William Saxbe Pegged

As India's Ambassador

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford plans to nominate Atty. Gen. William B. Saxbe as ambassador to India and is looking for a new attorney general, reliable

"I'll soon be leaving," Saxbe told friends in Ohio Wednesday night. But he told reporters any announcement must come from the White House. Administration sources and associates of Saxbe in his native Ohio said Saxbe has agreed to accept the ambassa-

The White House was expected to announce the choice of Saxbe to replace Daniel Patrick Moynihan as soon as the Indian government expresses approval, probably by the end of the week.

Saxbe was said to be well-acquainted with Indian officials because of several trips there since 1971. The move would put the Justice Department in the hands of the fifth attorney general in as many years.

Arabs Buying More Jets

WASHINGTON (AP) - Wealthy oil-producing Arab countries have doubled the number of French Mirage fighter-bombers they are buying for Egypt's air force,

U.S. intelligence sources report. They say Kuwait and Abu Dhabi are paying for a new order of 36 Mirages for Egypt. France has started delivery on a previous Saudi Arabian purchase of 36 of the fighter-bombers for the Egyptian air force. Analysts believe the three rich Arab countries are providing the 72 Mirages in part to encourage Egypt from turning again to Russia for arms.

'Skitch' Faces Jail Term

NEW YORK (AP) - Conductor Skitch Henderson faces up to three years in prison and a \$5,000 fine after a federal jury found him guilty of filing a false income tax return. He had been charged with evading more than \$40,000 in

The jury resumes deliberations today on two other tax charges against the conductor - an attempted tax evasion count and a second false filing count.





Greeks Reject Radical Left

The Western alliance can take satisfaction in the victory of Prime Minister Constantin Caramanlis and his conservative New Democracy Party in the Greek elections. The future role of Greece in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization remains to be clarified, to be sure, but the Greek people have left no dount that they reject the anti-American, anti-NATO "neutralism" of the radical

Mr. Caramanlis, though representing a moderate middle ground in Greek Politics, appears committed to making some changes in the relations between Greece and the NATO allies. It was his caretaker government, after all that announced a "withdrawal" of Greece from NATO in RAY CROMLEY the bitter aftermath of the war on Cyprus.

Foreign policy probably will be soft-pedaled by Mr. Caramanlis in the months ahead in order to concentrate on rebuilding the foundations o democratic government. The issue of a proposed restoration of the monarchy must be disposed of, and the new parliament must write a constitution.

This was the first election in Greece in more than a decade. It is gratifying to see the parliamentary process once more beginning to work in the hands of a people whose forebears more than two thousand years ago first developed the concept of democratic government. History gives the Greek people a special reason to seek the compromises and accommodations necessary for the success of their renewed attempt at salf-government.

Historic Coverup

The greatest presidential coverup in American history was not Watergate, but the election of a dying man to the nation's highest office in 1944.

At any rate, abundant documentation for such an assertion can be found in a new book, "FDR's Last Year," by columnist and popular historian, Jim Bishop As Bishop tells it, alarm among the President's intimates at

his physical state led to a secret medical examination at Bethesda Naval Hospital in March, 1944. It was found that Roosevelt suffered from congestive heart failure and irreversible degeneration of the vascular system. The President rapidly deteriorated in the ensuing months, both physically and men-tally. Associates noticed that he would frequently stop in nidsentence and forget what he had been talking about. His hands trembled uncontrollably. Attempts by journalists, as well as FDR's Republican opponents to pry information out of the

White House were unsuccessful. In August, 1944, Roosevelt collapsed after a speech to shipyard workers in Oregon. Despite his condition, in October he campaigned in a downpour in New York City in an effort to

persuade voters that he was healthy and fit. Aware of his impending death, Roosevelt nevertheless remained convinced that only he could lead the nation to the successful conclusion of World War II and the shaping of the postwar peace. At the momentous meeting with Stalin and Churchill nt Yalta in February, 1945, Lord Moran, Churchill's personal physician, took one look at FDR and told Secretary of State Stettinius: "I give him only a few months to live." Even Stalin,

it is said, was moved to pity. What the postwar era would have been like had the destiny of the free world not been in the hands of a dying man at Yalta is something historians will long argue about.

But as an example of a White House "palace guard" shielding a president and withholding the truth from the American people, it is a story with tragic implications far beyond those of

There is no arrangement on a site, a method of payment or on precisely what the house will be like, except in terms which can be read in any way the reader chooses. 

Classing World's **Powers**

The Pentagon has been complaining a lot lately that if we don't hurry up and start spending more money on weapons and equipment, we are going to become a "second-class power." The Pentagon, however, never explains exactly what it means to be a second-class power, so for clarification we consulted Otto von Overkirl chairman of the International Power Rating

"On the one hand, you have got your 58th-class powers, such as Upper Volta, Lichtenstein and North Dakota. On the other hand, you have got your first class powers, such as the U.S.A., the Soviet Union, China and IBM. "Now if somebody become a second-class power, that means they aren't allowed to fight

"The question is very simple," Overkirl said.







Black, White Leaders

Step Toward Detente

SALISBURY, Rhodesia (AP) - Black and white leaders in southern Africa have taken their first major step toward detente by agreeing to a ceasefire in Rhodesia and a conference to write a new constitution for the former British territory. Prime Minister Ian Smith, the head of Rhodesia's white-minority regime, announced Wednesday night that the war between his army and black guerrillas would halt immediately, he would release all black political prisoners and a constitutional conference with black nationalist leaders would be held soon "without preconditions."

Kissinger Addresses NATO

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger and the other 14 foreign ministers of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization met today to discuss President Ford's Vladivostok agreement on nuclear arms and the grave economic situation facing them. Opening the NATO foreign ministers' annual two-day winter meeting, Kissinger was expected to underline points made Tuesday by Defense Secretary James R. Schlesinger at the meeting of NATO defense ministers. Schlesinger said although the Vladivostok accord between Ford and Soviet leader Leonid I. Brezhnev could open the way to ceilings on conventional arms and tactical nuclear weapons as well as strategic nuclear missiles and bombers, the Western allies and particularly the Europeans must not reduce their defenses.

Another Oil Increase?

VIENNA, Austria (AP) - The oil-exporting countries are not expected to raise prices at their two-day meeting that opened in Vienna today. But Iran's oil minister says there will have to be an increase eventually to keep pace with inflation. "We must uphold the purchasing power of our oil," Jamshid Amouzegar of Iran told newsmen Wednesday night as oil ministers gathered for the session of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries.

Grenades Kill 3 Persons

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) - The Palestine guerrillas say one of their men made a grenade attack in a crowded Tel Aviv movie theater Wednesday night in retaliation for the rocket attack on three PLO offices in Beirut two days

"We have struck back," said PLO chief Yasir Arafat. "Next time it will be within six hours if Israel dares to stage another terror operation against us." Tel Aviv police said the grenades killed three persons, including the terrorist who threw them, and that 58 per-

sons were injured. The police said the terrorist carried a British passport issued to Alexander Adam Hopper, born in Accra, Ghana,

Yes It's True, Blazers \$1.5 Million Bounces


ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) - A \$1.5 million check offered as a down payment on the purchase of the Florida Blazers of the World Football League has bounced, the Orlando Sentinel

The \$1.5 million check was given to Blazers' attorney Robert Deutsch as a down payment on Nov. 21 by financier Robert Prentice of Cocoa Beach. Prentice said he represented a group of buyers, but he refused to name them Deutsch said the check would be used to immediately pay players, staff and creditors. The team still owes its players more than eight weeks of back salary. In today's editions, the Sentinel Star said the check, drawn

from an out of town bank on a corporate account, was deposited in an Orlando bank the next day. But it bounced due to insufficient funds, the newspaper said. The WFL board of directors has raised questions about whether the sale violated a league by-law against mortgaging a team. Prentice had to put up Blazer stock as collateral

on loans for the purchase On Wednesday, the WFL gave Blazer owner Rommie Loudd until Friday to settle team debts or lose the franchise. the Sentinel Star said. Unless Loudd shows WFL directors evidence of financial solvency, the league will sell the franchise to investors in another city, the newspaper re-

Meanwhile, David Williams Jr., an Orlando motel magnate who has nearly \$1 million invested in the team, said he would attend a directors meeting in New York today.



Signs Warn Of 1930s Slump

World Economic System Nears Stalling Speed

The Herald News Services

Despite warnings of a slump on the scale of the 1930s, most people believe the world faces no more than a short-lived recession-a year or so of no growth or perhaps marginal decline. It seems inconceivable that industrial countries' production could fall by a third over three years as it did between 1929 and 1932.

It seemed just as inconceivable in 1929 following one decade of fairly steady growth. But the world economic system, like a plane in flight, car, only slow down so far before it stalls and plummets to earth.

The stalling speed for the 1970 is probably higher than that for the 1930s because it follows a quarter century of barely interrupted growth. The world must be near to that stalling speed

All economists knew about this stalling speed by the end of the 1930s, and waxed eloquent on why the crash had occurred after the event. They said that it was the inevitable consequence of the interaction of the incomes "multiplier" and investment "accelerator". The multiplier theory shows that the level of income depends on the level of investment, while the accelerator theory shows that the level of investment depends on the rate at which demand, and hence income, is growing.

Putting the two together, a steady growth in income requires a steady growth in investment but produces instead a constant level of investment. The result is that economies are naturally prone to business cycles, and the downturns become sharp when a downward accelerator really takes off.

This basic instability has been held in abeyance for the last quarter century, and so is easily forgotten. It has been held in abeyance by five pieces of good fortune.

(1) Smooth functioning of the international trade and payments system has meant that countries with flagging home demand have usually seen their exports increase; when one country has been restricting demand because of a trade deficit, other countries have by definition been in trade surplus and have been able to keep their home demand buoyant. (2) Keynesian demand management policies have taken the

(3) Years of relatively uninterrupted growth have given inessmen the confidence to disregard short-term fluctuations in demand, while (4) The financial system has made long-term investment

edge off unstable private investment.

(5) Even the consumer has contributed by allowing savings rather than consumption to take a part of the strain from

The threat of world slump comes from the collapse of each of these safeguards. (1) Virtually all industrial countries are in balance of payments difficulties at the same time; only the Arabs are in surplus, and we cannot all sell to them. (2) Keynesian demand management policies have been undermined by cost inflation. (3) Business confidence in continued long-term growth has been sapped. (4) Even where companies remain optimistic, finance for long-term investment is difficult to obtain and incredibly expensive. (5) In most countries consumers have not yet lost confidence and stopped buying durables, but the signs in some car and housing markets are

Once released, the investment accelerator is a fearsome beast. Industrial countries have grown used to around 5 per cent a year growth. This has sustained investment spending of up to

a quarter of GNP. If industry stops expecting 5 per cent a year growth and starts expecting zero growth, there could then be a 50 per cent fall in gross investment, lopping just over 10 per cent off world incomes. This, in turn, would then lop another 10 to 15 per cent off incomes (assuming a multiple of 2, or a bit over)

It is entirely possible for such a spiralling to happen. In the 1930s it did happen. What are the signs to look for? First, a buildup of stocks of consumer durables and of intermediate goods lower down the production chain; then cuts in production because of the accumulation of unsold stocks; then a collapse of orders, first for component suppliers but working rapidly through to the heavy end of industry; and then a slashing of investment spending as the accelerator catches hold.

A slump, once under way, gathers momentum at an alarming pace, leading, as in 1930s to widespread financial failures all

The recession in construction is already a year old in most countries. Private housing construction is particularly sensitive to high interest rates, and usually the first to be hit. Housing starts in Britain have tumbled by 50 per cent on a year ago, although public-sector housebuilding has shown some increase. In America the fall in housing starts is also around 50 per cent, and the value of the construction industry's total output is un-

changed on a year ago, despite double-figure inflation. The collapse in demand for cars is worldwide, and has reached the point of big cuts in production. About 200,000 workers have been made idle in the United States. In Germany Volkswagen and Opel have been working short-time; Citroen in France has laid-off 2,700 workers; Fiat in Italy is generally on a three-day week. The British industry has had a major cut in production, but the cut has all been caused by strikes, so it has temporarily avoided major layoffs. But British Leyland has cut

The news since August is just that the recession is spreading. Falling demand for plastics and synthetic fibers is working back to the petrochemical feedstock producers.

In Britain demand for low-density polyethylene has dropped by one-third in the past two months and polypropylene demand is down by one-fifth. Bayer, one of the three giants in the German chemical industry, is working at about 80 per cent capacity. European steel production is currently forecast to fall between 10 and 15 per cent in 1975. Japan expects an 8 per cent cutback in steel production by the end of next year. No forecasts are available for America, just gloom.

In general, America is leading the world into the slump, with each successive forecast worse than the last. Last week, Treasury Secretary William Simon admitted that this recession was likely to be the longest since the war. America's GNP has already been falling for nine months. In Germany growth is only being sustained by exports, and

this at a steadily declining rate. In Japan, stocks are at record levels despite the production slump. There is a grave danger that the slide from world recession to world slump has begun. As the Bank for International Set

Stripper Denies 'Wrecking' Mills' Career

"Mr. Mills did what he did because he want to. I don't feel personally responsible for wrecking his career." 





