

Judge Hears Arguments

To Close Boston School

BOSTON (AP) - A federal judge, having made a personal inspection of South Boston High School, will hear final arguments on a motion to close the racially troubled school that has been a center of antibusing protest in

U.S. District Court Judge W. Arthur Garrity Jr. heard testimony Monday on the motion filed by the NAACP and visited the school Wednesday. Closing arguments are scheduled before him today.

The Boston chapter of the NAACP asked for closing of the school on grounds of racial harassment discrimination and mistreatment. It has been racked by disturbances, demonstrations and racial fights among pupils both this year and under last year's original deseg-

King's Widow Called In Probe

NAIROBI, Kenya (AP) - Coretta King, widow of slain civil rights leader Martin Luther King, has called for a assassination, which she says was apparently the result of a government conspiracy.

Mrs. King, who is in Nairobi on a three-nation African tour, commented on the admission by the FBI that it undertook a harassment campaign to discredit King, and a subsequent order by Atty. Gen. Edward Levi of a review of the agency's investigation of King's shooting death in 1968. James Earl Ray pleaded guilty to the killing in Memphis, Tenn., and was sentenced to 99 years in prison.

"The way he was documented and followed around by Hoover and the CIA when he was abroad, it would have to have been attached to the forces of our government that felt he was a threat to the system as it existed," Mrs. King said, referring to the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency and the late FBI chief J. Edgar Hoover.

Rains Help Stop L.A. Fires LOS ANGELES (AP) - "The rains were the biggest fire fighter we had," said one weary fireman as two brush Angeles were contained. In five days, the fires charred 100 square miles of land,

Couple Spend 4 Days On Raft

LOS ANGELES (AP) - On a quiet day of fishing, Allen Zovar and Susan Shepherd were blown out to sea to spend four days in a rubber raft surrounded by sharks, overwhelmed by waves and without food or water. "It's the happiest Thanksgiving of our lives," Zovar

said Thursday when they were picked up after rowing to an island. "We just kept our faith up, kept our will power up. And we prayed a lot." Zovar, 32, a physical therapist, said he and Miss Shep-

herd, 26, a nurse who is separated from her husband and prefers to use her maiden name, "drank our own urine, and that saved us." Both were reported in good condition and were not hospitalized.

Holiday Mail Crunch Expected

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Postal Service, which has posted new limitations on overtime and hiring extra workers because of its \$7-million-a-day deficit, says it still can handle what may be its busiest holiday mail season. More than 9 billion pieces of mail are expected to move through the nation's post offices between today and Christmas Eve.

An additional burden could be mass mailings b businesses in advance of the Dec. 28 increase in postal rates. The cost of mailing a first class letter is scheduled to increase from 10 cents to 13 cents.

Planes Bombs Found In Time

MIAMI (AP) - A jetliner on which two timebombs were found would have been in the air when the devices were to explode, officials say.

Police said the bombs were found on the Bahamasair plane Thursday just minutes before 62 holiday travelers were to board the Nassau-bound flight. Airline official Thomas Hughes said the plane's schedule would have put it in the air on a return flight to the U.S. at noon, when the devices were set to explode

The Next Move Up To Brezhnev

That tough statement by U. S. Secretary of State Henry Kissinger that a summit meeting between President Ford and Soviet Leader Leonid Brezhnev depends upon progress in strategic arms limitation negotiations should help bring Americans down to earth

In recent days citizens have been placing a strategic arms limitations treaty, and detente with the Soviet Union in general, in the context of the dismissal of James R. Schlesinger as secretary of defense. Many believe that the removal of Mr. Schlesinger, a hawk toward the Russians, would make thing easier for Mr. Kissinger, who has the reputation of being more willing to accommodate.

The message that Mr. Kissinger has conveyed to Americans is that progress in SALT depends on the Soviet Union, not on domestic politics. And at the moment, Soviet leaders are cooling toward the United States — in the United Nations, in the Middle East and in arms discussions.

There could be many reasons why this is true the illness of Brezhnev, problems with China or the impending visit of President Ford to China, reaction to President Sadat's successful trip to the United States of America, efforts to divert attention from Soviet assistance to guerrillas in Angola, an attempt to influence U. S. politcs at a time when a new secretary of defense is breaking in, or any one of a number of other reasons.

In the United States, many citizens will take a cynical view of Mr. Kissinger's warning to Russia. Some already are saying that the timing of his hard line position is calculated to offset criticism in Congress and elsewhere over the removal of Mr. Schlesinger as secretary of defense.

Those who spend too much time worrying about motivations are really missing the point, we believe. Soviet goals have not changed nor have their tactics. They are seeking to advance their national revolutionary interests, as they always have, and they are blowing hot and cold, as they always have.

The Soviet Union engaged in periods of accommodation in 1921 when Lenin started entering into diplomatic relations with capitalist nations, after the United States and Russia established relations in 1933, and after summits at Camp David in the 1950s and Glassboro in the 1960s. Periods of frost always followed.

By the same token the U.S. position has not changed. The State Department has been saying all along that it now is up to the Soviet Union to respond to U. S. proposals for placing Soviet bombers and U.S. cruise missiles into the fabric of SALT. Moscow apparently refuses to do so. Consequently SALT is still stalled and a summit meeting is postponed.

Under the present circumstances a meeting between President Ford and Brezhnev can be only ceremonial and misleading, giving the impression that all is going well when it is not.

Desert Democracy

When hundreds of thousands of Moroccans marched into the Spanish Shara, Prince Juan Carlos of Spain stood firm, refusing to yield the territory to Morocco. Now that the march has fizzled, Spain and Morocco are amicably agreeing that the Spanish Sahara should be divided between Morocco and Mauritania.

The contradiction makes the stage dressing obvious and distasteful. King Hassan of Morocco will be strenghtened politically because his march on the Sahara succeded after all. Prince Carlos will be strengthened politically because he stood firm against the threat of force, but not held responsible for the loss of the Sahara because Spain didn't really want the territory anyway. It will continue to get its share of the \$280 million annual income from the Sahara's phosphate mines and that's what

In the meantime, the annexation of the Sahara will be legitimized by a referendum - after 45,000 Saharans who are living in Morocco take part in the voting to make sure that it turns our right. Chances are that most of the 80,000 real residents of the Sahara, most of whom are illiterate nomads. won't know about the election anyway.

U.S. Aid: Always A Wrong Bet

WASHINGTON - (NEA) - Something is radically wrong with our foreign aid program. The objective in many - perhaps most cases is to enable independent countries to hold on to their independence, and to subtly encourage those internal changes which make for better lives for the people of those lands. These objectives bolster U. S. security in that they help foster a more stable world and help ensure the political - economic - military balance is not hoplessly tilted toward the totalitarian states. We succeeded in these aims remarkably well in the original Marshall Plan for the recovery of

Western Europe. But we have since done poorly in other areas of the world. Most recent invasions and totalitarian takeovers have been invited by internal instabilities - or by economic conditions and government competency degenerating so steadily that citizens lost hope. Or they have been triggered by some group in the area with a long history of suffering.

Though the Israeli-Arab conflict is of a different type, here again the instability, economic poverty and lack of hope within the scattered Palestinian communities has been an age-long sore which led to terrorism and exacerbated the tensions between Jews and Arabs.

Having covered foreign aid in detail since the original Marshall Plan, I have been surprised and shocked that in the countries we aided in recent years, we have spent far too little in technological assistance for improvements in government, education and economic growth for the citizen and far too much inproviding or selling arms - which frequently made even more weapons essential in the end if the country being assisted was to be saved.

Even where improved defenses are needed. what's required to nip conflict in the bud, more often than not, is an improved police force and constabulary. That includes improved techniques, equipment, organization and attitude. The inefficient, blundering, strongarming police systems in many of the countries which require assistance are an open invitation



WASHINGTON (AP) - Teny Hsiao-Ping, who may succeed Mao Tse-Tung, reportedly is strengthening his power base; and U.S. intelligence officials say President Ford should pay close attention to him during his trip next week to the People's Republic of China. Teng is considered by many

analysts to be the most powerful leader in China, second only to Mao. Now vice premier and nominally subordinate to ailing Pre-

mier Chou en-Lai, Teng has been slowly building his power

For example, U.S. in elligence sources say Teng recently was instrumental in moving Chen Hsi-Lien, the Peking region military commander and a Teng ally, into position to become defense minister. Also, Teng has been shifting certain provincial leaders around to prevent them from establishing their own power bases, analysts say.

The current reading by U.S. ntelligence is that Teng at the east will become the top figure in a collective leadership after the deaths of Mao, 82, and Chou,

However, the analysts believe Teng is likely to emerge as dominant if he is able to consolidate his power base enough to repel challenges principally from the radica



Why God Allows Wars Q. How can God put up with all that's happening in the world? Why doesn't He stop all the wars and violence? A. God made us free moral agents. And in order to stop all wars and violence He'd have to take away our power of choice. Then man would become a robot or a puppet that God

to do His will, which is always good. But He wants it to come out of a willing heart. As long as the human race has the power of choice, they will choose, a lot of bad things. Do you remember the story of Noah and the flood? He never turns that love off, in the hope that it will reach the deepest part of us and our own choice will bring us to a decision for our lives to be changed. When we as individuals begin to want God's way more than our own and to do things His way, then the wars and violence will stop.







Spaziano Trial Is Postponed

The rape trial of 30-year-old former Outlaw motorcycle gang member Joseph Robert "Crazy Joe" Spaziano that had been scheduled for next week has been postponed until the week of Jan. 26.

Spaziano is accused of raping a 30-year-old south Seminole woman on Dec. 26, 1973. The trial postponement was made in circuit court after both the prosecutor and defense attorney Edward Kirkland sought the delay. A document in the court file indicates the state may call as witnesses in the rape case persons named as witnesses against Spaziano in a murder trial now scheduled at Sanford for the week of Dec. 8.

Spaziano was indicted for first-degree murder in th August 1973 death of an Orlando woman whose decomposing remains were found on an Altamonte Springs garbage dump.

Addresses of five state witnesses, including former Outlaw gang members, have been ordered kept secret by the court because of alleged threats against their lives, according to documents in the court file on the murder

Sapaziano is accused of murdering Laura Lynn Harberts, an 18-year-old Orlando hospital clerk. A second decomposing female body found on the trash heap still hasn't been identified, according to investigators, and no charges have been made in the second

Spaziano is already serving a life sentence for rape in Orange County.
