AUGUSTA, Ga. (AP) - Doctors say Mamie Eisenhower will remain in a Ft. Gordon hospital longer than first expected to allow her to regain strength while she recovers from intestinal problems. Maj. George Foster, a spokesman for the U.S. Army Medical Center, said Monday the 79-year-old former first lady had begun eating a normal diet and increasing her

The doctors "would like to see her remain longer than the 10 days originally estimated, not because of her illness, but in order to have her gain nutritional strength

#### Oil Overcharges Paid Back

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Federal Energy Administration says it has investigated almost 90,000 cases in its year-old probe of petroleum overcharging, involving companies from the oil giants to the smallest fuel retailers. With only a fraction of the cases completed, the FEA has made companies pay back more than \$611 milestimated to total anywhere from \$50 million to \$250

# Altamonte Springs Seeks Taxation Repeal

Banker Says He Gave Treasurer \$10,000 Gift

TALLAHASSE, Fla. (AP) - A banker says he gave Treasurer Thomas O'Malley \$10,000 because he thought it would help his bank keep a state account. Elmer G. Banks, president of the ComBank Corp. of Orlando, outlined in a deposition his role in allegedly giving O'Malley \$10,000 about four years ago. The deposition, taken on March 22 at Orlando by O'Malley defense attorney Edward Booth of Jacksonville, was filed late last week in Leon County circuit court. #### Overdose Claims Heir

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. (AP) - Keith Johnson. young heir to the Johnson & Johnson pharmaceutical fortune, died alone in his apartment with a blue belt tied loosely around his forearm and a sack of cocaine nearby, Police said Monday that Johnson was killed by an over-

dose of the cocaine. Johnson, 25, was found dead Sunday when his landlady took the hinges off his door to get into the apartment. Police said he was lying face down with his hands under his abdomen. They said a needle, syringe, spoon and glass of liquid were also found in the apartment. Police said a test of the substance at the apartment was 99 per cent conclusive that it was cocaine but that a toxologist's report was ordered to specify the cause of

### Lon Nol Leaves Cambodia

For Indonesia, U.S. PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (AP) - President Lon Nol

left Cambodia for Indonesia and the United States today after expressing hope that his departure would open the way to peace negotiations with the Khmer Rouge in-The ailing 61-year-old president and an entourage of 27, including Premier Long Boret and their families, took off

in a jetliner for Thailand as insurgents rockets fell on the Phnom Penh airport. Military sources said the government operation against the insurgent firing positions northwest of the airport was "temporarily suspended" as troops were moved back to

bolster the capital's northern defense line. Five howitzer rounds exploded 100 yards away as Lon Nol was helped from a helicopter that took him to the airport from his presidential palace. He walked about 10 yards with the aid of a cane and waved weakly before three escorts helped him up the steps into the Air Cambodge Caravelle.

#### High Oil Prices To Remain

JEDDAH, Saudi Arabia (AP) - Prince Saud, Saudi Arabia's new state minister for foreign affairs, says he does not foresee a change in foreign policy in the wake of the assassination of his father, King Faisal, nor any reduction in oil prices "unless new factors come into

"In real terms there has been a drastic reduction in the value of oil since the freezing of prices," the Americaneducated, 34-year-old prince said in an interview with three Western correspondents.

Saud was Oil Minister Ahmed Zaki Yamani's deputy until King Khaled moved him to the foreign ministry. He said that uncertainties and instability in the oil situation are due to the failure to resolve such basic international issues as inflation, transfer of technology from industrialized to developing nations, prices of raw materials including energy, and marketing of industrial products in the developing nations.

#### Speedy Conquests Continue

By The Associated Press Communist forces continued their speedy conquest of

the central coast of South Vietnam today as the Saigon government abandoned Qui Nhon, the country's third largest city. The North Vietnamese pushed close to Nha Trang, another big coastal city 100 miles south of Qui Nhon and 200 miles northeast of Saigon. The Saigon command reported fighting at Duc My and

Minh Hoa, district capitals 15 miles north of Nha Trang but other sources said North Vietnamese sappers had been spotted inside Nha Trang. The sources said most government administrative and military staffs had been evacuated from the threatened city, the U.S. Consulate was planning to reduce its staff and many Vietnamese

# For Wooden

SAN DIEGO (AP) - And the beat goes on for UCLA, if not for John Wooden. The Maestro and his changing cast of characters - that remarkable duo of wisdom and talent - have left an imprint on their sport that will forever be felt.

College basketball's greatest combination, its leader directing his pupils in a textbook display for the last time, showed it had not grown rusty with age, or incapable without a superstar. The team and the man did it for the 10th time in 12 years. "Everyone would like to go out with a victory," said the professorial Wooden who gave his last lesson Monday night as

his beloved Bruins gave their coach a tremendous last hurrah a 92-85 victory over physical Kentucky in the NCAA's title game. "The fact that that the victory is for the national champion ship ...well, that certainly doesn't lessen the pleasure," the 64year-old Wooden said as he bade farewell to a 40-year coaching career, a love affair with excellence which may never be

If this UCLA team — one of Wooden's favorites — didn't have a Jabbar or a Walton, it did have something else. The Bruins had Wooden's directions, his sometimes fiery presence, and with it they played nerveless basketball, exercising an old UCLA tactic called game control.

Wooden switched defenses to cool Kentucky's hot Kevin Grevey. He used his only substitute —7-foot-1 Ralph Drollinger — to offset Kentucky's powerful bulk. He designed, in a very rare Monday morning practice, a play to free Pete Trgovich, and it was responsible for the Bruins taking control late in the first half after Kentucky had led most of the first 15 minutes. And then he and the Bruins controlled the game's tempo, shutting off Kentucky every time the Wildcats rallied.


"We hoped to wear 'em down with a fast tempo," said Wooden. "We felt that we had to run on them and keep running. And it worked out exactly as we planned."

Burglar Crimes Increase: Make Your Home Secure

WOMEN

Every eight minutes, a house is burgled Statistics like these make it imperative to consider a security system as part of the "game plan" for your apartment or condominium. The whole idea is to make it as difficult as possible to enter your place so that the would-be intruder will pass you by for an easier mark. Primary attention should be given to the locks. Some landlords cut costs by installing inferior locks. One of the first steps should be a talk with the local locksmith to see if your locks need improving.

stalled over a keyed lock. Padlocks, the combination type in particular, are the best for garage storage areas. It is important that a padlock is installed properly so that all screws are covered with a hasp. Don't forget to remove the identifying number on the bottom of the lock or someone can use it to have a key made.

It doesn't hurt to consider a second lock for windows. Often prowlers will obtain access by cutting the glass and reaching in to unlock a window. This becomes much more difficult if there is a lock on both the upper and lower portions of the window.

Sliding glass doors are almost impossible to secure. The best advice is to use bolts and slide boards.

Also check the frame to make sure it is securely in-Another precaution is to mark furniture and other

household possessions. Some police departments will loan out a special tool which can be used to engrave furnishings with the owner's driver's license number. After this is completed, the homeowner receives a sticker for his window which certifies that the contents have been marked.

If you are building a condominium, you might consider one of the many electronic alarm devices. One of my clients instlled a system throughout his home, but neglected the skylight. A prowler entered by removing the glass panes of the skylight, but fortunately, the alarm sounded when he came through the kitchen door. Portable alarm units also are available for people who rent.

Skylights, as well as air conditioning units, ventilation ducts, shafts and vent spaces in attics and underneath houses provide an access for intruders. Metal screening and iron bars can be used to provide an obstacle without hindering the effectiveness of the system.

With modern ventilation systems, it is possible to seal windows so that they can be permanently shut. This prevents anyone from entering, but also makes it difficult to exit in case of emergency, so always leave "escape

windows" in bedrooms. The cost of being secure is minimal. A little planning can do a lot to keep your place from becoming another






