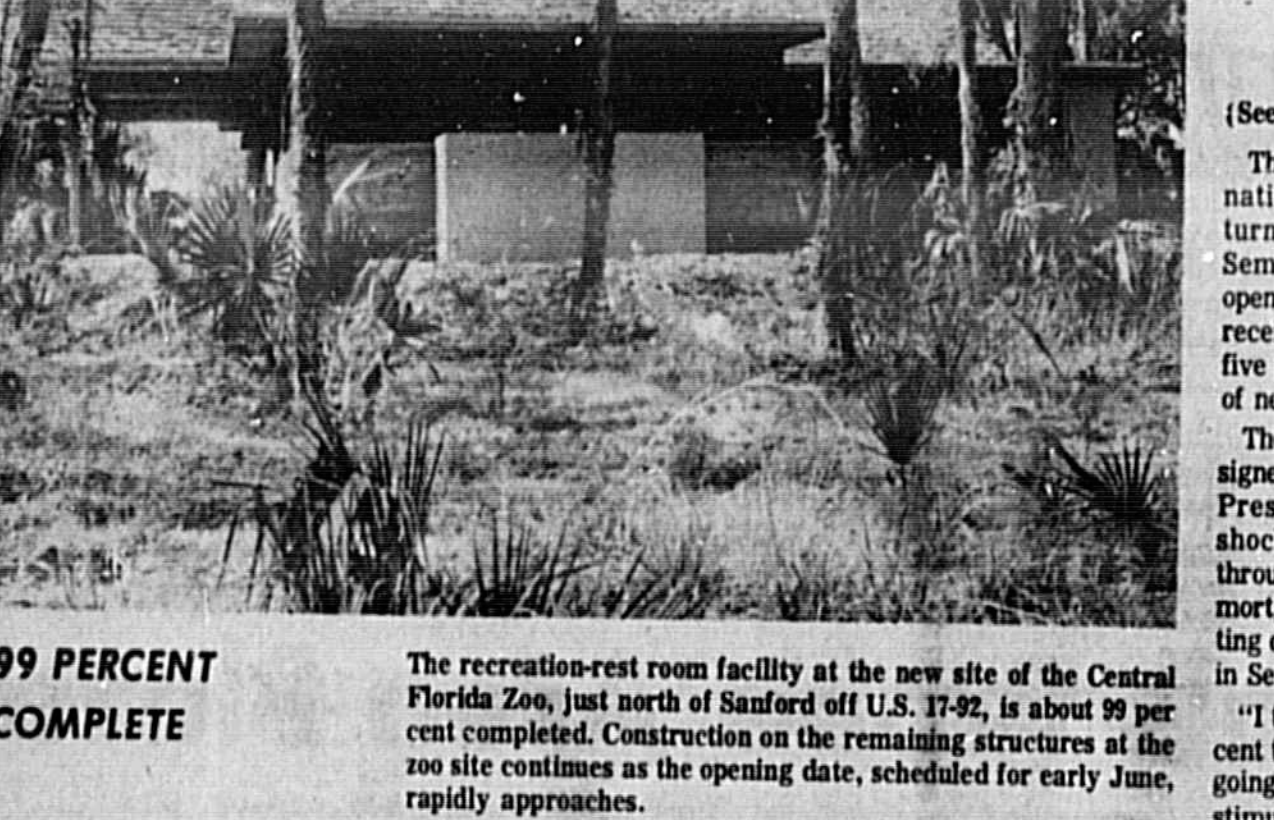

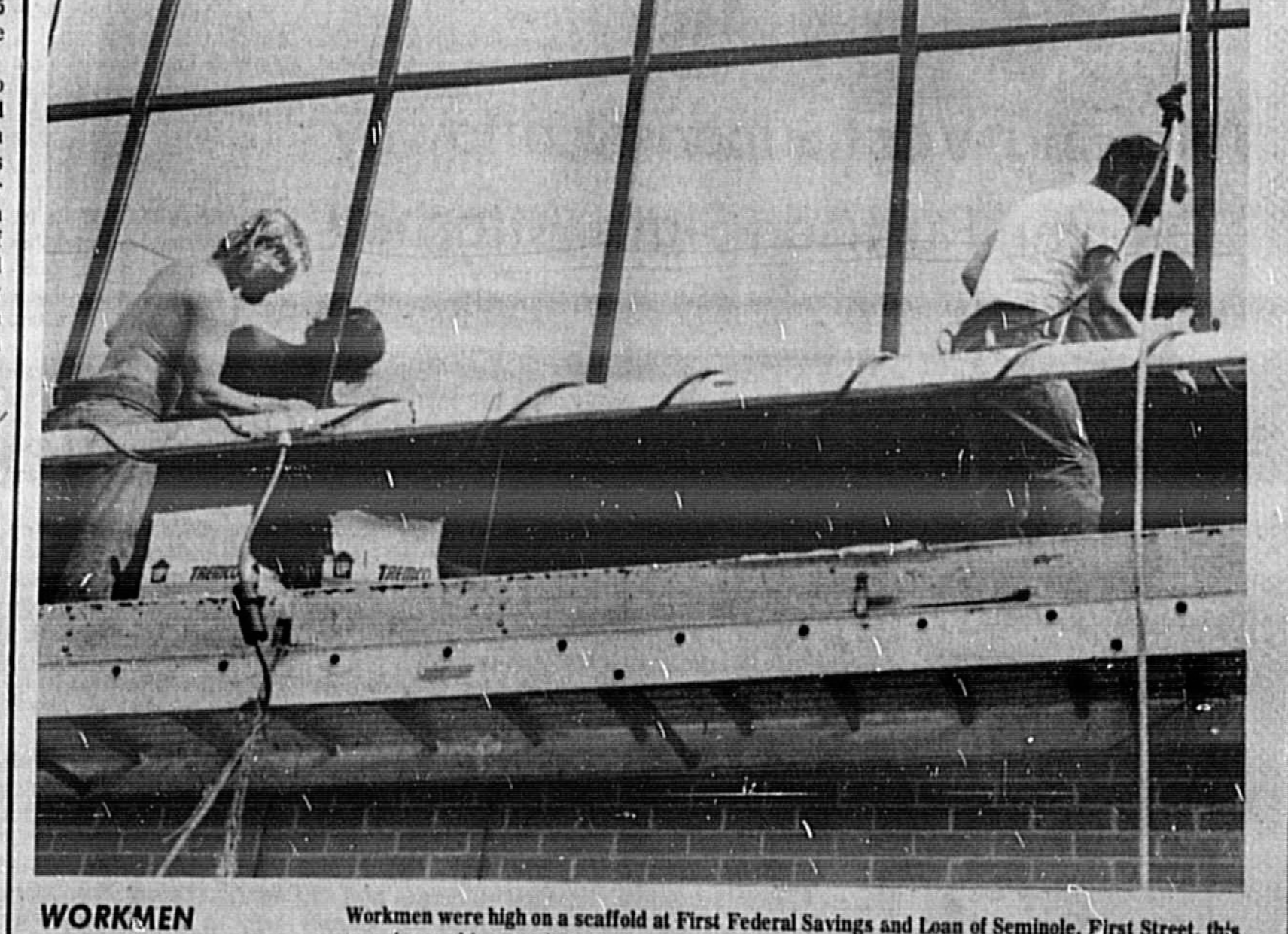
