If you are curious to sample the kind of cake popular at Mount Vernon, we suggest you try baking this Raisin-Current Cake — an updated version of a Martha Washington rule. One warning: don't expect this to be a fluffy cake. There's not a particle of baking powder

or baking sods in it. Its texture e is of the pound cake and fruit RAISIN-CURRANT CAKE 1% cups seedless raisins 14 cups currents

cup butter 1 cup plus 2 tablespoons sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla 1/2 teaspoon salt 14 teaspoon ground cloves 4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

14 cup half and half (commercial mixture of milk 21/2 cups sifted regular flour 5 large eggs

4 cup dry sherry Grease the entire inner sur face of a two-quart tube pan with butter; sprinkle with flour. Shake the pan back and forth so surface is well coated on bottom and sides; shake out excess

Coarsely chop the raisins Rinse currants under bot running water; drain; dry on paper

Have butter room-tempera ture soft. In a large mixing bowl thoroughly beat together the butter, sugar and vanilla. Add salt, cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg. Sair in the half and half and 1/2 cup of the flour. In a medium mixing bowl with an electric mixer at high speed, beat the eggs until thickened and lemon color. Gradual ly beat into butter mixture. With mixer, at low speed, alter nately best in the remaining 2 cups flour and the sherry to Stir in the raisins and currents.

Turn into prepared pan. Bake in a slow (325 degrees) oven until browned, cake tester inserted in center should come out cleap-about one hour and 15 minutes. Let cake stand in pan about 15 minutes, then turn out on wire rack; turn right-side Wrap in transparent plastic

wrapping and store in a tightly covered tin box. Cake slices well and will keep for several RECIPE NOTES

No leavening such as baking powder or baking soda is called for in this recipe. The beater eggs act as leavening. A good size of tube pan to use is one that measures about 91/2 by 21/2 inches. If you use a deeper, heavy tube pan that is abou 9 by 3% inches, you will probably have to increase the baking


