On the waterfront

Sanford works on wording for ballot referendum on development

SANFORD - To develop or not to develop...that is a question that is likely to go before the people of Sanford in November.

The Sanford City Commission has taken the first steps toward putting the question of the development of a hotel-conference center complex in Fort Mellon Park to the people.

Although commissioners put off a formal vote on the matter until August, they did direct the staff to begin working on the wording of a proposed referendum to put on the ballot in November.

A citizens group, the Society for the Preservation of Fort Mellon Park, has been collecting signatures in an effort to get such a measure on the ballot. So far, the group says it has gathered more than 1,300 signatures, a little less than half the number it will need, to force the matter to a vote. They would need 15 percent of the registered voters in Sanford to sign a petition to put it on the November ballot.

Now, the city is considering the same thing. Developer Joseph Pacitti asked the city to hold the referendum.

He told Mayor Larry Dale that he did not want to continue to put money into the development project until he was certain that it was something the citizens of Sanford would support. He has already invested about \$50,000 in the project, but will pull out if the citizens make it clear they do not want the complex.

Commissioner Veima Williams said she is concerned the developer may be scared away from Sanford. Still, she said, she supports allowing the people to have some say in the matter.

"It's hard enough to get a developer to even consider Sanford," she said.

Dale believes the referendum will prove to Pacitti that Sanford will support the proposed development.

Doug Groeclose, who heads the Society for the Preservation of Fort Mellon

Final salute to fallen deputy



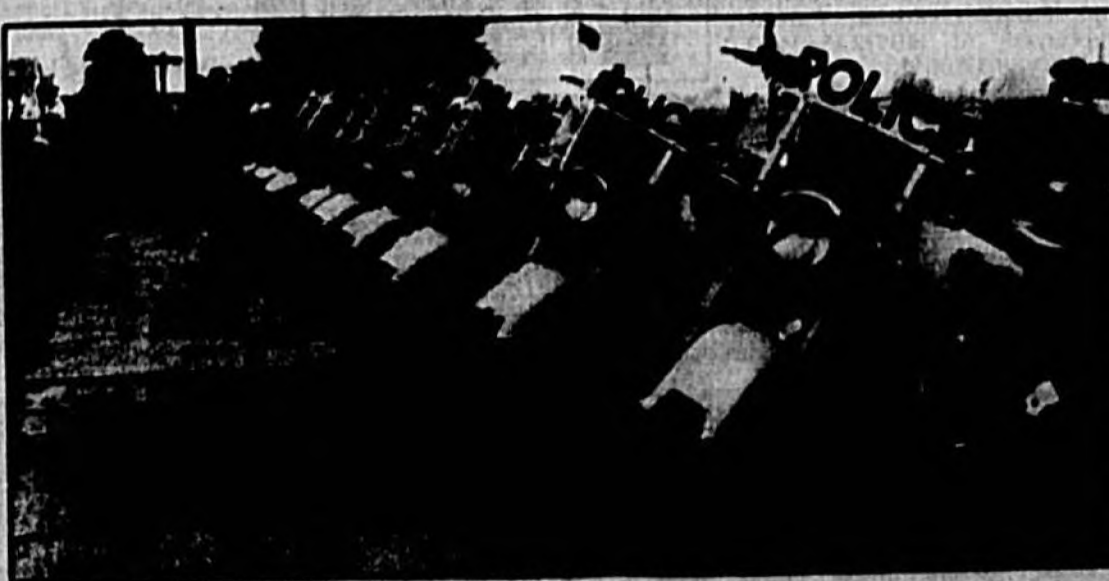

'He was not only a fine officer but a good friend'

SANFORD - Of those 900 or so who attended Monday's memorial service for slain Sheriff's Deputy Eugene Gregory, few experienced first-hand the fury of the night last week when the man they call "Stetson" was gunned down under a full moon in Geneva.

Lt. Sammy Gibson and Deputy Scott McLeod knew as did others who were under fire until Alan Singletary was killed after a 13-hour standoff. Gibson and McLeod were wounded and are recovering nicely. Both attended the service - Gibson in a wheelchair and McLeod with his right arm in a sling.

McLeod owes much gratitude to the county's assistant fire chief, Chris Johnson, who dodged bullets from Singletary to help carry the wounded deputy to his Bronco and then to an ambulance.

"We wanted to get to Gene Gregory," Johnson said. "He had been hit 15 minutes or so before we got to the scene. We didn't know if he were alive or not. He was not only a fine officer but a good friend. We went toward him the best we could."

Although Johnson had no bulletproof vest or protection, he said he felt secure because six deputies were with him.

Then, Singletary shot McLeod.

"The full moon made it awfully easy for him (Singletary)," Johnson said. "He saw every move we made. There was no way we could get to him. There was a SWAT team on the way. This would be up to them."

Johnson said that he thought immediately of Gene Gregory and the assistance he gave the fire department during the recent brush fires in Geneva. "He was always there, helping to evacuate people or clear out the scene," Johnson said. "He was a great guy. It's awful to think he had to be killed this way."

It was evident that when no one heard anything from Gregory that he was no longer alive. Johnson said. The 55-year-old deputy would lie alone until the last shots were fired and the area secured. Singletary may have shot the deputy in the back of the head after wounding him initially.

Earlier this year, Johnson

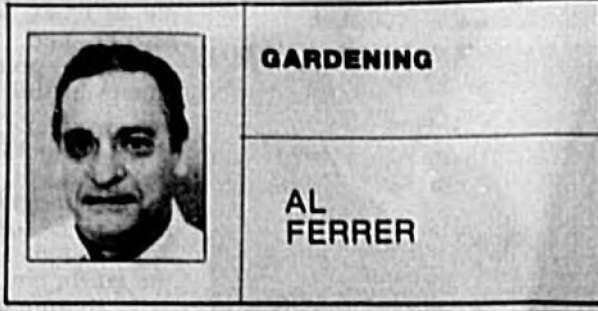


All you need to know about Florida eggplant

The eggplant probably originated in the Far East. It is the same family of plants as tomatoes, potatoes and peppers. Most eggplant fruits have a glossy purple to black color and are closer in shape to pears than eggs. Some varieties have fruits with unusual colors such as the Easter Egg eggplant which has white fruits and the variety known as 'golden eggs' which produces white fruits that change to gold as they age.

In Florida there are two types of white eggplants commonly found in vegetable gardens. The plant of the ornamental white eggplant closely resembles the plant of ordinary culinary eggplant. Culinary types (Melongena) includes edible varieties of eggplant having white fruit, such as 'Albino', 'Douga' and 'White Beauty'.

Description: Ornamental white eggplant is a rather low-growing, branching plant. Stem and leafstalks are green, or very faintly tinged with purple, and bear a few white spines. Leaves are waxy at the edges. Flower are lilac. The fruit are very white when immature, but turn yellow when ripe. In shape and size, they greatly resemble ordinary hen's egg. Larger fruiting and dwarf

plant forms have been reported. The ornamental plants are only occasionally grown in Florida home gardens, because the fruits are inedible. The plants, with the snowy white "eggs" contrasting brilliantly with the green plant form, are very attractive. They are grown in Florida by ornamental plant growers and merchandised throughout the United States in pots. The edible 'White Beauty' eggplant fruits are borne well off the ground on sturdy upright, 4-foot tall plants. Its foliage is a rich light green without the tinge of purple of the other strains.

The fruits are larger than 'Black Beauty', a popular Florida variety of eggplant.

Fruits reach a size of four pounds and are shaped round-oblong, similar to 'Black Beauty'. Seed cavities are confined to the blossom-end half. Flavor is reputed to be deliciously mild when the vegetable is fried in batter, and without much trace of bitter taste. It should be harvested when solid and while the skin is still glossy.

Culture: Growing both types of white eggplant is very similar to that for the more common purple kinds. All may be started from seed and are well adapted to container culture. Eggplants should be grown and harvested during the warm seasons. Choose the warmest, sunniest spot in your garden. Eggplants need protection from wind and cold drafts. The soils should be well-drained, fertile, sandy loam is best. Prepare the soil spading it deeply and working in a rich compost or other organic material. Water soil well before planting. A thick mulch is essential to keep down weeds and regulate temperature. Water on a regular schedule. Use a 8-8-8 or similar fertilizer, apply 2-4 lbs. per 100

square feet of bed. In addition, during the growing season, it may be necessary to side-dress 2 or 3 times for good fruit production.

Growing in containers: It is possible to grow eggplant as a container vegetable or even an ornamental plant. Eggplants need a very warm environment throughout their growing season. They should be grown in a well-drained, fertilized soil and placed in the warmest spot with the best lighting possible.

Harvesting: The best time to harvest eggplant is before the fruits have reached their full maturity. Most varieties take 60 to 80 days to reach this stage. The fruit should be firm with shiny skin. By the time the skin has lost its sheen the seeds will be dark and the flesh may be bitter. If you keep the fruits picked off at the early stage, your plants should continue bearing until the temperatures get too cold.

Pests and diseases: Problems such as spider mites and wilts, caused by bacteria and fungi affect white eggplant. Phomosis blight, phytophthora blight, early blight, and rust leaf spot are some other disease problems that affect eggplants.

I would accept him as he is and tune out his coughing. Is he right?

It worries me. **WORRIED WIFE**

DEAR WORRIED: Until you and your husband know there is no medical reason for his coughing, you have cause for concern. Make a deal with him. If he will go for a thorough physical exam and the results show nothing serious, you will try to tune out his coughing. Unless and until he consults a doctor to be sure he is in good

health, continue to hound him.

SANFORD - Getting better and better with every game, the Orlando Storm capped off a 5-0 run through the Winn Dixie Girls' 18-and-Under International Basketball Shoot Out with an 81-66 victory over the Mississippi Warriors in the Championship game at the Seminole Community College Health and Physical Education Center Sunday afternoon.

COLLINSVILLE, IL. - Chris Patrick (Fresno, Ca.) and Alhaji Turay (Auburn, WA.) each blasted home runs to highlight an 18-hit attack and Dane Artman (Key West) and Carmen Pignatello (Frankfort, IL.) combined for 14 strikeouts to lead the USA Baseball Youth National Team to a 13-0 victory against Italy in the third day of pool play in the Ninth International Baseball Association

World Youth Championships at Fletcher Field.

The game was halted after seven innings of play because of the tournament's run rule.

Patrick and Turay joined forces to go seven-for-10 at the plate while driving in a total of three runs. Each scored three times as well.

Turay led off the USA's third inning with his home run, a towering shot to center field. He also had a run-scoring single in

the sixth inning.

Patrick's homer, a solo shot to right, came in the fifth inning. He also added three singles to his four-for-four day at the plate.

"I'm seeing the ball real well," said Patrick, whose eight hits tops the USA team after three contests in the championships. "Really, there's not a weak spot in our lineup. We are getting a lot of good run production every day."

Every starter in the USA lineup hit safely in the contest. Michael

Hollimon (Dallas) and Jared Anderson (Tucson) each chipped in with two hits and two runs scored. Brian Horwitz (Encino, CA) also notched two hits, while Kevin Melillo (Longwood) and Artman drove in two runs apiece.

While the USA bats were booming for the third consecutive day -- the squad now has 55 hits through three games -- USA pitchers turned in yet another fine performance. Artman and

Winter Haven claims Area trophy

SANFORD - Winter Haven took advantage of three errors and a wild pitch by Longwood in the top of the seventh inning to score five runs and hold off the Babe Ruth-Area Tournament Championship at Historic Sanford Memorial Stadium Sunday afternoon.

Winter Haven took a 3-0 lead in the top of the first inning, but Longwood came back with four runs in the bottom of the third inning.

Winter Haven then grabbed the lead for good, scoring five runs in the top of the fifth inning and adding a run in the fifth inning.

Longwood kept it close, scoring two runs in the bottom of the fifth inning and three runs in the bottom of the sixth inning, while Winter Haven added a single run in the sixth inning, making the score 10-9 heading into the seventh inning.

The victory was the second of the tournament for Winter Haven over Longwood. The Polk County squad had edged Longwood 8-7 in the Winner's Bracket final on Saturday.

Host Sanford had stayed alive on Saturday, scoring eight runs in the bottom of the sixth inning to eliminate South Lakeland, 11-6.

But Sanford would finish third after falling to Longwood for a second time in the tournament, 4-1.
