





President Roosevelt is giving serious consideration, ac-ording to Gladstone Williams, well known Washington correspondent, to the feasibility of constructing a ship canal across the Florida peninsula at or near the Georgia line. The President is said to favor the plan not alone because it will provide jobs to some 20,000 to 30,000 men, now out of work, but because it will also reduce the distance from

New York and other eastern ports to the Gulf of Mexico by some eight hundred miles. Mr. Williams insists that the President has al-

ready confided to Congressional leaders his intention of recommending the development, providing an economic survey, now being conducted by army engineers, indicates that prospective shipping tolls will prove sufficient to pay reasonable interest charges plus three or four percent an-nually for sinking fund requirements.

Advocates of the plan among whom are included such prominent political leaders as Senator Fletcher and Senator Trammell of Florida, Senators George and Russell of Georgia, and Congressman R. A. 
