**Schools Ask Funds Aid**

The Board of Public Instruction, Thursday afternoon, unanimously agreed to correspond with Congressman A. S. Herlong Jr. recommending basis for distribution of federal funds under Public Law 89-10 to be amended in order that moneys can be used locally in the "best and most efficient manner."

Currently the funds can only be expended at six county schools — three in the north end and three in the south end. "The program as it now stands is hard to administer, Walter Teague, school board administrator said.

"The program should be based on the Florida minimum foundation," John Evans, informed board member insisted. "Under the program the richest school systems are now getting the most money. It is a chaotic, fragmented, unscientific allocation of funds."

In other business, the board: Reappointed S. J. Davis Jr. and R. H. Jerrard to the Seminole College Advisory Board; instructed the school board attorney to prepare an agreement to lease a piece of property 20 feet wide and 375 feet long on Lake Reservoir to an adjoining property owner, Patrick Zeuli, at rent of \$10 a year.

Agreed to sell a strip of property at the Right site on Laurel Avenue recently purchased by the board to E. E. Mitchell, adjoining property owner, for \$400. Dimensions of the property are 14 feet by 117 feet.

Awarded contract to the low bidder, Reeves Fence Company, to supply materials and installation of a fence around the Right property for \$748.40 with substitution of railing gates at cost an additional \$73; Transferred \$1500 from the general fund to the athletic account of Seminole High School with funds to be repaid from proceeds of the ball games in the fall.

**All-Out Alert On For Escapee**



Law enforcement agencies in Central Florida were alerted today to be on the lookout for a military prisoner — "wearing a red shirt" who was one of two sailors who escaped from custody at Sanford Naval Air Station Thursday evening.

Two men — whose names were not released by the Navy — were being held at the Marine Barracks pending transportation to their home bases to answer to charges of being absent without leave.

The prisoners were taken from their detention cell in the Marine Barracks for their evening meal at the Navy mess hall. While being returned, they bolted and ran from their military escort, going in opposite directions.

They scalded the perimeter fence surrounding the station and ran toward Onora Road.

Sanford police and Seminole County sheriff's deputies were alerted today to assist the Shore Patrol in the search for the escapees. One man was apprehended about an hour after his escape. The other man is still at large.

**Shriners Push Aid To Crippled**

Sanford Shrine Club will be selling newspapers Saturday in downtown Sanford and in Sanford Plaza in conjunction with the first annual paper sale being sponsored by Bahis Temple of Orlando for benefit of the Shriners' hospitals for crippled and burned children.

The first Shrine hospital with a long history of providing medical care for the total of 18 hospitals and institutes in operation, with three more in the construction, all built and supported without any type of Federal aid.

Since opening of the first hospital, more than 250,000 children have been cured or materially helped at an approximate average cost per patient of \$159.22. Value of the hospital buildings and equipment stands at more than \$50 million with annual operating costs more than \$10 million.

Funds are obtained through permanent hospital life memberships, voluntary memberships, wills and bequests, gifts and contributions, hospital assessments of Shriners' dues, and from proceeds of major activities sponsored by the Shrine Temples.

**County Sets New Meet With Peebles Tuesday**

Members of the Board of County Commission will meet with Willard Peebles, state road board member, and C. A. Benedict, department engineer at 1:30 p. m. Tuesday in DeLand to discuss details of the state road program as it affects Seminole County. Commission Chairman John Alexander announced today.

Points of discussion, according to Alexander, will include details of the five year primary road plan and possible extra funds (statewide bond issue) for other roads.

At a meeting in DeLand earlier this week, only two Seminole County roads were included in the program to be constructed with funds from the statewide bond issue. These were 2.8 miles of U. S. 17.2 from the existing four lane Seminole County, Commission 7.83 miles of SR 426 from Oviedo northeast to SR 46.

The widening and resurfacing of SR 426 was scheduled for 1967-70 at cost of \$270,000 while the further four-laning of 17.92 was planned for 1971-72 at cost of \$335,000.

But that engineering college declined to merge, so he hit upon an even more grandiose scheme, namely, take over Northwestern University.

Dr. Hutchins had a very simple plan. He was to get the median rate of 25 in the next 25 years.

Yet none of this means the two major parties are not well advised to be building up their "youth divisions" with eye for eye.

Chamber of Commerce has requested the postal authorities to investigate the companies that are mailing these statements to business men who have no knowledge of the publication nor have been solicited.

The Chamber is affiliated with the National Better Business Bureau, with which it has a directory program.

After three years of constant tart watching, Mrs. Phillips complained of headaches and asked for a transfer to another department. The management refused. Thus the strike.

"These tarts came at me on 120 yards a minute," said Mrs. Phillips. "It strained my eyes is terrible."

"The manager of Scribbam Kemp Bakery, which turns out 15 million cakes, tarts and confections a day, refused to negotiate until the strikers returned to work."
