## REALTY DEALS REACH JANUARY TOTAL \$3,657,250

Transactions in May  
Reach \$723,250, As  
Shown By Papers In  
Office County Clerk

Transfers Number  
275 In 5 Months

Several Big Sales Last  
Week Not Included In  
Figures Given Out

The considerations in real estate transactions in Seminole county for the first five months of 1925 total \$3,657,250, according to compilations made today by A. C. Carter, of the Sanford Credit Bureau. The figures are based on the revenue stamps attached to warrants and quit deeds and contracts for title. According to the bureau figures taken from the books in the county clerk's office, the transactions in May totaled \$723,250, an increase over April of \$15,000, and an increase over every month in the year with the exception of March, when real estate sales totaled \$1,238,500. The number of deeds filed for the past five months total 1,275 as follows:

Of the transactions for the five months totaling nearly \$3,657,250, the figures show that the total transactions for the year will go beyond the \$10,000,000 mark.

Some of the figures on the real estate market are the large number of medium sized sales, according to realty men. The volume of these sales, the May figures will run nearly \$1,000,000, a part of which will be included in the June figures.

The place of this miracle was in the country, near the town of Bethsaida, on the north side of the Sea of Galilee. Jesus had gone with his disciples for a little while when the people heard of it and went out in crowds to see him.  
In the afternoon the disciples gathered to the Master that they were tired and hungry and had better send them away to the towns and villages around them to buy themselves food. Instead of this he took the five loaves which the disciples were holding and the two fishes which the whole multitude had brought, and he said: "Bless these, for this is the Bread of Life." He used a parable to show how a hungry world must be supplied with the Bread of eternal life.  
One of the principal lessons of this miracle to which I would call attention today is "The Blessing of Fellowship with Christ."  
First of all we notice that "Fellowship with Christ leads out the best possibilities of Young Life." Jesus commanded his disciples to do good to each other, to love one another, and to see how much they could do for each other. He said: "If you love one another, all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."  
We do not even know what he did, but we know what he did not do. We know that the Lord did not do a miracle for a boy who was willing to obey the Bible contains many wonderful stories of young life when called on to God. When the Israelites needed a great leader to lead them out of bondage, God called Moses out of the bulrushes, had him brought up in a palace home, taught in the schools of Egypt, and graduated in wisdom.  
When Naaman the great Syrian was suffering with leprosy, it was the word of a little Jew, a boy that directed him to the Jordan in Israel, where he was healed and converted to the true faith.  
When King Saul had made a great name, God wanted a man to succeed him. He laid his hand on David, a boy in Bethlehem, and he became the greatest king Israel ever had.  
On one occasion the disciples asked the Lord "Who is the greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven?" Jesus answered the question calling a boy to him—a boy who loved and obeyed Jesus Christ—representing the young life of the Church—a boy full of life, enthusiasm—a boy with marvelous possibilities of growth and development; and he makes this represent the greatest in the Kingdom.  
When we read the gospel of Christ, we are reminded that his message is the young life of the community—our most valuable asset, the foundation for all the children and the people of a country are the children of the Christian faith. Jesus Christ the greatest teacher of time has opened the eyes of the world to the value of education. The work of the Sunday School

and Young People's Societies in all Christian lands is evidence of that work that Christianity is doing to save the world by the right training of the rising generation.  
"One of the slogans in our Sunday work is that 'The world moves forward on the feet of little children.' We are indebted to the matchless Man of Galilee for that glorious truth, and just in proportion as we learn and practice it will the kingdom of God be promoted. In the next place we notice that 'Fellowship with Christ promotes glorious service.'  
"This boy with his loaves and fishes, together with the other disciples, were made partners with the Lord in feeding the multitude. All who follow Jesus Christ are laborers together with God." In the great work of ministering to the needs of a weary, hungry world.  
"That great statesman, Hon. W. E. Gladstone, once made this remark in conversation with Dr. Talmage: 'Talk about world problems, there is only one solution to them all, and that is the Gospel of Christ.' Jesus Christ is the Bread of Life that came down from Heaven to give life to the world. Many people vainly imagine that religion consists of a few forms and ceremonies, but Jesus said, 'I am come that ye might have life, and that ye might have it more abundantly.' Christianity is a new life of love and brotherhood in Jesus Christ. In fellowship with him we partake of his mind and spirit, and our hearts burn with intense desire to do good to our fellowmen. The highest service we can give to the world is made possible by fellowship with our blessed Lord.  
"The Spirit of Christ within us enables us to co-operate in every good work for the betterment of mankind. This co-operation is one of the fundamentals of success in every good work. Sin divides and love unites. I am reminded now of a gentleman who once visited a large lunatic asylum and was shown by the superintendent through all the wards and buildings of the institution. When they returned to the office he said to the superintendent, 'I should think you would be afraid to go among these crazy people all alone for they

might club together and kill you sometime.' No danger of that, said the superintendent for if they could club together in any thing they would not be here. A sound mind and a right spirit are both essential to co-operation in life.  
"Consider what Christianity has done to promote the welfare and happiness of mankind. Thousands of happy homes are built up everywhere, homes for orphan children and homes for the aged are maintained. Hospitals for the sick and sanitariums are built and supported, schools and churches are kept up, and good government is made possible wherever the pure gospel of Christ has been proclaimed.  
"One more lesson we can get from this great parable of the Bread of Life, and that is this: Fellowship with Christ is the secret of noble character.  
"When these disciples of Christ first began to follow Him they were as weak as ordinary people are today. They followed Jesus and worked with Him until they became men of wonderful power in the world. Like the little child grows up to strong manhood by eating proper food and taking exercise, so does the Christian who lives in daily fellowship with Christ the Bread of Life.  
"Mr. Spurgeon was one day speaking of the power of Christ to beautify the character when he enters a human heart. He told the legend of a foreign flower that could fill all the weeds in a garden and expel the place with beauty and sweetness. A certain gentleman bought some of the seed and planted in his garden that was full of noxious weeds. After a while he went to see the results and lo! the weeds were gone and his garden was full of beautiful flowers.  
"Professor Drummond tells the story of a young lady whose fine Christian character was admired by all who knew her. It was a wanderer to her friends, how she came to live such a beautiful life. She wore a gold locket which she said contained the secret of her life, but she allowed no one to open it. Finally one day she did permit a very close friend to open the locket, and there it was written: 'Whom having not seen we love.'

The true measure of success in every life is good character and useful service for others, and both of these are found in fellowship with Jesus Christ our Lord."
