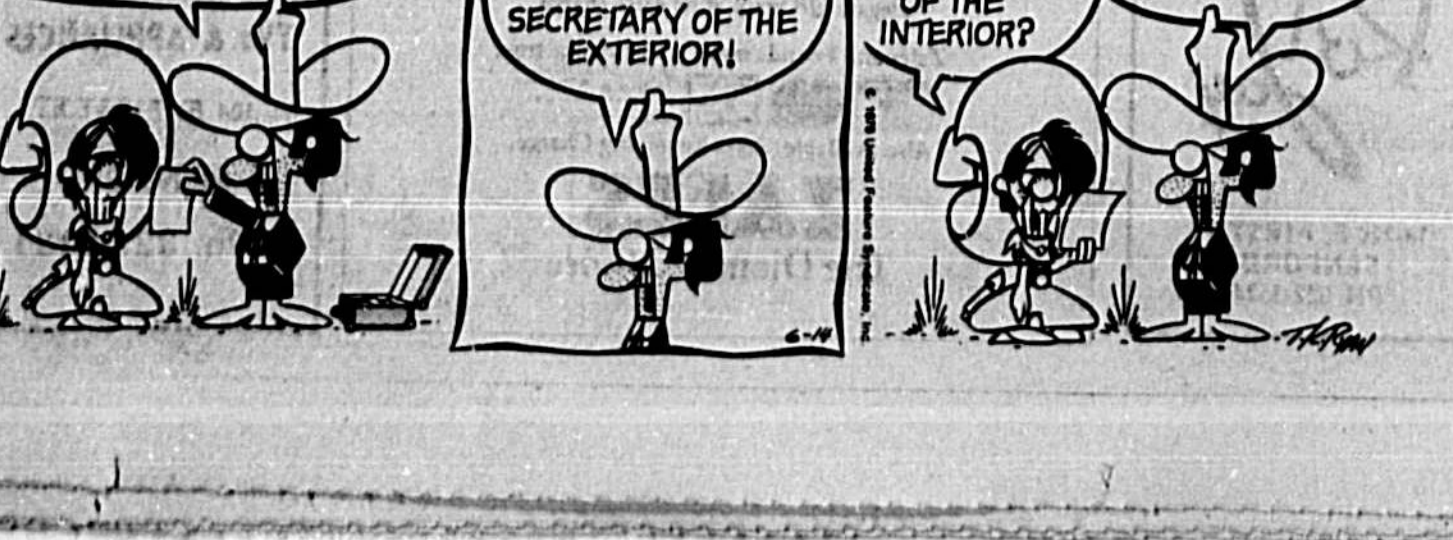
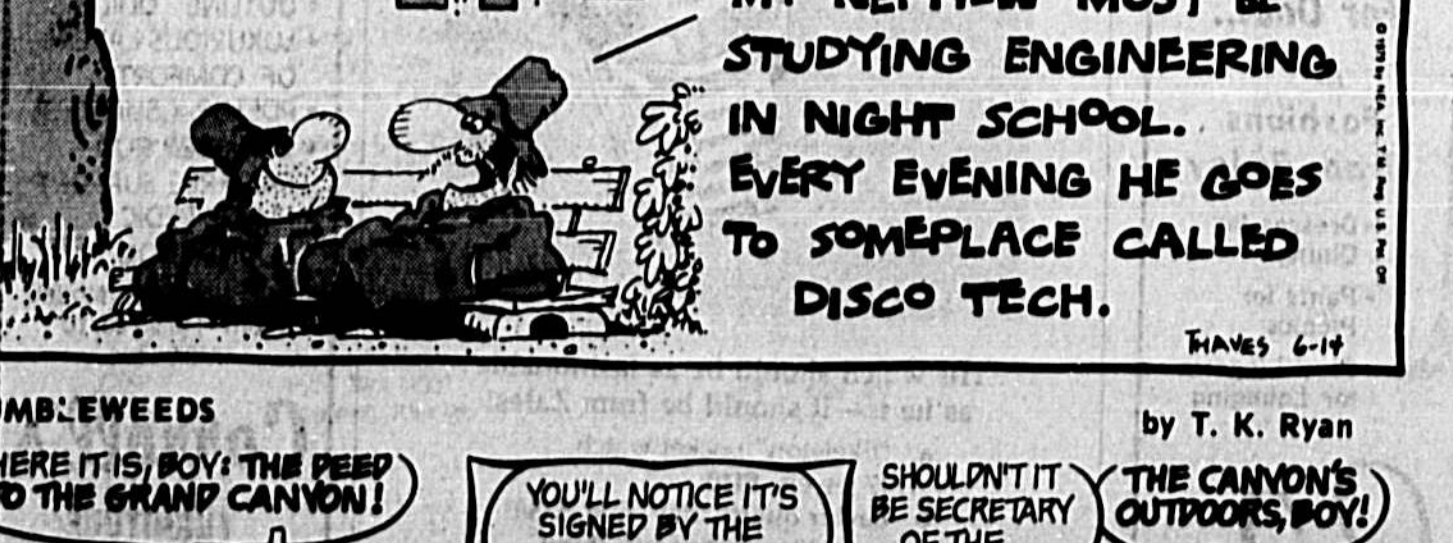
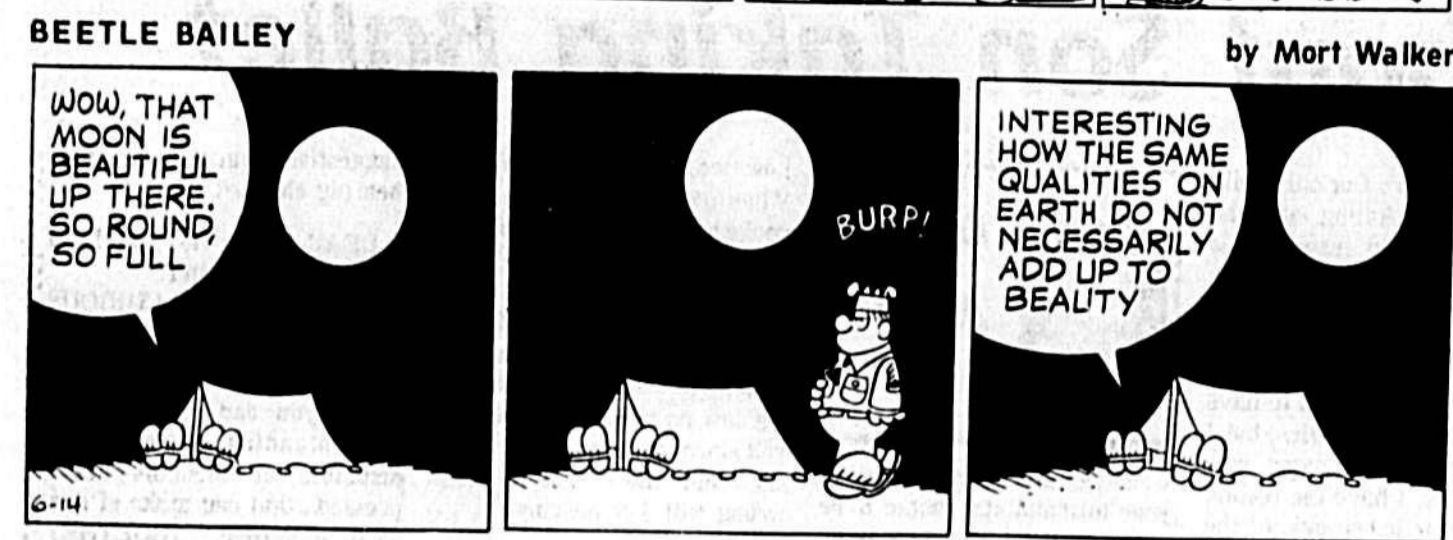
Chisholm Hits Lassic Homers

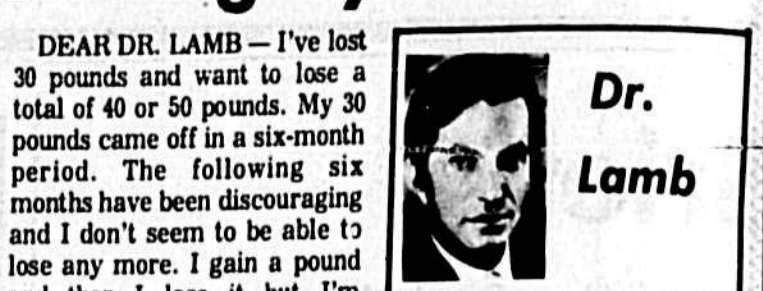

Hooked On Scales? A Weighty Problem!



DEAR DR. LAMB—I've lost 30 pounds and want to lose a total of 40 or 50 pounds. My 30 pounds came off in a six-month period. The following six months have been discouraging and I don't seem to be able to lose any more.

There are about 600 calories in a pound of lean muscle and around 3500 calories in a pound of body fat. If you eliminate 3500 stored fat calories and lose a pound of fat but exercise enough to use 600 calories to build a pound of muscle, there won't be any change on the scales.

DEAR READER—The biggest problem is that you're hooked on the bathroom scales. All the scales do is tell you how many pounds you weigh. They never tell you pounds of what—whether it's pounds of water, undigested food material, fat or protein.
