

'HOV' Lanes Yes-Policing: ???

Herald Staff Writers Planned High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lanes along Interstate 4 from Osceola County to state Route 434 in Seminole County appear to be a certainty, but whether law enforcement will police those lanes is another matter.

Seminole countians can expect to see the con version of a 11/4-mile stretch along I-4 to six lanes in 1981 to make way for the implementation of the HOVs lanes, said Bill G. Gray, a spokesman for the Florida Department of Transportation (DOT).

DOT is proposing the installation of high occupancy vehicle lanes along I-4 from U.S. 192 (SR 530) Osceola County to SR 434 in Seminole County. These lanes would encourage car-pooling and could lead to a decrease in gasoline consumption, DOT officials say.

The 11/2-mile stretch along I-4 between SR 434 to SR 436 will be expanded from a four-lane highway to a six-lane highway beginning in early spring of 1981,

Gray said. The two extra lanes will be used as high occupancy lanes and cost approximately \$1 million to construct. Gray said. Construction is slated for completion in 1983.

The idea to install the high occupancy vehicle lanes on I-4 came from the Federal Highway Department as part of President Carter's program to conserve energy, Gray said. "We always wanted to six-lane that." Gray said. 'We were trying to get funding for it. The only way

was to get it committed to high occupancy vehicle "The federal highway police say there will be no more lanes added to an interstate unless it is a high

occupancy vehicle lane." The HOV lanes would be installed on the far left lanes of the highway in the east and west direction. Gray said. These lanes would be reserved for

motorists of either cars or buses with two or more passengers, he said. "The high occupancy vehicle lanes would be effective from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. for traffic traveling

Telephone Firm Beats Mall For High Priced Property

The Winter Park Telephone Company holds a substantial lead over its nearest competitor, the Altamonte Springs Mall, as owner of the highest priced property in Seminole County, according to figures kept in the county tax assessors office.

Based on 1978 records, which were used for 1979 tax purposes, the telephone company at 850 Altamonte Drive had an appraised value of \$48,541,665. The tax bill received by the company came to a whopping \$858.853.12 county records show.

Bill Suber of the Seminole County Assessor's office said the figure represented a tax based on both real estate and personal property. Thus equipment within the building would have been included in the estimated value of the company, he said. The value of the Altamonte Mall was put at \$27,704,506 Suber said. However, he said that figure does not include

the other stores in the mall, he said. Based on the appraised value, the owners of the mall. the Edward J. Gebarto Corporation of Youngstown, Ohio. paid the county \$513,641.56 in taxes, Suber said. Florida Power Corporation had real estate and personal property valued at \$24,400,070 and was the third



Israeli Forces Foil Palestinian Attack

TEL AVIV, Israel (UPI) — Israeli security forces foiled a third Palestinian terrorist attack in less than 48 hours. intercepting and killing a six-man guerrila squad on the Lebanese frontier Monday night.

In a separate incident in Jerusalem, a driver emptied his bus of passengers today only a minute before a bomb apparently planted by Palestinian guerrillas destroyed the vehicle. Police said there were no injuries. Police said that a passenger noticed a suspicious object in the bus, the driver pulled over and all the passengers

got off, a minute before the bomb blew up. Israeli troops sustained one of the heaviest casualty tolls in any frontier skirmish with guerrillas with a 22year-old soldier killed and six other wounded, the command said. It said the guerrillas carried grenades and Soviet-made Kalachnikov rifles.

Rhodesian Election Begins

SALISBURY. Rhodesia (UPI) - Rhodesians began voting today for the first black majority government in the nation's 85-year history with soldiers guarding against "a crescendo of violence" by black guerrillas. Members of Patriotic Front guerrilla alliance, which has vowed to wreck the elections, attacked five polling booths Monday. A military spokesman said the attacks

Trains Collide Head-On

GLASGOW. Scotland (UPI)- Scottish police said today they feared more bodies were trapped in the tangled wreckage of two passenger trains — one packed with vacationers returning from an Easter holiday—that collided head-on at Paisley Station, killing at least six

people.

The bodies of a man, a woman and two children were pulled from the wreck after dawn and the two engineers, whose bodies were still missing, were also presumed deed, police said. At least 63 persons were injured, but only three were hospitalised, including a pregnant woman who was moved to a maternity unit.



Carter Asks Congress For

15.4 Million Wilderness Acres WASHINGTON (UPI) - President Carter has asked Congress to add 15.4 million acres to the nation's

wilderness system almost doubling the acreage preserved

The president Monday also ordered more than 36 million acres of untrampled U.S. countryside opened up for logging, oil, gas and mineral exploration. Carter said in a White House statement release of the lands will help meet the nation's "urgent need for energy. wood products, livestock forage, minerals" and will provide for a "broad array of recreational opportunities."

Jane Byrne Keeps Vow

CHICAGO (UPI) — Jane M. Byrne, keeping a promise she made in anger, returned triumphantly as mayor to the City Hall she was ordered to leave just 17 months ago. Monday night, the 44-year-old Mrs. Byrne, welcomed by an Irish bagpipe band, walked on an Irish-green carpet to the City Council chambers, where she took the oath of office and became the first woman mayor of Chicago. Mrs. Byrne was fired by Mayor Michael A. Bilandic after she accused him in November 1977 of "greasing" a taxicab fare increase through the city Council. Angry that she was being tossed out of City Hall, Mrs. Byrne told her aides she would take Bilandic's job away from him and walk into City Hall. She later said she made the statement "off the top of my head."

NEWPORT NEWS, Va. (UPI) — Rito-equipped police patrolled the streets early today in the wake of the bloodiest violence in the three-month-old steelworkers' union strike against Newport News Shipbuilding Co. More than 60 persons were arrested and dozens more injured Monday during several sometimes bloody strikerelated confrontations outside the ship-yard gates, police

Steelworkers have been on strike since Jan. 31 in an effort to pressure the shipyard, Virginia's largest private employer, to recognize the union as the new bargaining agent for 15.500 blue collar workers.

Social Security In Trouble?

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Social Security may be sound now, but a government report indicates insolvency could be just a politically attractive tax cut

The report by the Social Security system's board of trustees Monday recommended no reduction in taxes without balanced cuts in benefits - something President Carter is pushing in Congress right now. Increases in the Social Security tax are scheduled into fiscal 1990. Some members of Congress, as well as consumer groups, are calling for a rollback of the latest increases or at least a reduction in future levies.

Let's Be Candid **About SALT II**

We keep hoping the Carter administration will join the debate over its prospective strategic arms limitation treaty with the Soviet Union in a manner that does justice to the complexity of the issues involved. After the recent round of pro-SALT speeches by Defense Secretary Harold Brown, National Security Affairs Advisor Zbigniew Brzezinski, and Rosalynn Carter, we are still waiting. Cranking up its SALT sales force in anticipation of an imminent treaty signing, the White House sent Secretary Brown to New York to warn that Senate rejection of the treaty would mean up to \$30 billion in additional defense spending over the next

On that same day, Mr. Brzezinski was in Chicago prophesying that the treaty would "lead to more peaceful relations" between the United States and the Soviet Union because SALT II provides "the needed strategic stability for progress in political

Finally, standing in for her husband at the christening of the Trident-class submarine, Ohio. Mrs. Carter advised the nation that the decision on the treaty is nothing less than a choice between controlling nuclear weapons or not controlling

At best, these arguments are simplistic. At worst, they are decpetive.

It should hardly be necessary to remind Secretary Brown, for example, that kind of arms "control" represented by the 1972 SALT I agreement and the SALT II treaty in prospect offer no guarantee against an escalating arms race and its attendant expense. He has said as much himself. Compared with the minimum of \$1 trillion this country must spend on defense during the next decade just to keep the Soviets from getting too far ahead, \$30 billion is not relatively significant and certainly represents no compelling reason to sign a deeply flawed treaty.

Mr. Brzezinski, the administration's resident foreign policy hawk, must have choked over the blind optimism he was required to reflect in ac-cordance with the official White House line. If there is anything the decade-long SALT process has not produced, it is "more peaceful relations" between the United States and the Soviet Union. The opposite has been the case.

As for the "needed strategic stability." neither Mr. Brzezinski nor any other administration spokesman has yet refuted the precise calculations of SALT II critics who argue that the new treaty would only tip the strategic military balance further in favor of the Soviet Union.

Given these sobering realities, Mrs. Carter's homilies about controlling nuclear weapons border on the irrelevant.



Not Yet A Zero Population |

Quick, and no fair using fingers: What do 2,243,000, 1,122,000 and 3,329,000, 1,405,000 and 218,998,000 add up to? Don't bother spending any more time on the

answer. It's not a mega-number but a statistical profile of a people — Americans. The first figure is the number of marriages recorded throughout the country in 1978 and it works out to 10.3 per 1,000 population. That is the highest since 1974, indicating that the decline in

the marriage rate of recent years may be in the

The second figure is the number of divorces for the same year. Again in terms of 1,000 population, that is a rate of 5.1, virtually unchanged from the year before and indicating that the long-term rise in the divorce rate may be

process of being reversed.

The two sets of statistics are recorded in the atest edition of "Births, Marriages, Divorçes and Deaths" issued by the National Center for Health Statistics. Taken together, they suggest that even in an era of freer lifestyles, there's still a lot to be said for wedlock — and a lot being done

Births during 1978 numbered 3.329,000 about the same as for 1977, giving hope that the population isn't as explosive as recently fearbil. But we're still a long way from the zero-growth society advocated by some population experts, since the year's live births outnumbered deaths by 1,405,000. The difference, plus immigration brought the official U.S. population to 218,996,000 as Jan. 1, 1979, a new high. It figures.

Labor Department statisticians have news for a significant segment of the U.S. population, As of April 1, an urban family of four with ar income of less than \$6,700 will be categorized as poor. That is an increase of \$500 over last year's income standard. For a single person, the poverty level goes up

from \$3.140 to \$3.400. Similar increases for statistical purposes were announced for households of other compositions. It just goes to show you how it is with inflation? It costs more just to be poor.




